

Warburg scholarship recipients meet generous donor From Black Gold Regional Division No. 18

"It's a feeling of pride. It just makes you feel good." Terry Proskurniak beams as he talks about his annual namesake scholarship for Warburg students. On a snowy November day, Proskurniak is on his way from his home in Edmonton to Warburg School to complete his latest donation.

Proskurniak has a deep connection to Warburg - he grew up in the community. After moving away and building a successful business, he returned many times over the years for celebrations and visits. And in 2015, he decided he wanted to give back to the school in which he spent his formative years. "I always wanted to do something," he said, "I was at the school for the student awards ceremony and I got the idea of creating this scholarship fund."

The Terry Proskurniak Scholarship is an annual \$5,000 donation to help Warburg School graduates fund their post-secondary education. The first students to receive the scholarships graduated in 2016. Now, for the first time, Proskurniak is meeting some of the recipients. Nathan Drysdale and Larissa Kuzio - first-year students at the University of Alberta - returned to Warburg School during their fall reading week to receive their scholarships and shake the hand of the man behind the donations. "I can actually say 'thank you' for giving to the school every year," said Kuzio, "That's huge."

After posing for the requisite cheque presentation photos, the trio sat down for coffee, joined by the school's principal, Wendy Maltais; BGRD's Associate Superintendent of Learning Services, Bill Romanchuk; and trustee for the area (County West), Shawna Ofstie. Conversation shifted from the realities of university life to the paths of previous scholarship recipients and Proskurniak's memories of Warburg School.

During the discussion, Kuzio and Drysdale credited the scholarship with motivating them to push themselves, academically and personally, in their final year of high school. One of the criterion is a commitment to community citizenship or volunteerism. Drysdale, who was active in the local hockey community, reflected on the valuable experience. "It's taught me a lot of life skills like leadership and respect and fairness," he said.

Proskurniak acknowledges he has been fortunate to be in a position in which he can contribute in this way, and he is encouraging others who are able to consider a similar gesture. "It's helping your fellow person out," he said.

On behalf of Warburg School and Black Gold Regional Division No. 18, thank you to Terry Proskurniak and all of our scholarship donors for their generosity and support. The scholarships BGRD is able to distribute support the next generation and invest in tomorrow's legacy.

2019 Tire Recycling Grant

The Village of Warburg has applied for the 2019 Tire Recycling Grant to construct pathways in the community Park leading to the Gazebo as well as the Cenotaph and Spray Park Areas.

Water & Garbage Rate Increase- Bylaw 103/10

Council approved an increase in Water from \$1.00 per m3 to \$1.20 per m3 and an increase from \$14.65 to \$14.75 per month for Garbage Services. This increase will come into effect January 01, 2019.

Bylaw 98/18-Procedure Bylaw

Council reviewed, discussed and approved the amendments to Bylaw #98/10 being the Procedure Bylaw.

Community Standards Bylaw #159/18 & Land Use Bylaw Amendment #161/18

Opportunity was available for residents to discuss these bylaws at Public Hearings held prior to the last council meeting, however there was no one in attendance. Council has moved forward and approved both of these bylaws and they are now available on our website.

Snow Removal Reminder

Bylaw 27/98 states:

Every occupant, and in case there is no occupant, then the owner of every house, shop, building, lot or parcel of land and every person having charge or care of any public building shall, within the first fourty-eight (48) hours after every fall of snow cause the same to be removed off the sidewalks from or abutting on each house, shop, building, lot or parcel of land respectively and shall also keep the said sidewalk free of all ice which may be deposited there on. That in the event of any person failing to comply with Sections 3, 4 and 5 of this by-law, The Village of Warburg may carry out the removal of snow, ice or dirt with all costs involved being charged to the owner of the property.

That no person shall place snow, ice or dirt from private property, such as driveways, parking lots, service station lots, etc. on any street

Traffic Bylaw 133/14 states:

- 7.11 No person shall leave, store or deposit or permit to accumulate on any highway or sidewalk any article or thing that may create a nuisance or danger or interfere with the proper use of the highway or sidewalk.
- 13.1 No person shall drive, upon a roadway or on any Highway, any Vehicle so as to result in depositing mud, slush, ice or any other object or debris as to cause a hazard to other users of the Highway. Any violators are responsible for the clean up.

Operation of an Off-Highway Vehicle Bylaw 139/14 states:

- III.2 Any person who is the owner or operator of an off-highway vehicle wishing to use Village alleys, or roadways where there are no alleys, to leave the Village of Warburg or to return to their residence within the Village of Warburg must purchase a one year permit, from the Village of Warburg at a cost of \$25.00 per year to do so. Permit applicants shall first obtain proper registration and public liability insurance and property damage coverage with a limit of at least \$1,000,000.00 and proof of registration and insurance must at all times be carried on the off-highway vehicle to be produced to the Enforcement Officer(s) when requested.
- III.4 No person shall use off-highway vehicles to remove snow or transport refuse to the Village waste area unless they have a permit from the Village of Warburg. Permit applicants shall first obtain proper registration and public liability insurance and property damage coverage with a limit of at least \$1,000,000.00 and proof of registration and insurance must at all times be carried on the off-highway vehicle to be produced to the Enforcement Officer(s) when requested.

Please refrain from using your quad within the Village of Warburg unless you obtain a permit and carry proof of registration and insurance. Use of quads etc to remove snow still leave snow covered/icy patches on the sidewalks, residents are reminded that these must be kept clean and clear to hopefully prevent slips/falls and injuries. Also please consider other residents and their ability to move their vehicles.

Bighorn Country Proposal and the Need for Your Input

In speaking with many people in Drayton Valley, Lodgepole, and Cynthia this week, it's clear there is a lot of concern about the Bighorn Country proposal and its impact on our local industries and families. I want to clarify what this announcement means at this point.

Bighorn Country is a proposal for a mix of parks and public lands that aims to conserve important and unique natural landscapes as well as encourage economic, recreational, and tourism opportunities.

Population growth, economic growth, and increased recreational use have created a need to revisit how all of the activities in this area are managed. But it cannot become a reality without supporting our local communities, compatible wilderness recreation economies, and careful planning, management, and enforcement.

The proposed West Country Public Land Use Zone that covers most of Brazeau County follows policies and plans that have been in place for over 40 years, and supported by responsible recreational use and management by stewardship groups, for similar Zones in western Alberta. These Public Land Use Zones are designed to accommodate and manage outdoor recreation & tourism while also supporting long-term environmental protection, and to enable & assist sustainable resource development and the management of industrial and commercial uses. Specifically, if the Bighorn Country proposal is passed as is:

- industrial uses, including forestry, energy, mining, gravel, grazing and existing public land recreation areas would all remain permitted, and

- existing trails and camping areas would remain open, and future recreation management planning would be done to manage impacts of recreation activities on other land uses and the environment. This may include new trails, staging areas and other infrastructure, including support for commercial recreation and tourism development.

It's important to remember that this is a proposal and that the Government of Alberta is currently surveying Albertans for our input on Bighorn Country, including the West Country Public Land Use Zone, until January 31, 2019. If this proceeds, the next step is further consultations with stakeholders, municipalities, Indigenous Peoples, and the public would be held to inform recreation and management planning.




