Texting While Driving: It Can Wait

In today's busy world, it is common to feel like we should be multi-tasking in every moment. Even when we are behind the wheel of a vehicle, it can be difficult to give our full attention to the task at hand. The Alberta RCMP remind drivers that any task that feels urgent when driving, aside from the task of driving itself, can and should wait.

Distracted driving can have severe consequences and it is never worth the risk. A driver must already pay attention to a variety of items: traffic signals, other motorists, passengers, and road conditions. Adding a cell phone to the mix is never a good idea. According to the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety, a driver is eight times more likely to get into a motor vehicle accident when texting. They are four times more likely when talking on their phone, even when using a hands free device.

"The consequences of distracted driving can be devastating. It might seem like you have an urgent reason to divert your attention from the roads but, in reality, whatever it is should wait until you can pull over or stop in a safe location. There is nothing more important than ensuring the safety of yourself, your passengers and others on the roads," says Superintendent Gary Graham, Officer-in-Charge, Alberta RCMP Traffic Services.

In 2017, Integrated Traffic Units issued 7,611 distracted driving tickets in Alberta RCMP jurisdictions. This number has been steadily increasing since 2012, with the exception of 2016. So far in 2018, 147 distracted driving charges have already been issued.

Below are some safety tips to prevent distracted driving:

- Put your phone away. Use your cellphone only when your vehicle is parked in a safe place.
- Pull over. If you need to attend to kids or pets in the vehicle, find a safe spot to park before doing so.
- Set the temperature, mp3 players, radio, CD player or the GPS unit prior to leaving. You should make adjustments only when the vehicle is stopped.
- Make sure children are comfortable and properly buckled up before leaving. Prepare safe activities for the trip so they don't get restless.
- Know the itinerary before leaving. Do not attempt to read a map while driving.
- Finish grooming at home. Do not comb your hair,

shave or apply make-up while driving.

- Do not read while driving. Put newspapers and other reading materials out of sight and out of reach so you won't be tempted.

Ensure that there are no items in the vehicle that will slide around or tip over while the vehicle is in motion. "Traffic safety is a shared responsibility. A lot of that responsibility belongs to drivers themselves, but some of it belongs to passengers as well. As a passenger, you can help the driver by ensuring you're not being a distraction. It is by working together to prevent distracted driving, that we will make the roads safer for everyone," says Superintendent Rick Gardner, Alberta Sheriffs.

Alberta RCMP Traffic Services work with Alberta Traffic Sheriffs in Integrated Traffic Units (ITUs) to deliver effective and efficient traffic safety services to Albertans, with a focus on identified enforcement priorities.

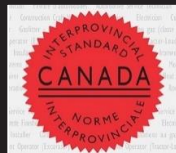

You may be wondering what the benefits are of a program like Side Kicks:

Provide an opportunity for both to learn new skills

1. Give the child and the older adult a sense of purpose
2. Help to alleviate fears children may have of the elderly
3. Help children to understand and later accept their own aging

4. Invigorate and energize older adults
5. Help reduce the likelihood of depression in the elderly
6. Reduce the isolation of older adults
7. Fill a void for children who do not have grandparents available to them
8. Help keep family stories and history alive
9. Aid in cognitive stimulation as well as broaden social circles, should a youth introduce technology into the life of a senior

These are just a few ideas that you and your partner could do together:

- Storytelling. Swapping stories is a great activity and can help build a connection.
- Learning skills. knit, crochet,
- Reading to each other.
- Sharing a coffee / hot chocolate
- Card making, puzzles, model building
- Talking about your heritage. Share bits of history of their childhood or events that happened in the community.
- Planting seeds or gardening. This illustrates the stages of the life cycle. A container garden can be created if bending or space are issues.

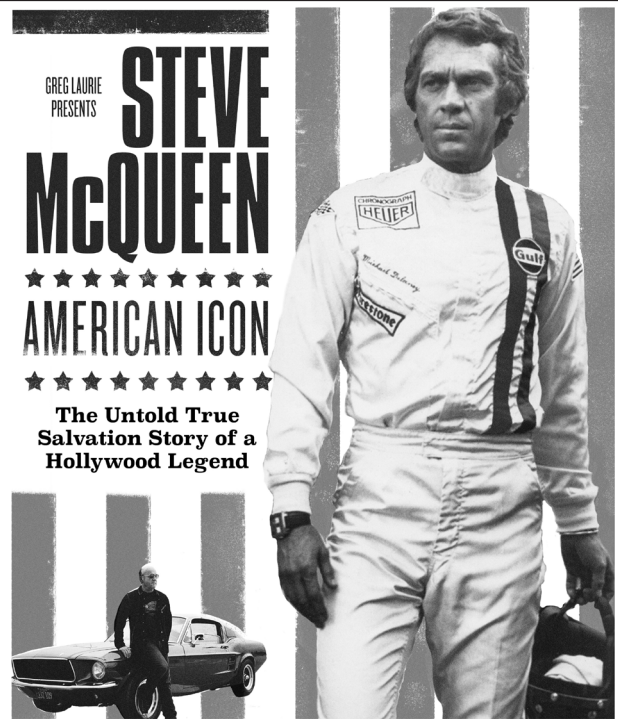

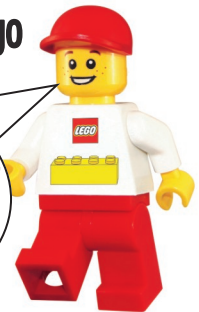

He stated:

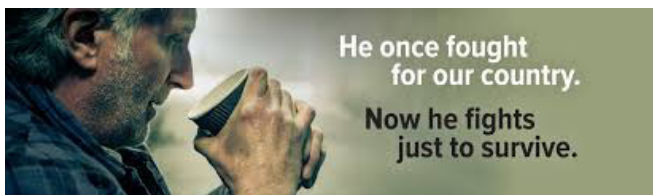

If any of our Veterans are injured, resulting in a disability, we MUST ensure they continue to have a quality of life they so richly deserve.

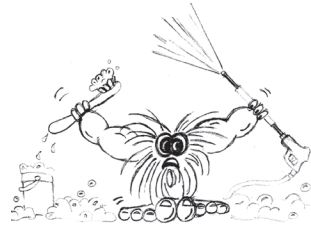

February is Distracted Driving Month

Many people are guilty of checking their phone at stop lights. This interferes with driving as people may be unaware of the regular flow of traffic, changing lights, pedestrians taking extra time to cross the street, or impeding traffic while you're looking down at your phone.

The Facts:

Ø Research indicates that driver distractions contribute to 20 to 30 per cent of all collisions and that distracted drivers are three times more likely to be involved in a collision than attentive drivers.

Ø Between September 1, 2011, when distracted driving legislation was introduced, and March 31, 2017, there were 139,579 convictions.

Ø 97 per cent of these convictions were for using a hand-held electronic device while driving.

Ø During 2016-17, male drivers accounted for nearly two-thirds of all convictions.

Ø Young male drivers, age 22 to 34 years, have the highest conviction rates.

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What Every Woman Should Know About Heart Disease

Understand your risk and how to protect yourself

If you're like most women, you know that heart disease is serious. But you may not think it matters to you. Consider these facts:

Heart disease is the leading cause of premature death for women in Canada (dying before reaching their expected lifespan). Five times as many women die from heart disease as breast cancer. Women who have a heart attack are more likely to die or suffer a second heart attack compared to men. Women's hearts are different from men's in ways that are just beginning to be understood, says Dr. Cindy Yip, director of heart health at Heart & Stroke. Women are under-aware and under-researched when it comes to heart disease, she says. Within the healthcare system they are under-diagnosed and under-treated, and under-supported in their recovery. The time to act is now, and the solutions will require system-wide changes.

The Heart & Stroke 2018 Heart Report takes a hard look at these "unders" — how we got here, and how we can work together to close the gaps that put too many women at risk. The risks are even higher for Indigenous and ethnically diverse women, those living in poverty and women in remote and rural areas.

Taking control

"Women in Canada still work a disproportionate number of unpaid hours, often leaving them little time to take care of their own health," says Dr. Yip. "We need to better support women so that they fully and deeply understand that taking care of others begins with taking care of themselves, and that self-care should not be 'one more thing' added to an already overfull plate. It should be something that their families, workplaces and healthcare providers understand and support."

Meanwhile, there are things women can do to reduce their risk of heart disease. It starts with talking to your doctor about your individual risk factors. Plus, these lifestyle changes can help reduce your risk:

- becoming and remaining smoke free
- achieving and maintaining a healthy body weight
- being physically active for at least 150 minutes of moderate- to vigorous-intensity aerobic physical activity per week, in bouts of 10 minutes or more
- maintaining a healthy blood pressure through lifestyle changes (such as increased physical activity) and when needed through medication
- eating a healthy, balanced diet focused on whole foods with lots of vegetables and fruit, and cooking at home as often as possible
- using medications to reduce the risk of heart disease and stroke as prescribed by your healthcare pro-

vider, for example medications for high blood pressure, high blood cholesterol and diabetes.

Good news

The 2018 Heart Report shares examples of exciting research underway that will help us better understand the unique risks women face.

For example, studies funded by Heart & Stroke donors will enhance understanding of:

spontaneous coronary artery dissection (SCAD), the underlying cause of more than 25% of all heart attacks in women under 60, how pregnancy affects women's heart health, and ways to reduce risk the link between breast cancer treatment and heart disease.

"For too long women's hearts have been misunderstood," says Dr. Yip. "We must change that, and we'll only succeed by working together — governments, healthcare providers, researchers, funders and more."

"Meanwhile women can help themselves by being aware, knowing what questions to ask their healthcare providers, being part of research breakthroughs, and taking time to take care of their health," she says.

"We, including myself, need to remember the best way to take care of others is to take care of ourselves first!"
