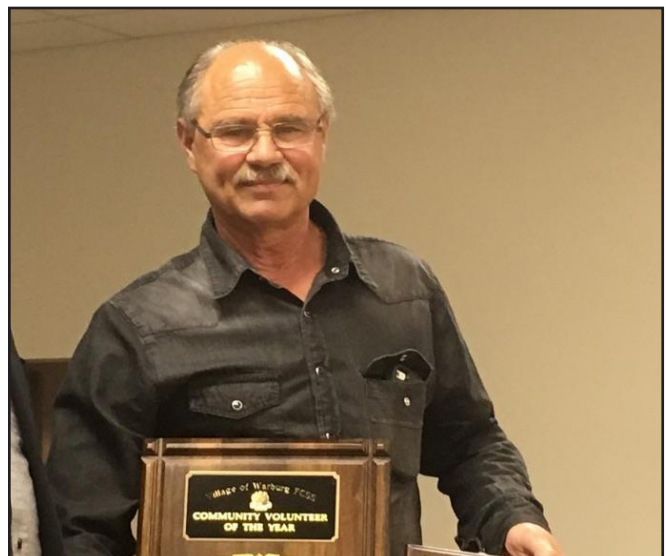

# “A Family Remembers”

## A Tribute to the Life of Elsie Osbak

### Part Two of Three - From Nolan Osbak

From then on Elsie grew up as an only child. She became an avid reader of books and magazines, a trait that stayed with her right to the end. She and Vera Smith, a neighbor girl, became life long friends. Vera passed away some years ago. Elsie attended the Fruitland School from Grade 1-8. For Grade 9-12 she went to Thorsby finishing in 1944.

In Sept of 1945 Elsie went to teach at another one room school called Templeton. To use today's landmarks Templeton was 2 miles east of the Genessee Power Plant and 1 mile south. The site wasn't accessible because it's in the coal field and has already been mined so even the dirt is different. The Templeton School had been built in 1909 so even by 1945 it was quite old. It was to stay open until the end of June/52. Elsie was to board with the Hartfelder family who lived near the school.

It wasn't long after Elise arrived at the Hartfelder's that some of the local lads came to check out the new school teacher. There was one in particular who caught Elsie's eye. He was tall, blonde, blue eyes and very handsome. His name was Vernon Osbak. His parents Karl and Asta, with their daughter Astrid, along with Karl's mother Anna and two sisters had come from Norway in August 1914. The word Osbak means "Ocean Hill" and was the name of the little farm the family had lived on. Karl's father had been at sea a lot so the mother had done most of the child raising by herself. After the father died, the members of the family still in Norway decided to follow the ones who were already in Canada. The family name had been Pettersen but on deciding to emigrate they chose to take the name of their farm as their new surname. (Personally I think it was a mistake but that's just the writer's opinion).

For whatever reason Elsie only stayed at Templeton from Sept 1945 to June 1946. Then it was summer school again and she became a full-fledged teacher. During this time she and Vernon had been seeing a lot of each other.

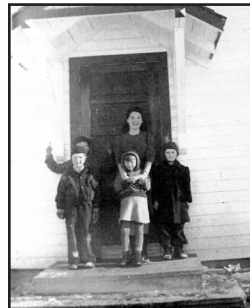
In Sept of '46 Elsie found a new school to go to. It was called Strawberry Ridge. Modern directions as to where it was are 1 mile east of Alsike store on Hwy 39, then roughly 2 miles north. The people she was to board with there were George & Katy Soubak. They were to become lifelong friends of both Elsie & Vernon. Yes, Vernon didn't let Elsie get away. The little German farm girl had captured her Viking.

On May 3rd Elsie & Vernon were married and later that year their first son Gary was born. It was to become policy that Elsie would take about 2 years off teaching after

each son was born & Vernon was the sole provider. He worked in lumber or logging camps plus he and his older brother did custom breaking in summer. He also filed on a homestead 1 mile north of the Templeton School. That would become the family home for close to 30 years.

The problem with going back teaching after 2 years was that you had to find a babysitter somewhere. For Gary it wasn't too bad as Elsie went back to Templeton. There was now a teacherage to stay in so Gary only needed watching during the school day. Ruth Gellert (Stern), a local girl, did this duty.

When son no. 2 Nolan (or Lanny as he was called) came along in 1952 a lot of the one room schools were closing down as schools were becoming more centralized. So in 1954, when Elsie was ready to go back teaching, the only school she could find was Winfield. Gary was already in school so he was no problem. However Lanny was only 2 years old, what to do? Once again it was Gellerts to the rescue. This time it was Adam & Helen who took Lanny and looked after him in their own home for the year. They became second parents to him.

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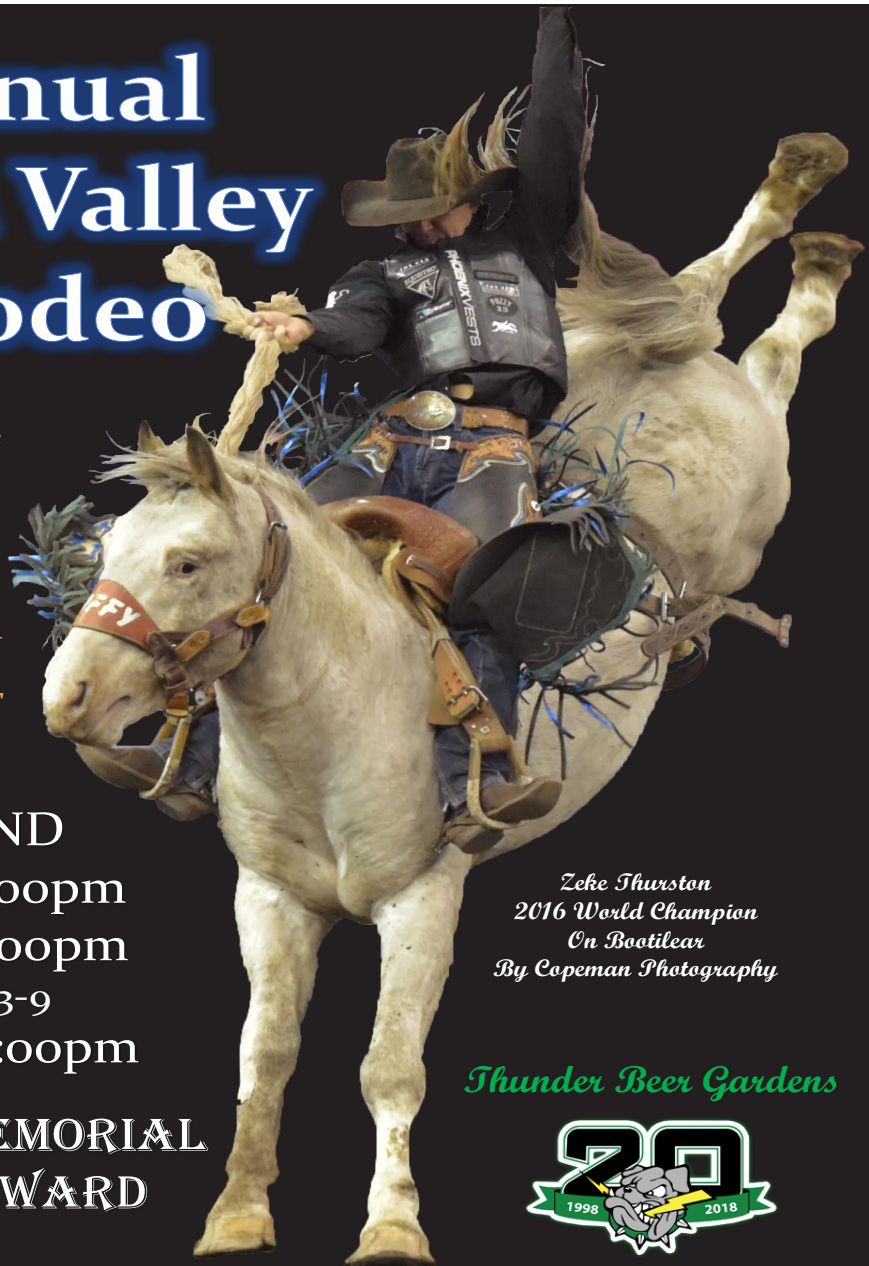

# Preserving a Community Gathering Space

Sitting proudly near the heart of town, the Thorsby and District Community Centre is a quiet mainstay of the close-knit community. A home to a wide variety of events, the building holds many happy memories for those who have visited it. Personally, I can remember being a little girl, shyly hiding out in the warm wood paneled cloak room, sliding the full length of the dance floor in my stocking feet, my first tenor saxophone solo in 'Caravan' at the high school band's dinner and auction, transforming the upstairs for Christmas masses, cutting innumerable slices of pie for the annual Catholic Smorg, and making my sister cry at her wedding. Ask anyone from the Thorsby area and they will surely regale you their own recollections from 'the Hall.'

Built in the mid-1950s, the Hall has undergone a number of transformations over its lifetime. It boasts beautiful original woodwork crafted by Bronislaw 'Bronek' Zolkiewski, as well as modern amenities. Substantial renovations were completed in 1996, adding the current entry area, accessible restroom facilities, a lift to allow those with mobility limitations to use the facility, the mezzanine area, and extensive kitchen modernizations. One of the unique features of the Hall is two-floor design. The downstairs has a fixed table banquet space that seats nearly 200 people with easy access to the kitchen. Upstairs, a flexible open space can be found, suitable for everything from weddings to funerals to play school fundraisers to movie nights – really, anything you can think of.

The Thorsby and District Historical and Cultural Society took over the running of the Community Centre in early 2015 and have continued to make upgrades to the building. Recently, they installed new commercial convection ovens in the kitchen, replaced the countertop on

the buffet table in the basement, and are looking into a number of other upgrades that will continue to make the Hall an attractive location for events.

But maintaining a versatile facility such as the Community Centre does not come easily. The Historical Society hosts events that help ensure this facility keeps its glory for years to come. Many will recall the great success of the Ukrainian Malanka held in January, which helps support the maintenance of the Hall along with supporting other causes within and around Thorsby. Pancake breakfasts are great opportunities to support the Hall and catch up with friends. We will be hosting our next one on Saturday, May 19 (May long weekend). Saturday, May 5, brings the 4th Annual Thorsby Craft and Trade Show that will overtake the Hall and its grounds, bringing in vendors as diverse as Martin Deerline, Devon Chevrolet, Sunnybrook Hill Orchards, Tupperware, Epicure, homemade crafts, handmade soap, and much more. The Craft and Trade Show will also feature Irene Pawlyk's famous homemade perogies (while supplies last) and a 50/50 draw. Finally, on Saturday, October 13, we will be hosting a Duelling Pianos evening for which details are still being confirmed.

The Community Centre is an important institution for the Thorsby district. The Historical Society hopes to preserve the history and physical integrity of the Hall in order to allow future generations to make their own memories there. We hope to see many come out to the upcoming Trade and Craft Show, along with all the other wonderful events being held in the Hall. 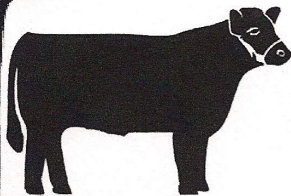

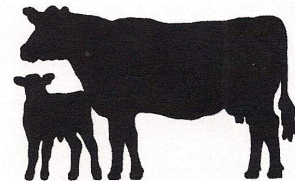

## Yellowhead County Mayor Gerald Soroka runs for vacant MP seat

Yellowhead County Mayor Gerald Soroka has entered the race for the Conservative MP nomination in the Yellowhead Riding. Soroka made the announcement amid a gathering of supporters at the Galloway Station Museum in Edson on April 17.

With Conservative MP Jim Eglinski's announcement on January 9 that he won't be seeking re-election in 2019, the seat will become vacant. He will continue to serve until the next election is called. "After 52 years of public service it is time to retire," said Eglinski.

Gerald Soroka knows how important it is to have a strong voice for rural communities in Ottawa. He grew up on a family farm just north of Evansburg and has lived in the County all his life. "I still live on our original homestead from 1930."

Soroka has been representing constituents in the area for nearly 14 years and points to his proven track record. "I was a Yellowhead County Council member since 2004 and the Yellowhead County Mayor since 2007."

"In the Fall I ran for Mayor and I had no intentions of going any further. If someone had said on January 1st you will be running for the next Conservative MP —I'd have told them no; I fully supported Jim. In fact I signed up to be on the nomination committee," said Soroka. "It took me several weeks to decide I really wanted to do this." "I got into politics because I want to make our communities a better place to live, enhance our services and facilities, and the quality of life in our rural areas," said Soroka.

The first step to becoming the Conservative Member of Parliament is to become the Party Representative. "I may have a lot of people who support me but they can't vote for me unless they purchase a Canadian Conservative Party membership," said Soroka. Memberships are \$15 per year and anyone 14 years or older can buy a membership and vote.

A few of the current issues Soroka wants to tackle as MP include seeing the pipeline completed, coal and jobs, housing problems, finding a solution to the Caribou issue, the Mountain Pine Beetle problem, and rural crime.

"The laws and the courts are almost making crime into a viable business where criminals have more rights on your property than anyone else," said Soroka. "It's become a catch and release program and before this

becomes a vigilante system we need to strengthen our legal system."

"With the Pine Beetles and Caribou, you need to have someone that understands these issues and can fight for industry and the ecosystem," said Soroka. "The ecosystem is out of balance and if we don't continue managing it properly we are going to do more harm to the Caribou than just walking away."

"I feel I have strong leadership abilities and I understand the issues faced by our rural communities. I am going to do my best to represent your issues and concerns at the federal level —and with your support we can make that happen," said Soroka."
