

Thorsby Economic Development Updates From Town of Thorsby

Early on a Saturday morning after a heavy snowfall back in January, Council met with a large group of about 20+ business owners, to gather their input on economic development efforts for the community. Subsequently, the call for volunteers from those in attendance went out to form a smaller steering committee.

The local business owners who volunteered their time to the committee are Darcy Powlick (Darcy Powlick Realty), Gerry Bacsik (Bacsik Electric), Tim & Linda McBride (LogosIT Solutions and S.O.S. Bookeeping & Taxes) and Jason Dillabough (Pet Necessities / CR Thorsby). The group have already met several times and plan to meet at least once a month throughout the year to help focus and target economic drivers.

A less familiar face in the community is Carol Rempel, who has joined our Economic Development Team.

Carol has lived in the Warburg/Thorsby area for over forty years and has worked with various economic driver organizations including Drayton Valley and Leduc Chambers of Commerce, West Central Community Futures Development Corporation, and has also been a local business owner/operator and continues to be actively involved in various community groups.

Carol will be providing support to our economic development efforts as we move forward with the steering committee and projects funded through the Department of Economic Development and Trade (Coal Transition Program) over the next 12-18 months. Carol will be talking with local businesses and residents to introduce herself, gather views, ideas and data to help solidify plans.




Public input to help set RCMP policing priorities

From Leduc County - RCMP - City of Leduc

Local RCMP detachments thank the more than 1,700 residents who provided feedback on the 2019 RCMP Policing Priorities survey conducted last month.

RCMP from the Leduc and Thorsby/Breton detachments asked residents in the Leduc region to identify three areas they think should be highest priority for local police. A total of 1,718 individuals in the Leduc County area — including the City of Leduc, towns of Calmar and Thorsby, and Village of Warburg — completed the survey.



More than 70 per cent of respondents identified property crime as a top priority, followed by impaired driving (34.9 per cent), illegal drug-related activity (33.3 per cent) and crimes against persons (33.2 per cent). 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Straight Out of Thorsby

FOLKERT (FRANK) DE BOER

I was born in Nij Beets, Friesland, Netherlands, the fifth of nine children to Rinze (Ray) and Jitske (Joyce) de Boer. A small town Elementary School (80 students) provided me with my first six years of education. This was followed by a switch to a Mid Level School (MAVO) in a larger centre nearby. Starting out in grade seven involved a 15 km bike ride for myself and ten classmates.

I did fairly well at this new school with the exception of my mandatory French and English classes. The teacher had trouble with my tendency to question the idiosyncrasies of these non-Dutch languages. Before that school year was up my family (all eleven of us) emigrated, arriving at the Edmonton International Airport on May 28, 1978. Two weeks later my parents and the six youngest siblings landed in Gibbons, AB., too late to finish the school year. In September we enrolled in Gibbons (in the very grades we had just left). The school board had brought in a consultant to help us learn English but he seemed to give up after two sessions (we had not followed his advice to buy "recipe" cards to help with vocabulary). Again we did not finish the school year because we moved to Thorsby, arriving on May 1, 1979.

You might think the big move from Holland to

Canada would be the difficult move but going to Thorsby was tougher on me because it was my third new school in less than two years. I had to make new friends once again, this time at the end of the school year. By the time I transitioned into senior high, I had come to love Thorsby and THS. I enjoyed the classes and fit in fairly well with most of my teachers and fellow students. I was involved in the Students Union, intramurals, and in Yearbook, but to some extent never fully understood the Canadian school culture. I don't think I ever attended a sporting event at the school and rarely participated in any evening social events other than graduation. If you see the graduation pictures at THS you will find me among one of the smallest groups to ever graduate from Thorsby High (1984).

I started my university career at Camrose Lutheran College (now U. of A. Augustana Campus) and graduated with a B.A. (History). I loved College so much that I worked there for a year after I completed my formal studies but by this time I had already begun what has, in some way, defined my life – I do not stay in one place too long. I spent three summers working and living on two farms in the Leduc/Kavanagh area during college and after I left Camrose the next ten years saw me in Thorsby (twice), Edmonton, and Leduc (twice). I will add to my list the fact that while at college I lived in at least five different dorm rooms. The next five years saw many more moves as I had decided to aim for a full time position as a minister in the Christian Reformed Church. While completing my M. Div. (Master of Divinity) I lived in three different places in Grand Rapids, Michigan with summer internships in Medicine Hat, AB., Bloomfield, ON., and a full-year internship in Thunder Bay, ON. After receiving my degree I put in a summer in Saskatoon, came back to my parents' Leduc home and then back to Thunder Bay for five months (this time in the same building as before). I think I was ready for a place to call home. That place arrived with

a call from and a move to Blenheim, ON.

Blenheim is located just a few miles from Lake Erie. My eight years there was the longest I have lived in one place since leaving the Netherlands. It's amazing how you can be part of a community when not constantly on the move. It is now six years since I left but I have been back three times and it still feels like home. My next community was Iron Springs/Picture Butte, AB. and 5+ years were spent there, the second longest I have stayed in one place since we immigrated. Yet the burdens of the ministry ended up taking a toll on my health and wellbeing. Since June 1, 2018 I have nearly come full circle, at present living in the same Thorsby area home, now located a quarter mile further south. (this time with far fewer people).

Besides all the travel and moves documented above there has been other travel. While still at Camrose Lutheran College I joined the Concert Choir. The tours took us to three different states south of us and through five Canadian provinces. Involvement with church youth took me to multiple places in Canada and the U.S.A. I have been back to my birthplace three times and have visited all provinces in the Netherlands. In Europe I have seen Belgium, Luxembourg, Germany, and Denmark. I have also visited Central America (El Salvador), the Middle East (Egypt, Israel, and Jordan) as well as Australia (it helps to have family there). A highlight of my travels occurred during the summer of 2017. As part of a group of 135 cyclists raising funds to end world hunger I was able to pedal from Vancouver to Halifax. The mountains proved grueling but what became evident was that even overweight, middle-aged people like myself can do much more than we might think

Dad was a dairy farmer in Holland and he was under the assumption that more than one of his six sons would continue in the farming industry. He ended up being right as I am the only son who left farming altogether. At this time eight of the nine children live within one hour's drive from Thorsby. When I earlier mentioned family in Australia it was in reference to my younger brother Wybrun (Wilbur) who is firmly entrenched in dairying down under.

Perhaps I can have more travel adventures in the future. There are many places in Canada and the world I haven't had the chance to visit. And perhaps I'll reside in one place longer than eight years, maybe even in Thorsby.

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Leduc County welcomes federal coal transition task force recommendations

A series of recommendations provided by a Government of Canada task force highlights the importance of providing support and financial resources to communities, like Leduc County, who will be directly impacted by the phase out of coal-fired electricity.

We are pleased to see that the recommendations from the task force reflect the concerns of affected communities across Canada, including Leduc County. The federal government must keep the families in our communities who depend on the coal industry to make a living at the forefront of the decision-making process, and ensure support for municipalities impacted by the transition.

Leduc County has been working diligently with the federal and provincial governments to secure funding to help diminish the impacts of the transition away from coal-fired electricity, which will cost the county approximately \$20 million annually.

Earlier this week the Government of Canada's Just Transition for Canadian Coal Power Workers and Communities task force delivered its report with recommendations on making the transition away from coal-fired electricity fair for Canadian communities and coal workers.

The recommendations from the report encourage the Government of Canada to take action and invest in affected communities through local infrastructure projects, transition funding programs and funding application support.

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
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
