## "A Family Remembers" A Tribute to the Life of Elsie Osbak

Part Three of Three - From Nolan Osbak In 1958, when Elsie was ready to teach again, after having Tracy, son #3, in 1956, things were somewhat different. The family was living on their homestead farm and the school Elsie would teach at was the Genesee Central School. That meant Vern would drive Elsie to school everyday and would be going past Grandma & Grandpa Osbak's place so Tracy could be dropped off there in the morning and picked up in the afternoon.

Genesee Central School was made up of several districts, Genesee North, Old Genesee, Howard, Templeton and parts of Avon Moor and Strawberry. The site is now at the bottom of the Genesee cooling pond. Elsie taught Grade 4, 5, & 6, later just 5&6 from Sept/58 to June/68. In Sept/68 she transferred to Warburg Elementary where she finished her career in 1982. Edmonton Power expropriated their farm so they found a semi-wild quarter in the New Moose Hill area. With the help of their boys they made a nice home there. There was an acreage subdivision out of the quarter for Tracy. Gary was in Sherwood Park with his family and Nolan stayed at his parents place and went driving truck from there. For the first time in their lives Elsie and Vernor could take things easier. Together they enjoyed auction sales and ice fishing. Elsie enjoyed farm fairs and gardening. Vernor enjoyed woodworking. He made roll top desks, one for each of his sons. He also did custom having for some neighbours for a while as the machinery had all been moved to the new farm. As the years went by the ill health began to appear. Vernor's arthritis and diabetes began to worsen and he died April 29th, 2001. Elsie's health began to deteriorate too and by October 2014 she had to leave home for good, spending time at the Drayton Hospital, Sunrise Village in Drayton Valley and the last year and ten months in Breton Long Term Care. But even in these places the teacher in her corrected the nurses' grammar. Elsie had always been a strong willed, independent minded, opinionated woman. Because of her, 2 grand daughters are independent. Kara became a doctor and Nikki has been on her own in Calgary for years. Elsie's two surviving grandson's treat their wives with respect and they both chose women who are independent. Vernor accepted Elsie's ways as his own mother took part in making big decisions. His grandmother was out trapping muskrats to earn money for her oldest grand daughter so she could become a teacher. She was in her sixties when she did this. And what do Elsie's sons think of their mother? I can't speak for the others, but no.2 son says "Well done Mom!"

#### Postscripts

1. After closing, the Onion Creek School building was

moved to Buck Creek.

2. When Templeton closed in June/52 the school building was moved across the road to Hartfelders and used as a machine shed for many years until it met its demise at the hands of Edmonton Power. The teacherage and coal shed were both moved to the new Genesee School site and used until the spring/62. In summer of '62 the Rainier teacherage was moved in as it was bigger and the Templeton teacherage was sold to a family in the Howard district. The coal shed was destroyed. In 2011 I went to an auction sale in the Howard area and there was the old Templeton teacherage for sale. It still looked in pretty good shape except for the interior walls having some holes in them. It sold for \$600. I hope it still exists.

3. The Strawberry Ridge building was moved about a mile down the road and remodeled into a farm house.

4. The Genesee North school building was sold in the summer of '63 to a farmer to be used as a grainery. It currently resides on a farm one mile east and one mile north of the power plant. It was no longer needed as a new cement block school had been built at Genesee in '62. Genesee was closed in June of 1972 and the big 2 room school was moved to Thorsby by movers to be used for storage. It was later sold to Vic Brandt of Warburg to be used as an auto repair shop. It currently is used by Wilf Brandt Trucking as an office. It has an identical sister school building in Breton and one similar in Warburg. Both are used as museums. The new school was used as a community hall until it was destroyed for the cooling pond.

#### NOTICE

#### Roadside Vegetation Control Program

Brazeau County Agricultural Services Division will be carrying out roadside spraying of prohibited noxious, noxious weeds and woody vegetation (brush) throughout the County from May to October. For public safety, a buffer zone will be maintained between these roadside spray areas and county residences/yard sites.

As per our Vegetation Management policy, spraying on roadsides is done under the authority of Alberta's Weed Control Act. Brazeau County is required to control the weeds in the roadide just like any other landowner is on privately owned land. As well, in the public interest of safety, brush control is performed to increase the sightlines on roadways and intersections. As a result, costs of maintaining these open roadways are reduced where brush and trees are managed properly as it makes snow removal easier and allows roads to dry out quicker after precipitation falls.

The following programs related to herbicide use are available to residents: Fence-line Program (County staff will treat area up to 5 meters inside a fence line at no costl

- Hawkweed Program (County staff will treat a specified area infested with Hawkweed on private land at no cost)
- Herbicide Rebate Program (the County will reimburse landowners 30% of the cost of herbicide used on the landowner's property)
- No Spray Agreement (the County will not use herbicides in the ditch adjacent to a landowner's property; responsibility for weed control is assumed by the landowner)

Emergency Preparedness Week May 6 – 12

The 3 Steps of Emergency Preparedness # 1: Know the Risks - Although the consequences of various disasters can be similar, knowing the risks in your region can help you better prepare. In addition to natural disasters, there are other types of risks, such as power outages and industrial or transportation accidents. In Alberta, a tornado can strike quickly with significant damage. Wildfires can threaten communities and restrict movement. Heavy rains can cause flash flooding. The following hazards could happen in our community: Floods, Pandemic influenza - Public Health Agency of Canada, Landslides

Power outages, Severe storms, Tornadoes, Wildfires.

In Alberta, municipalities respond first to local emergencies. Alberta Emergency Management Agency, is also there to help when needed. The agency assists Alberta communities to mitigate, prepare for, respond to and recover from major emergencies and disasters.

**# 2: Make a Plan** - Every household needs an emergency plan. It will help you and your family know what to do in case of an emergency. Your family may not be together when an emergency occurs. Plan how to meet or how to contact one another, and discuss what you would do in different situations. It only takes 20 minutes to complete a personalized plan online. You can then print it out. Most of this information can be filled out on your own. You may need to get some information from your municipality. To complete your emergency plan online, visit the 'Make an emergency plan' page from the GetPrepared.ca website.

Keep this document in an easy-to-find, easy-to-remember place (for example, with your emergency kit). Photocopy this plan and keep it in your car and/or at work.

**# 3: Get an Emergency Kit** - In an emergency you will need some basic supplies. You may need to get by without power or tap water. Be prepared to be self-sufficient for at least 72 hours. Make sure your kit is easy to carry and everyone in the household knows where it is. Keep it in a backpack, duffle bag or suitcase with wheels, in an easy-to-reach, accessible place, such as your fronthall closet.

#### Basic emergency kit

Water – at least two litres of water per person per day. Include small bottles that can be carried easily in case of an evacuation order

Food that won't spoil, such as canned food, energy bars and dried foods (Replace food and water once a year).

Manual can-opener

Wind-up or battery-powered flashlight (and extra batteries)

Wind-up or battery-powered radio (and extra batteries) First aid kit

Extra keys to your car and house

Some cash in smaller bills, such as \$10 bills and change for payphones

A copy of your emergency plan and contact information Special items such as prescription medications, infant formula, equipment for people with disabilities or food, water and medication for your pets or service animal (personalize your kit according to your needs)

TIP - Keep a corded phone in your home, as most cordless phones will not work during a power outage.

Recommended additional items

Two additional litres of water per person per day for cooking and cleaning

Candles and matches or lighter (Place candles in sturdy containers and do not burn unattended)

Change of clothing and footwear for each household member

Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each household member

Toiletries

Hand sanitizer

Utensils

Garbage bags

Toilet paper

Household chlorine bleach or water purifying tablets Basic tools (hammer, pliers, wrench, screwdrivers, work gloves, dust mask, pocket knife)

Small fuel-driven stove and fuel (follow manufacturer's directions and store properly)

A whistle (in case you need to attract attention)

Leduc Rural Crime Watch, the "Eyes and Ears" of the RCMP From Cor De Wit

Every year, as the month of May comes around; we announce that "May is Crime Prevention Month". What does that mean? Well, it means that everyone should take a few minutes to look at what you are doing around your farm, home, or business, on a regular basis, to reduce the risk of becoming a target, or victim of crime.

Crime prevention on your property varies depending on where you live. Take for example, a driveway or entrance gate. If you live in an urban setting, then a gate at your driveway is not practical. But in a rural setting, a gate at the driveway entrance may be a practical and a cost effective deterrent to crime. Gates can be ornamental, or a simple barbed wire gate. Some 'home made' gates are very effective and can be designed to look stylish as well.

Driveway alarms that announce the arrival of a vehicle or person that has entered your property are becoming very popular. They have different ring tones and some alarms are effective up to one kilometer away. Most are wireless and can be installed on a fence post with the base station installed in the home or work shop.

Keeping your yard, acreage or farm yard neat and tidy shows that you care about your belongings and you will protect them with some type of security. This could be a simple lighting, censored or day night type of lights or a full version of a security system that may include cameras and horns. Lights have changed drastically over the last 5 years and the new LED flood type lights are very energy efficient and provide excellent light for use with the night time cameras. This ensures a good quality picture in the event that you are broken into and the need for a suspect picture is required.

Not locking your vehicles is the number one cause of vehicles being stolen. It seems to be a crime of opportunity that is growing every year. In 2017, 39% of the vehicles stolen in Leduc area had their keys in the vehicle. Use of a steering wheel locking device, is very effective in reducing your risk of becoming a victim of auto theft. Even the newer automobiles, that use a key FOB to start your car when you enter the vehicle, can be circumvented as well. Do not keep your FOB in your vehicle and place the FOB in a tin can, in your home, to prevent the criminal from stealing your FOB code by reading the signal remotely.

and takes many forms. Fraud can happen to anyone. A simple trick to make you believe you are getting a great deal when you are not, is a form of fraud. Impersonating a legitimate business or individual is also fraud that we see every day. Keep personal information out of the hands of the criminal by not responding to 'too good to be true' offers. Do not respond to email offers and telephone calls selling items at great prices.

Pick pockets and stolen purses continue to be a criminal's method of getting your identification and money. Setting your purse on a checkout counter can be stolen in a flash, when you look away for a second to care for a fussy child. You can prevent some attempts at theft but you can never be 100% ready for the fact that you have become a victim. Take a few minutes today and record all the information that is in your wallet or purse, such as credit cards, health care and drivers' license. Keep this information in a safe place along with the contact numbers of all information sources so you can cancel and have your documents reissued. These contact numbers are usually on the back of your credit cards and Alberta registries can issue new Drivers licenses and health care card can be directed to Alberta Health. Remember to only carry necessary information with you.

Remember, to always be aware of your surrounding and practice the old adage, "Don't feed the bears" referring to a practice of not making the criminals' job easy, when they try to turn you into a victim.
