

MP Eglinski Announces Funding

Jim Eglinski, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to announce a total of \$144,674 in funding for Yellowhead organizations through the New Horizons for Seniors Program.

Since 2004, the Employment and Social Development Canada program has helped to ensure seniors benefit from, and contribute to, the quality of life in their communities through active living and participation in social activities. The selected projects are either led or inspired by seniors.

The projects include:

The Town of Mayerthorpe will receive \$8,600 for their community garden to build raised planter beds, a sun shelter, and a cement pad for seniors with disabilities so that they can continue to harvest and distribute produce.

The Thorsby Seniors Citizen Club will receive \$23,500 to upgrade their activity center. This will include purchasing a greenhouse for gardening, leather working tools for leather working, and kitchen equipment for cooking classes.

The Edson and District Recycling Society will receive \$25,000 for their Senior Mentorship Program's community garden. Seniors involved with the organization will mentor youth and community members through workshops on garden maintenance, pruning and harvesting.

The Warburg Cultural Society will receive \$25,000 to make improvements to their Cultural Centre. This will include renovating the kitchen and craft area to allow seniors to participate in activities such as quilting and cooking classes.

The Cadomin Legion Branch 124 will receive \$24,054 to repair their damaged roof to allow seniors to continue participate in activities such as darts, foosball and air hockey.

After a cost recovery review by the County, fees have increased from \$10.00 per single use card to \$15.00 per single use card for the residents of Warburg.

Identity Theft / Identity Fraud Let's Not Become a Victim

What is Identity Theft?

The basic definition of identity theft and identity fraud is: Identity theft refers to the preparatory stage of acquiring and collecting someone else's personal information for criminal purposes. Identity fraud is the actual deceptive use of the identity information of another person (living or dead) in connection with various frauds (including for example; impersonating another person and the misuse of debit card or credit card data).

As of January 8, 2010, Senate Bill S-4 became law, making it illegal to possess another person's identity information for criminal purposes.

Some of the Facts:

- Identity theft techniques can range from the unsophisticated, such as dumpster diving and mail theft, to more elaborate schemes using the internet.
- Technology, mainly the Internet, facilitates more elaborate schemes, such as skimming, phishing, and hacking as criminals gather profiles of potential victims. Computer spywares and viruses, designed to help thieves acquire personal information, are an emerging trend. You can be infected through an unknown downloaded program or opening and responding to an unsuspecting email.
- Victims of identity theft or fraud can experience financial loss and difficulty obtaining credit or restoring their "good name".

Identity thieves are looking for the following information: Full name, date of birth, Social Insurance Numbers (SIN number), full address, mother's maiden name, username and password for online services, driver's license number, personal identification numbers (PIN), credit card information (numbers, expiry dates and the last three digits printed on the signature panel), bank account numbers, signature, Birth Certificate, and passport number. Any number or combination of these identifications can result in your identity being compromised and cause hardship for you and your family.

What your information could be used for:

Criminals can use your stolen or reproduced personal or financial information to:

- access your bank accounts to steal your money
- open new bank accounts to apply for loans under your identity

- transfer bank balances from your account to an account either, opened in your name or another account that is under control of an identity thief
- apply for loans, credit cards and other goods and services under your name
- make purchases using your credit cards and money
- hide their criminal activities under your name and identity
- obtain passports or receive government benefits while impersonating you

How can you find out if your identity was stolen?

The best way to find out is to monitor your hard copy or on-line financial accounts frequently and to check your credit report regularly for any unusual activities. If you receive calls from collection agencies about unfamiliar accounts, or if you applied for credit and were unexpectedly turned down, you should investigate further.

Report it

If you suspect or know that you are a victim of identity theft or fraud, or if you unwittingly provided personal information or financial information:

- Step 1 Contact your local police force (RCMP or EPS) and file a report.
- Step 2 Contact your bank/financial institution and Credit Card Company.
- Step 3 Contact the two national credit bureaus and place a fraud alert on your credit reports.
 - o Equifax Canada at Toll free: 1-800-465-7166
- o TransUnion Canada at Toll free: 1-877-525-3823
- Step 4 Always report identity theft and fraud. Contact the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre at 1-888-495-8501 Service Canada at 1-800-206-7218 (If your SIN card has been compromised)

Prevention is the best way to deal with this crime:

- Identity theft can occur over the Internet (email) or telephone, via fax or regular mail. Therefore, be particularly wary of unsolicited e-mails, telephone calls or mail attempting to extract personal or financial information from you. If an email or phone call asks you to log into your online account or give the numbers to your account over the phone, BEWARE, this is a common tactic to extract valuable information used to steal your identity.
- Ask yourself if you really need all of the identity documents you carry in your wallet or purse. Remove any you don't need and keep them in a secure place instead.
- Periodically check your credit reports, bank and credit card statements and report any irregularities promptly to the relevant financial institution and to the credit bureaus.

- During transactions, it's safer to swipe your cards yourself than it is to allow a cashier to do it for you. If you must hand over your card, never lose sight of it.
- Always shield your personal identification number when using an ATM or a PIN pad.
- Memorize all personal identification numbers for payment cards and telephone calling cards. Never write them on the cards.
- Familiarize yourself with billing cycles for your credit and debit cards.
- Trash bins are a goldmine for identity thieves.
 Make sure you shred personal and financial documents before putting them in the garbage. This includes ATM slips or receipts
- Cut up expired and unused cards credit / ATM cards.
- When you change your address, make sure you notify the post office and all relevant financial institutions (your bank and credit card companies).
- Don't fill in forms that ask for more information then you feel is necessary.
- Beware of social media sites that ask for information that could put you at risk. Do not post personal information on social media sites as these sites are checked regularly for potential targets of "identity theft" thieves. 
