

Mayor's March Update From Mayor Rod Raymond

Economic Development - We have formed a committee of local people for Economic Development. We have taken a regional approach to attract businesses and residents to the area. While in our early days, I am excited about the future prospects of our town, and the great quality of life we have to offer.

Doctor Attraction Committee - We now have a committee in place and are working with Warburg and Alberta Health Services to focus on bringing a doctor to the region.

Council Update - We have a councillor who is wintering out of the country. When this came up in the fall, like most people, my first reaction was not positive. During a recent meeting with the Minister of Municipal affairs, at his office, we discussed the matter. Under the municipal government act, (MGA): as long as a councillor attends meetings in person or electronically, they are in full compliance. I did not realize that attendance by electronic means was becoming more prevalent within other municipalities. The process demonstrates how society is progressing to the digital age. The councillor, in question, does attend all council meetings, electronically, including committee meetings as required. Under the MGA, he is in full compliance, as defined, by the rules that govern elected councils. The councillor can be reached by phone or facetime while wintering in the south. The councilor continues to work remotely on projects. The councillor, in question, also voluntarily gave up a portion of his honorarium, although not required to do so. I realize a few residents find the councillors physical absences, disappointing. In conversations I have had with multiple residents, when all of the facts are explained. and the new digital reality of the world is discussed, the situation becomes a non-issue. I personally, wanted to see how the councillor's physical absence would affect council's ability to function over the winter. In my opinion, the effect has been minimal to non-existent over the last four months. In my opinion, I cannot see council passing an unenforceable bylaw to restrict a councilor's right to conduct their responsibilities, either in person or by electronic means. A bylaw of this type restricts future councils and the possibility of attracting competent future candidates. The time to deal with this issue is at a candidate forum and the ballot box, every four years.

Town Staff - We continue to hear from residents as to the great job the town employees are doing. We have had some issues in the town office regarding security and verbal disrespect. Please keep in mind, the staff are there to do their job, but their job does not include being verbally abused. We now need to develop a "respect policy" for all town facilities.

To clear up confusion regarding the map in the Target for the public meeting March 14th. It shows county land which borders the town. It gives the town a say regarding any development contemplated by the county. We have no annexation plans except Edmonton International Airport: LOL!





Alberta Students Are At Stake

I had the pleasure of giving talks to two classes at Warburg School and participate in an all-candidate forum at H.W. Pickup School in Drayton Valley this week. The questions from the students were on point – they are aware of the issues we face in this upcoming Provincial Election, and it's causing them concern. At an education forum last weekend, the UCP education critic and Drayton Valley-Devon MLA Mark Smith said schools shouldn't expect additional funding, despite a growing enrolment of 15,000 new students this fall alone. Two days later, Jason Kenney announced his plan to cut corporate taxes by 33 per cent, the biggest corporate tax giveaway in Alberta history.

This plan will create a \$4.5 Billion tax fall. Add to this his plan to freeze education spending, and it jeopardizes Alberta classrooms.

Over the last four years, this government has focused on supporting children and their parents. Nowhere is that clearer than in education. Since 2015, 244 new or modernized schools have been built or planned, adding 125,000 modern learning spaces across Alberta. These are needed. With the fastest growing population in the country, Alberta hired 4,000 teachers and support staff to keep up with growing enrollment, which will continue to grow.


In addition, this government increased the Alberta Child Benefit, reduced school fees, and introduced a school nutrition program to en-

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Straight Out of Thorsby

From the County of Leduc, from Alberta and Canada, from Singapore to the U.K., from Australia to Holland, from the USA to Panama, Thorsby graduates are making a difference. This is the fourteenth installment in a series of profiles which indicate what a small school and community can produce.

KELSEY JOHNSON

Kelsey was born in Edmonton in 1988 to Grant and Corinne Johnson. The second child to an older brother named Jordan, she was maybe more rambunctious and, according to Jordan, allowed to get away with more than him as they grew up, which lead to a life of creativity, travel, and constant searching for the next thing. The family moved to Pigeon Lake, just outside of Thorsby, when she was 4 and Kelsey jumped into pre-school and gymnastics as soon as she could.

Growing up near a small town in an even smaller community provided some interesting challenges and rewards. Taking full advantage of the countryside and the lake, Kelsey grew to love fishing, wandering in the woods, building forts with her brother, skidooing, and singing and dancing like no one was watching (because no one was! A perk of few neighbours). She attended preschool right through to high school graduation at Thorsby, with a brief time away spent at Leduc Composite High School to pursue theatre. She returned to Thorsby for her final semester of school so that she could graduate with her friends in her hometown and graduated in 2006. She has lots of fond memories of growing up in Thorsby; the grade 6 Jasper trip with her classmates, starting a short-lived cheerleading squad at the school, and spending countless hours at the Recreation Complex becoming an arcade game master, to name a few.

During this time, her passion began to swing away

from gymnastics and solidly into the performing arts. She was in productions of Annie Get your Gun, Anne of Green Gables, Grease, Beauty and the Beast, and Coyote and the Winter that Never Ends, an operatic production written for kids. She also worked up to her level 8 of the Royal Conservatory for Music program for voice. After graduation, the urge to continue with her theatre studies led her to audition for and be accepted to the Red Deer College performing arts program. The two year diploma offered many opportunities to Kelsey including large stage productions, her favorite being Wizard the Oz, as well as working with dialect coaches, dance classes, world class vocal coaches, and touring Alberta with a musical a friend of hers wrote entitled "Dead Lovers Day".

After the theatre diploma, Kelsey continued at RDC to obtain a degree in Film Studies and had the lead roll in a student written and produced full length film, Tumaini (meaning "Hope" in Swahili) which went on to be toured in independent theatres in Canada and the States and earned Kelsey an Alberta Motion Picture Industry Award nomination for Best Albertan Actress.

College degree in hand, Kelsey went to try and join the extremely competitive field of film making and managed to work behind the scenes on a few projects. She was in the assistant director roll, working from a trainee up to a 2nd assistant director. She even was thrown in front of the camera a few times when it was needed. She had the opportunity to be involved with Fubar II (and has a very brief cameo), Heartland, Blackstone, Mixed Blessings, and Hell on Wheels, to name a few highlights.

While filming and travelling around Alberta pursuing work, the idea of cooking never left Kelsey's mind for too long. In college, she did all the grocery shopping and cooking for her and her 3 roommates, providing she never have to do the dishes. A plan she felt worked perfectly for her. Growing up, cooking with her mom and making tourtiere with her Auntie Dot were always happy moments for her. Iron Chef was her favorite show growing up. So one day when a producer on set asked her what she wanted to do and where she wanted to be eventually, she blurted out "I just want to cook"

and just like that, a new path was formed.

She moved to Edmonton, bought some chef whites and packed up her one knife and started applying to restaurants with no experience and no schooling. Her dad gave her the advice to ask to work for free for a week and if they liked her work, they have to agree to hire her. Sage advice, Grant! It worked and she started her first kitchen job at Characters Fine Dining in downtown Edmonton. She learned the basics there and eventually moved on to a small mom and pop style restaurant called Culina Highlands where the kitchen staff of herself and 2 other ladies became extremely close knit and honed and practised their skills in a small scale restaurant. Kelsey was promoted to kitchen manager by the age of 23 and a whole new set of skills was acquired.

After a year or so, Kelsey decided to switch up once again and left her job and apartment and bought a one way ticket to Sweden where she solo travelled for just over a month, visiting some family and making new friends along the way. There was a great debate as to whether or not to come back, but reality soon set in and a friend from home called and said the bakery she worked at was hiring. Kelsey sent in her resume the next day, and started to make plans to come back to Edmonton. Once home, she was hired at Duchess Bakeshop, an Edmonton favorite. This was to be a huge change in her life because, though she didn't realize it and it would be several years in the future, this is where she met her now husband, Garner Beggs.

Kelsey left Duchess about 3 years into her time there to help open the restaurant Woodwork with her then fiancé. The restaurant was a huge success but the relationship happened to go the other way, and Kelsey left Woodwork to return to Duchess to bake again. By this point, Garner had also become a single man, and the two went on a casual work hang out, only to realize they really enjoyed one another's company.

They started dating and dreaming about a future business together. Kelsey long had the idea to open a brunch restaurant and pitched the idea to Garner and the other two owners of Duchess Bakeshop. A new plan was hatched and the hunt for a restaurant space began. They eventually found an old garment factory just west of downtown Edmonton that had been refurbished and Cafe Linnea was born a few years later. Kelsey became the chef and owner and after one year of business they expanded into dinner service as well. It's a French inspired bistro, serving classic dishes with local ingredients. It will be entering its 3rd year of business this summer and, while it's a huge amount of work, the reward of running her own business far surpasses the challenges. Cafe Linnea has been critically acclaimed and employs over 35 people, a point of pride for Kelsey.

It has also allowed her some amazing opportunities. Last year, Cafe Linnea was announced the 6th best new restaurant in Canada and Kelsey and some of her team were flown to Toronto for the award and to cook for some great culinary minds of Canada. She recently was the guest chef at the Devour Fest in Jasper and this summer will be flying to Copenhagen to cook at 56 Grader, a restaurant that grows most of it's own vegetables and is well respected in the cooking community.

Kelsey maintains her connection to Thorsby through her parents Grant & Corrine, and brother Jordan (G & N Contracting) and orders vegetables for her restaurant from local producers Ryan Mason (Reclaim Organics) and Bob and Crystal Krueger (Ultrasite Farms). While she doesn't know what the future holds, Kelsey is ready for what comes her way and she is very much looking forward to cooking, growing, and building her way through.

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
RCMP Investigate Break In to Bank




