Straight Out of Thorsby

From the County of Leduc, from Alberta and Canada, from Singapore to the U.K., from Australia to Holland, from the USA to Panama, Thorsby graduates are making a difference. This is the fourth installment in a series of profiles which indicate what a small school and community can produce.

DARKO FILIPIC

Darko and wife Terra have been together for nineteen years (they met in Lethbridge but were married in Hong Kong) and have two daughters, Sasha (15) and Mateya (13) and a collie named Scout. They live in Lethbridge. Darko has an unusual educational background, proceeding from a Bachelor of Arts program to a science and engineering program. After graduating from THS in '96 he attended the University College of the Cariboo in Kamloops for two years, later transferring to Lethbridge College from which he graduated, as an honours student, in Civil Engineering Technology (2007). In an extra-curricular sense he served as vice-president of the students' union and sat as student representative on the Board of Governors. He was even an athlete, having tried out for a position as ski bum in Fernie, B.C.

Between the time Darko left Thorsby and graduated from Lethbridge he had many varied adventures. He back-packed through thirteen European countries in a three month span, even reaching Slovenia where he met and visited his dad Marjan's family. Back in Canada he took up rough-necking on the rigs but soon found himself immersed in a TESL (Teaching English as a Second Language) course. He then set out for China, finding a job in Guangdong teaching English in grades 1-6. Terra got a job teaching English to kindergarten students. They had time to travel quite a bit, taking in Beijing, the Great Wall and

other points of interest. When Terra got pregnant they became concerned over the all-pervasive pollution which became a huge negative as to their future in China. They now felt it best to return to Canada. Their first daughter, Sasha was born in 2003.

Once at home again, Darko was soon back on the rigs and taking on some other seasonal jobs but when second daughter Mateya came along it was soon realized that he would have to improve his educational standing. Lethbridge College provided the answer. He entered as a mature student and with his family responsibilities he became super-focused on his studies. The result is documented above.

After graduating from Lethbridge the job market was open and a position with Kiewit (one of the largest construction and engineering companies in North America) was offered. Kiewit is headquartered in Omaha, Nebraska but they are not limited to projects in the U.S. He began as a field engineer, was soon project engineer and finally superintendent on many different jobs including a cable-stay bridge on the lower mainland of B.C., a hydro dam retrofit (also in B.C.) and the construction of a new oil sands development north of Ft McMurray. However, shortly after his employment with Kiewit began, he received bad news. He had cancer and it had spread to his lymphatic system. After two surgeries and a three month cycle of chemotherapy he was declared cancer-free and remains so to the present. Ever the philosopher and optimist Darko pinpoints his year-long bout with the disease in 2007 as a turning-point in his life which gave him "a whole new perspective on what is important in life and pointers on how to live it".

To make a long story short, Darko was with Kiewit for 8 ½ years, working long days and away from home about 2/3 of the time. At such a juncture he felt the time was right to take a leave of absence and go travelling again, this time with the family.

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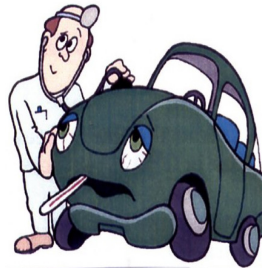

The Filipics moved to Chiang Mai, Thailand where part of their travel visa arrangement was an agreement to leave the country every two months. Let Darko explain:

“ It is a lovely little city in the north of Thailand, home to hundreds of temples, amazing street markets, street foods to die for and wonderfully nice people. We spent six months in Chiang Mai . . . taking opportunities to visit Laos, Malaysia (specifically Penang) and Cambodia. The highlight of our stay, among many, was getting to tour Angkor Wat in Cambodia(see picture) as a family”.

At the same time the girls had to keep up with their education so home-schooling was undertaken. Darko is a bit skeptical about what was achieved through home schooling but at least, this time, he did not blame the teacher. He says, though, that kids learn through experience and they got an experience that will stay with them forever.

On their way back to Canada they stopped in at Hong Kong (to show the girls where their parents were married) and visited Tokyo. The stay in Canada was brief as they were soon off for another six months, this time to Panama. The stay there was not so hectic as Southeast Asia; the family enjoyed hanging out on the black sand beaches, playing in the ocean and learning a little Spanish. Having invested most of his retirement fund on this “mid-life retirement” the family returned to Canada, “tanned, rested, and worldly”. The kids were soon back in school and Darko back in construction.

He currently works for Nuna Logistics, based in Edmonton but doing most of their work in the arctic. He is a project coordinator for the company at the Baffinland Iron Mine, located at the north end of Baffin Island, Nunavut. To Darko this is just another travel adventure. He works two weeks in, two out, so he finds the balance between work and family much to his liking. He is currently planning another

family vacation: London to Moscow to Beijing to Singapore by rail.

Darko sums it all up: “the path I have taken since THS has not been straight or smooth and was more often improvised than planned but it has given me a lot of life-shaping experiences that I wouldn’t trade if given the chance, and I look forward to whatever adventures the next 40 years brings me”.

Although parents Marjan and Diane have retired to Leduc and younger brother Fraser lives in Colorado, older brother Neil is still in Thorsby. So the connection to the Filipic roots remains intact.

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MLA REPORT

The Alberta oil patch is in a crisis that some are calling a 5 Alarm Fire or Oil-magedon! The problem is that over the last 5-10 years the oil industry has ramped up oil production to meet international demand but environmentalists, various levels of government and the courts have combined to stop the building of pipelines to get the oil to tidewater and an international market.

It is difficult to cut back oil production because it could damage some of the oil fields, at around 35 million barrels we have reached our capacity to store oil and it must now be placed on the market. The result is an oversupply of oil in the Western Canadian market that has dropped the price for what we can receive for a barrel of Western Canadian Select down to somewhere around \$10 barrel. The difference between what we receive and what the rest of the world would receive for a similar barrel of oil is called the differential and at times we have had as much as a \$50 dollar difference between what we receive and what the international market is receiving. Some oil companies are even having to sell their product at a loss.

The ramifications of this are serious. Companies that are vertically integrated like Husky, Suncor and Imperial are able to produce, have pipeline access and can refine their product, they are still making money. However, many small and medium sized oil companies are stuck receiving the WCS differential and are on the verge of going broke. Some are cutting back on staff, shutting in wells and trying to weather the storm, the rest are shutting their doors.

Drilling companies are choosing not to drill and the many small oil communities in the Drayton

Valley-Devon Constituency are witnessing closures of service companies almost every day. Many companies are saying they can survive for another 2 months but cannot guarantee that they will be around in 6 months.

It doesn't get any more serious than this and in reality the problem is more complicated than I have time to write about. So what can we do about it?

The long term answer is to increase our capacity to transport our oil to international markets whether by rail or pipeline or truck. If we decrease the oversupply of oil by about 400,000 barrels per day then the price will increase back to about \$20 a barrel differential and most companies will be able to produce oil and make a profit.

But rail and pipeline take time and we have run out of time. That is why the leader of the Opposition, Jason Kenney, has laid out a plan for mandatory curtailment. As Conservatives the United Conservative Party would prefer to leave an oversupply up to market forces but in the face of a collapse of the oil industry and on the advice of many oil experts the party has come out in favour of mandatory restrictions.

Many in the oil industry are split on this issue. Husky, Imperial and Suncor have not been open to mandatory curtailment. Many companies on the verge of closing their doors have already voluntarily reduced production for a combined 200,000 barrels a day. Others in the industry simply want the market to decide. In an admittedly unscientific poll I polled 213 constituents and 121 did not support mandatory curtailment, 72 did support mandatory curtailment and 8 were undecided.

Mandatory curtailment is a tough call but it is one of the few options that may have an immediate effect on the oversupply and could save companies and jobs in the short term. The opposition is pleased the government has decided to implement the curtailment.

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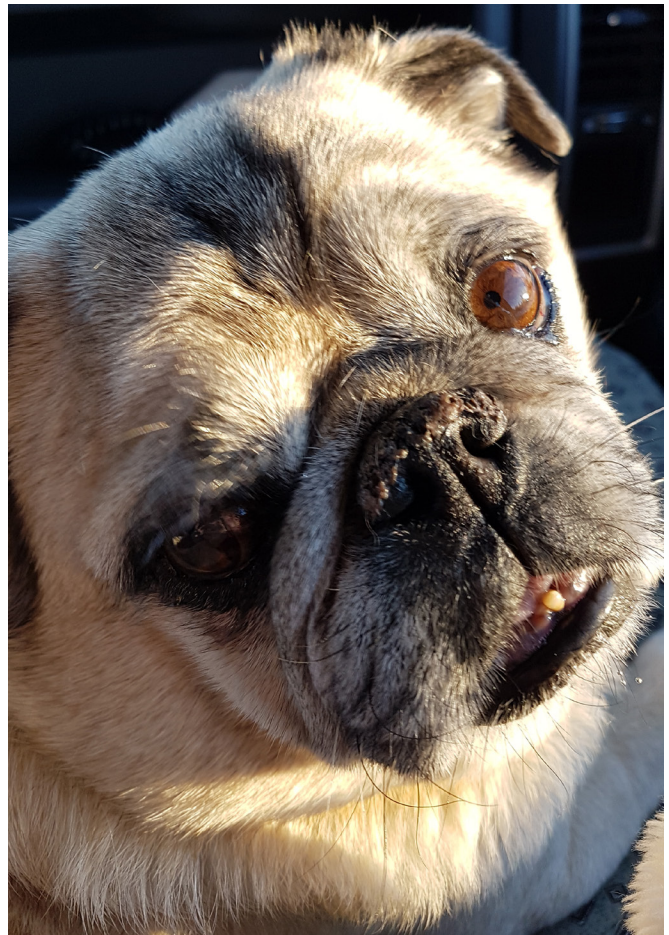
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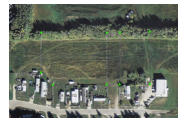
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
