Remembrance Day And The Poppy Campaign

The Warburg Legion Branch No. 205 members were so very grateful for all those who attended and assisted with our 2017 Remembrance Day Service. We had an attendance of 262.

Our Silver Cross Mother was a member of the Warburg Legion Branch No. 205 – Comrade Iris Mitchell (pictured below). Her father was Private Ralph George Mitchell, a paratrooper who was in active service in the United Kingdom, Central Mediterranean Area and Continental Europe in WWII. He received the 1939-1945 Star, The Italy Star, The France and Germany Stars, Defence Medal, War Medal 1939-1945, Canadian Volunteer Service Medal.



To put a program and service together takes a lot of hands and great communication. The members have so much to do in the weeks prior to our service with wreath rentals, dropping off and picking up the poppy trays, organizing the luncheon, articles, poster and literacy contests that our schools participate in. One of the highlights is when our members can attend the services at Breton Elementary School and Warburg School.

It was very impressive to see our youth involved in the history presentation, band and public readings or as part of the Parade.

- The Annual Poster and Literary Contest
- The Royal Canadian Legion has sponsored the Poster and Literary Contests for all students in the Canadian school system for the last 50 years. The youth who participate in these contests assist the Legion in fostering the tradition of Remembrance amongst Canadians.
- The Poster Contest Having two divisions of Colour or Black & White, this is broken up into 4 cateogories: Primary, Junior, Intermediate and Senior. These students will submit drawings, sketches focusing on Remembrance illustrating Canadian symbols, provincial flags, coats of arms, loss of our veterans, representation of flowers, the Poppy and Forget-Me-Not, birds, animals, Canadian historical and current military dress, etc.
- The Literary Contest This contest also has two divisions, Essays and Poems relating to events or personal expression in the art of writing or poetry.

Judging all the tremendous entries submitted is done at the local level in the Legion Branch based on guidelines from the Royal Canadian Legion. Prizes are awarded for First Place entries and are submitted at Provincial Level by The Royal Canadian Legion command, then onto Ottawa where they are reviewed at National Level. These winning works of art are displayed in a magazine in Parliament, and the winners are flown to Ottawa to meet the Lieutenant Governor General.

The Warburg Legion Branch #205 currently works with schools in Breton, Warburg and The Warburg Colony School. Packages for entries are taken to these schools for students to participate in these contests. At the local level prizes are awarded for First, Second and Third for various categories. All entries are returned to the students.

Mail Thefts Increase

From Strathcona County RCMP

RCMP are presently investigating a large number of theft of mail incidents that have occurred at various locations throughout Strathcona County during the past week.

The thefts involve small parcels and cards, along with general mail being stolen from compartments in community mailboxes located throughout rural Strathcona County.

Tips to prevent mail box thefts:

- Pick up your mail promptly after delivery. Don't leave it in your mailbox overnight.
- If you're planning a holiday, have someone retrieve your mail on a daily basis OR for a small fee, Canada Post will hold your mail at the delivery office and deliver it upon your return.
- Check the physical security of your mailbox to ensure there are no gaps or damage.
- If you see a damaged or overturned mailbox, contact Canada Post to report.
- Do not send cash or cheques in the mail.

"During the holiday season, this type of theft sometimes spikes as thieves hope to find Christmas cards with cheques or cash in them", said Cst. Chantelle Kelly of the Strathcona County RCMP. "We are urging people to check their mail every day to lessen the risk of losing important pieces of mail."

MP REPORT

from The Office of MP Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead

Canada and Our Troops Must Come First Earlier this month, the Prime Minister announced that the Liberal government would offer up to 200 ground troops, transport and attack helicopters, cargo planes and military trainers for future United Nations peacekeeping operations.

The announcement comes more than 14 months after the Trudeau government committed to providing up to 600 troops and 150 police officers for UN operations.

The announcement confirms that this Prime Minister has failed to stand up and advocate for Canadian interests on the world stage. Despite two years of promises, it is clear that he is willing to let the UN decide what our priorities are as Canadians, rather than keeping with our greatest tradition of confronting evil and tyranny in all its forms.

In our 2016 consultations on the Defence Policy Review, we heard from Canadians that the men and women of the Canadian Armed Forces deserve stable, predictable, long-term funding, that Canada must take a principled stance on the world stage, work with our allies, and that our defence policy must be focused first and foremost on the defence of Canada.

Instead, the Liberal government quietly rolled out a policy in September that cancels the benefits of injured soldiers. They are focused on slashing defence spending, cozying up to foreign nations with questionable human rights records, and returning to United Nations peacekeeping to fulfill political desires.

This Prime Minister has enjoyed talking about a naïve historical notion of Canadian peacekeeping, but he needs to get serious about explaining why a dangerous mission in sub-Saharan Africa, or anywhere else we allow the UN to send our troops, is in our national interest.

Our troops will be facing the prospect of casualties, as well as the challenge of dealing with terrorists and child soldiers. To date, this Liberal government is unable to answer basic questions about where our troops will be going, and why they will be deployed. It's time for some transparency about just what this mission will look like and what the risks are.


