



Who's Who in the Electricity Zoo

KEEPING TRACK IN A CHANGING MARKETPLACE

AFREA has been busy keeping up with developments in the electricity sector and advocating on behalf of our member REAs. Listed below with a summary description, are a few of the items we have been working on and information about the regulatory bodies we interact with when we represent you.

- The Market Surveillance Administrator is <u>reviewing the Regulated Rate</u> <u>Option</u> at Alberta Energy's request. On June 1, 2017, the Regulated Rate Option was capped at \$0.068/kWh through passage of Bill 16 in the Legislative Assembly. The AFREA continues to provide feedback on this change and is working closely with the MSA.
- 2. FortisAlberta Inc. has <u>applied for an order from the Alberta Utilities Commission</u> to: a) confirm its service areas on land annexed by municipalities, and b) compel REAs to turn over wires, substations, and their corresponding members. AUC Proceeding 22164 is ongoing. It directly involves three REAs that are AFREA members. The AFREA is representing its members and one additional REA in disputing this application. We have engaged legal counsel and technical consulting expertise to assist us.
- 3. The Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC) is tasked <u>with investigating distribution-connected generation</u>. Proceeding 22534 involves how renewable (solar, wind, hydro) and alternative energy sources could be expanded in Alberta to produce electricity close to power users. The AFREA is participating as a key stakeholder in this proceeding, at the request of the AUC.
- In June 2017, the AUC approved changes to <u>Rule 024: Rules Respecting</u> <u>Micro-Generation</u>. The AFREA has represented our members' interests in this Consultation. The Rule changes were effective July 4, 2017.

After 75 years in the business, the environment has likely never been more complex than it is now. Even in these far-reaching scenarios, we have not mentioned all the agencies involved in running Alberta's electricity industry.

While we ask for member input into these cases, we recognize it's a zoo—not just technical detail, but of too many acronyms and players to keep track of. But it is possible. Here's a list of "who's who" to detangle it for you.

Thank you to our member REAs for representing their members and the unique nature of their REA when providing input. It will continue to be needed! Please keep reading your E-News for updates in these matters.

You can influence the future of all REAs by staying engaged in this way.

KEY ELECTRICITY PLAYERS IN ALBERTA

Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC): Our principal regulator—the AUC operates with many of the same powers as a court of law.

Alberta Electric System Operator (AESO): The AESO operates the provincial power grid 24/7 by dispatching the power sold by generators.

Balancing Pool: The Balancing Pool is an independent corporation created to market power from older generation contracts that were unsold after the electricity market was deregulated.

<u>Market Surveillance Administrator (MSA)</u>: The MSA monitors the wholesale electricity, retail electricity, and natural gas markets investigating issues that come to its attention through surveillance or complaints.

Utilities Consumer Advocate (UCA): The UCA represents, informs, and educates consumers on electricity (utility) matters.

Leduc County Releases **Unofficial Election Results**

Leduc County residents in six of the seven electoral districts cast their ballots October 16th as part of the 2017 municipal election.

All polling stations have reported their vote counts to the returning officer and the following individuals have each been elected to serve a four-year term on Leduc County council:

Kelly-Lynn Lewis was elected to represent division 2 with 45.7 per cent of the divisions' votes; she received 349 votes of 763.

Kelly Vandenberghe was elected to represent division 3 with 50.5 per cent of the divisions' votes; he received 243 votes of 481.

Larry Wanchuk was elected to represent division 4 with 54.2 per cent of the divisions' votes; he received 208 votes of 384.

Tanni Doblanko was re-elected to represent division 5 with 63.1 per cent of the divisions' votes; she received 291 votes of 461.

Glenn Belozer was re-elected to represent division 6 with 59.2 per cent of the divisions' votes; he received 267 votes of 451.

Raymond Scobie was elected to represent division 7 with 69.6 per cent of the divisions' votes; he received 286 votes of 411.

Rick Smith (incumbent) was acclaimed on Sept. 18 to represent division 1.

Unofficial results indicate a jump in voter turnout with 2,951 of the 8,357, or 35.3 per cent, of eligible voters in divisions two through seven casting a ballot. This is up from 33.7-per-cent voter turnout in the last municipal election in 2013.

"We are pleased to see voter turnout on the rise in Leduc County and are hopeful residents will continue to demonstrate enthusiasm and interest in local affairs well into the future." (Gale Miller, returning officer)

Results from the election will become official at noon on Oct. 20.

Elected officials will be sworn in at Leduc County's organizational meeting scheduled for Oct. 24 at 9 a.m. At this meeting council will appoint a mayor to serve a one-year term.





Leduc Rural Crime Watch, the "Eyes and Ears" of the RCMP From Cor De Wit

Leduc Rural Crime Watch Association moves into the Thorsby/Warburg/Breton areas.

Leduc Rural Crime Watch (RCW) was formed over 35 years ago by concerned residents of Leduc County that were looking for a method to inform the public of criminal activities and educate each other with crime prevention tools that could be used to reduce the risk of becoming a victim. Leduc Rural Crime Watch is a non-profit registered charity in Alberta as well as a Registered Society in Canada. We are an active member of the Alberta Provincial Rural Crime Watch Association and have access to signage that you can place on your property to inform neighbors, as well as the criminal element, that you are a supporter of Crime Watch in your community.

In 2016, Leduc RCW began recruiting new members from the expansion area of Thorsby, Warburg and Breton, into our fan out notification system. This area was formerly served by the Strawberry RCW group that dissolved several years ago. After some initial success we continued to move into the Pigeon Lake and Mulhurst Bay area as well. As word spread about our information service and what we can do for a community, we now have inquiries from Buck Lake and beyond. We are not only interested in rural members, but the towns and villages as well. Criminals, intent on committing crimes do not respect municipal boundaries, so everyone should get involved.

We work closely with the Leduc, and Thorsby/Breton, RCMP detachments to get the "word out" to our members through a fan out notification system that is internet based. The system can notify members at a rate of 15,000 phone calls per minute and email instantaneously. The cost to operate the service is very reasonable and costs about \$8 per year to be a member of Leduc RCW.

The mission and mandate of our organization is to provide our membership with timely police investigation updates and provide an avenue to report suspicious activity to the RCMP. We work on the principal of "Neighbors Watching Neighbors" with the intent to provide police agencies with up to date activities in our area. We are essentially the "Eyes and Ears" of the RCMP.

Canine Comfort

From Alberta Health Services

Alberta Health Services Emergency Medical Services (AHS EMS) is enlisting some four-legged help to support paramedics experiencing psychological stress.

Delray is an accredited facility dog trained to provide comfort and support for people experiencing psychological stress. Animal contact has been shown to trigger the production of oxytocin in the body, which lowers stress by reducing blood pressure and cortisol levels.

As part of AHS EMS' new Psychological Awareness and Wellness Support (PAWS) program, the three-year-old black lab and his handler, Erica Olson, will visit EMS staff at their stations following traumatic calls. The PAWS team will also make regular station visits to maintain morale, promote mental wellness, support members re-integrating back to work after taking time off for psychological injuries, and raise awareness about mental health resources available to employees.

"Our EMS professionals deal with challenging and traumatic calls every day across Alberta," says AHS Chief Paramedic Darren Sandbeck. "The psychological impact is very real and we have made it our priority to support our staff every step of the way."

Dr. Verna Yiu, AHS President and CEO, says the health and safety of staff is one of the organization's top priorities. "I'm incredibly proud of the leadership demonstrated by Chief Sandbeck and his EMS team in the area of psychological health and safety," says Dr. Yiu. "We will continue to support their work to ensure staff has access to the right help if and when they need it."

The PAWS program was identified by the EMS Psychological Health and Safety Committee as an effective resource for staff using proven animal engagement techniques supported by specialized training through PADS, one of Canada's leaders in the breeding, raising, training and supporting certified assistance dogs. "PADS is proud to be partnering with Alberta Health Services on the PAWS program, Delray is the first placement of this kind in Canada, providing dedicated support to first responders." says Laura Watamanuk, PADS Executive Director. "He was specifically chosen for the role for his ability to bring both joyful enthusiasm and gentle sensitivity as needs demand. He is a dog that is intuitively drawn into situations where individuals are experiencing strong emotions." "For years we have known that specially-trained canines like Delray have a unique and instinctive capacity to comfort those in distress," says Associate Minister Brandy Payne. "Delray is going to be an important part of the team and will help our EMS members deal with the trauma they witness every day."

Delray is provided to AHS EMS through a partnership with PADS. The EMS Foundation has donated \$50,000 for the purchase of an SUV, modified to ensure the safe transport of the PAWS team. "The EMS Foundation was created in order to give back to our paramedics in a meaningful way," says EMS Foundation Board Chair Chris Salmon. "Our caring for staff goes beyond the uniform. It's about the people and their families behind those uniforms, which is why we are immensely proud to support this program."

PAWS will initially be based in the Central Zone. AHS EMS will monitor the program for 12 to 18 months to determine how it can be appropriately expanded to support EMS staff in all zones.
