Tips for Tasty and Healthy Meals
Preparing food that both tastes good and is
good for you is not a magic trick.

A few simple meal planning and preparation tips will help you to produce healthy, delicious food that your family will love.

1. Take a few minutes each week to plan your menus.

This will allow you the time to schedule a quick and easy meal on Wednesday when Jimmy plays hockey and a late dinner on Thursday because of a parent teacher interview. As well, you will be able to try a new recipe or ensure that a favourite is served more often.

2. Cruise the grocery store with a list.

A grocery list will ensure that you bring home everything you need to prepare the tasty and nutritious meals you planned - and help you to not load up on unneeded items, whether it's chips or an extra bottle of ketchup. This simple trick list will usually save you money by helping you to avoid impulse buys and ensure that you have everything your family needs on hand.

3. Choose seasonal produce and pick the brightest colors that you can.

Buying fruits and vegetables in season lets you enjoy peak flavour at modest cost. Buy asparagus in the spring, peaches in the late summer, and apples in the fall. When the price of fresh produce is high, frozen fruit and vegetables are usually an economical choice. Canned fruit and vegetables are another alternative, but be aware of the sugary syrups and higher salt content. Fruits and vegetables provide lots of vitamins and minerals to keep you healthy at a very modest calorie cost. In general, the darker the color, the higher the nutrients (think bright red peppers, or dark green broccoli).

4. Equip your kitchen for low fat food preparation. This doesn't need to be expensive and you can gather the pieces one at a time. A steamer for vegetables helps retain their flavour and nutrients without added fat; a pan with a rack allows the fat to drip away from meat to help you achieve low fat, flavorful cooking. Sharp knives allow you to remove the fat easily and slice meat thinly; nonstick cookware lets you brown or saute without added fats or oils.



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Straight Out of Thorsby

From the County of Leduc, from Alberta and Canada, from Singapore to the U.K., from Australia to Holland, from the USA to Panama, Thorsby graduates are making a difference. This is the third installment in a series of profiles which indicate what a small school and community can produce.

ERIN SMITH

Erin Smith graduated from Thorsby High School and has since experienced many different cultures and languages. She now has friends throughout the world as she has travelled the globe, teaching English in many different countries.

Erin was born in Leduc and moved to the Pigeon Lake area when she was two. She attended Thorsby schools from kindergarten to grade 12 and after graduating from THS in 2000, she attended Grant McEwan and then the University of Alberta, with a study-abroad term in Italy. She completed her Bachelor's degree with a major in English in the spring of 2004 and in August of that year, she embarked on her first overseas-teaching adventure with a move to Seoul, Korea, a city of nearly 10 million people – a far cry from rural Alberta.

A year and a half later she travelled to Bangkok, Thailand where she received her CELTA (Cambridge Certificate in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages) designation as part of her teacher training. Then, in 2006, she accepted a teaching position in Ulan Bator, Mongolia where she taught English to everyone from kindergarteners to pilots, Embassy personnel, and other corporate clients. This was a challenging position for her as life was extremely different than what she was used to and could sometimes be quite difficult. When asked about the weather in the developing country, she said, "sometimes it was so cold, I'd wear to bed whatever

I wore outside".

In 2008, in search for some warmer weather, and wishing to experience life in an Islamic county, she made the move to teach in Casablanca, Morocco. She described her time there as 'awesome' as she made many friends and was welcomed as part of a Moroccan family, experiencing the local culture and taking part in traditional celebrations. She studied a bit of Arabic and also had the unique opportunity to do some voiceover work for a French news station during her time there as well.

In 2009, Erin was back teaching English in Korea and in 2010 she returned to Canada where she worked for Solomon College, a private language school in Edmonton. During her time back in Canada, she volunteered with The Edmonton Immigrant Services Association as a mentor and spent time as a literacy tutor for residents of Stan Daniels Healing Center, a facility for incarcerated individuals. In 2011, she decided to try life in the Middle East and for the next four years taught at The Higher College of Technology in Muscat, the capital city of Oman, an Islamic country bordering Yemen, Saudi Arabia, and The UAE. It was a close-knit community and she had the opportunity to meet and work with a variety of people from around the world, including nobility. She says that Oman is one of the most beautiful and most peaceful countries she's ever been to, with a wonderful people and culture; and it would make a great holiday destination! While teaching in Oman, Erin realized the importance of intercultural awareness and decided to further her education. In 2013, she started her Masters of Arts in Intercultural and International Communication through Royal Roads University in Victoria, Canada. She was able to complete most of this course while still in Oman, but attended residencies in both Canada and China during her studies as well. She received her Master's Degree

in June 2015 and later that year took a shortterm teaching contract in Kazakhstan through SAIT's International Projects Department.

By August 2016, Erin had moved back to Canada and shortly thereafter accepted a position at Langara College in Vancouver as one of their International Student Coordinators. As part of her role, she facilitates orientations. workshops, and trainings for new international students, and she sits on the advisory board for Langara's new Internationalization Strategy. She also recently finished a term on SIETAR BC's (The Society for Intercultural Education, Training, and Research) executive board as their programming lead, and this past summer she received a Fellowship in Portland, Oregon at the Intercultural Communication Institute, working with pioneers in the field of intercultural communication.

When asked about her years of schooling in Thorsby, Erin said coming from a small town and school was her impetus to want to travel and expand her horizons, but that she is forever grateful to THS for helping her to become a well-rounded person. The opportunities that THS offered her through participation in high school sports, concert band, and the Students' Union all encouraged great resiliency and teamwork. She is extremely proud of her small-town heritage.

Bighorn Country Proposal and the Need for Your Input

In speaking with many people in Drayton Valley, Lodgepole, and Cynthia this week, it's clear there is a lot of concern about the Bighorn Country proposal and its impact on our local industries and families. I want to clarify what this announcement means at this point.

Bighorn Country is a proposal for a mix of parks and public lands that aims to conserve important and unique natural landscapes as well as encourage economic, recreational, and tourism opportunities.

Population growth, economic growth, and increased recreational use have created a need to revisit how all of the activities in this area are managed. But it cannot become a reality without supporting our local communities, compatible wilderness recreation economies, and careful planning, management, and enforcement.

The proposed West Country Public Land Use Zone that covers most of Brazeau County follows policies and plans that have been in place for over 40 years, and supported by responsible recreational use and management by stewardship groups, for similar Zones in western Alberta. These Public Land Use Zones are designed to accommodate and manage outdoor recreation & tourism while also supporting long-term environmental protection, and to enable & assist sustainable resource development and the management of industrial and commercial uses.

Specifically, if the Bighorn Country proposal is passed as is:

- industrial uses, including forestry, energy, mining, gravel, grazing and existing public land recreation areas would all remain permitted, and
- existing trails and camping areas would remain open, and future recreation management planning would be done to manage impacts of recreation activities on other land uses and the environment. This may include new trails, staging areas and other infrastructure, including support for commercial recreation and tourism develop-

ment.

It's important to remember that this is a proposal and that the Government of Alberta is currently surveying Albertans for our input on Bighorn Country, including the West Country Public Land Use Zone, until January 31, 2019. If this proceeds, the next step is further consultations with stakeholders, municipalities, Indigenous Peoples, and the public would be held to inform recreation and management planning.
