Emergency Preparedness Week – May 5-11
The 3 Steps of Emergency Preparedness

1: Know the Risks - Although the consequences of various disasters can be similar,

knowing the risks in your region can help you better prepare. In addition to natural disasters, there are other types of risks, such as power outages and industrial or transportation accidents. In Alberta, a tornado can strike quickly with significant damage. Wildfires can threaten communities and restrict movement. Heavy rains can cause flash flooding.

The following hazards could happen in our community:

- Floods
- Pandemic influenza - Public Health Agency of Canada
- Landslides
- Power outages
- Severe storms
- Tornadoes
- Wildfires

In Alberta, municipalities respond first to local emergencies. Alberta Emergency Management Agency, is also there to help when needed. The agency assists Alberta communities to mitigate, prepare for, respond to and recover from major emergencies and disasters.

2: Make a Plan - Every household needs an emergency plan. It will help you and your family know what to do in case of an emergency. Your family may not be together when an emergency occurs. Plan how to meet or how to contact one another, and discuss what you would do in different situations. It only takes 20 minutes to complete a personalized plan online. You can then print it out. Most of this information can be filled out on your own. You may need to get some information from your municipality. To complete your emergency plan online, visit the 'Make an emergency plan' page from the GetPrepared.ca website.

To fill out your home emergency plan, you will need to think about the following:

- Safe exits from home and neighborhood
- Meeting places to reunite with family or room-mates
- Designated person to pick up children should you be unavailable

- Contact persons close-by and out-of-town
 - Special health needs
 - Place for your pet to stay
 - Risks in your region
 - Location of your fire extinguisher, water valve, electrical box, gas valve and floor drain
- Keep this document in an easy-to-find, easy-to-remember place (for example, with your emergency kit). Photocopy this plan and keep it in your car and/or at work.

3: Get an Emergency Kit - In an emergency you will need some basic supplies. You may need to get by without power or tap water. Be prepared to be self-sufficient for at least 72 hours. Make sure your kit is easy to carry and everyone in the household knows where it is. Keep it in a backpack, duffle bag or suitcase with wheels, in an easy-to-reach, accessible place, such as your front-hall closet.

Basic emergency kit

- Water – at least two liters of water per person per day. Include small bottles that can be carried easily in case of an evacuation order
- Food that won't spoil, such as canned food, energy bars and dried foods (Replace food and water once a year).
- Manual can-opener
- Wind-up or battery-powered flashlight (and extra batteries)
- Wind-up or battery-powered radio (and extra batteries)
- First aid kit
- Extra keys to your car and house
- Some cash in smaller bills, such as \$10 bills and change for payphones
- A copy of your emergency plan and contact information
- Special items such as prescription medications, infant formula, equipment for people with disabilities or food, water and medication for your pets or service animal (personalize your kit according to your needs)

TIP - Keep a corded phone in your home, as most cordless phones will not work during a power outage.

Recommended additional items

- Two additional liters of water per person per day for cooking and cleaning
- Candles and matches or lighter (Place candles in sturdy containers and do not burn unattended)
- Change of clothing and footwear for each household member
- Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each household member
- Toiletries
- Hand sanitizer
- Utensils
- Garbage bags
- Toilet paper
- Household chlorine bleach or water purifying tablets
- Basic tools (hammer, pliers, wrench, screwdrivers, work gloves, dust mask, pocket knife)
- Small fuel-driven stove and fuel (follow manufacturer's directions and store properly)
- A whistle (in case you need to attract attention)

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2019 No Spray Program

Brazeau County property owners who do not wish to have roadside spraying performed adjacent to their property must enter into a No Spray agreement. In the agreement, the landowner consents to maintain the adjacent municipal right of way themselves, for the purpose of weed and brush control without herbicides, in compliance with the Alberta Weed Control Act. For highway right of ways, the landowners must contact Alberta Transportation if they do not want herbicides applied to the area adjacent to their property.

It wasn't like Scott Kregel to give up. He was a battler, a dedicated athlete who spent hour after hour perfecting his free throw and jump shot during the hot summer months of 1987. But just before fall practice everything changed. A serious car accident left Scott in a coma for several days. When he awoke, a long rehabilitation process lay ahead. Like most patients with closed head injuries, Scott balked at doing the slow, tedious work that was required to get him back to normal -- things such as stringing beads. What high school junior would enjoy that? Tom Martin, Scott's basketball coach at the Christian school he attended, had an idea. Coach Martin told Scott that he would reserve a spot on the varsity for him -- if he would cooperate with his therapist and show progress in the tasks he was asked to do. And Tom's wife Cindy spent many hours with Scott, encouraging him to keep going. Within 2 months, Scott was riding off the basketball court on his teammates' shoulders. He had made nine straight free throws to clinch a triple-overtime league victory. It was a remarkable testimony of the power of encouragement.

Couldn't we all use a little encouragement? The Bible reminds us often just how important encouragement is. Paul says in 1st Thessalonians 5:11 to "encourage one another and build one another up!" What a great lesson for all of us, and guess what? It's something everyone of us can do!!

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

No More RRSP Room? No Problem

Nicholas Cheung was a teenager in the 1980s when he opened his first registered retirement savings plan (RRSP). Most people his age were blowing their money on junk food and going out. “I had a job working at my father’s drugstore every Saturday, and decided to invest,” says the now 46-year-old chartered professional accountant from Toronto. “I had learned about the rule of 72 – divide 72 by the annual rate of return to see how many years it will take to double your investment – so I knew the significance of starting young.”

If you’ve maxed out your RRSPs and your TFSA and still have money to invest, then consider opening a non-registered account. However, investments in these accounts get taxed, so it’s important to know which securities to keep inside them.

Since his part-time income at the time was low, he had limited allowable RRSP contribution room, though he always saved to his max. He bought guaranteed investment certificates (GICs) and Canada Savings Bonds, which offered attractive double-digit returns in the late 1980s. Impressively, Cheung has continued maxing out his RRSP, even as his annual contribution room has grown. With more money to save, he’s now using a variety of accounts, such as a TFSA and non-registered options. “I look for other opportunities to invest in a more tax efficient manner,” he says.

While few Canadians start as young as Cheung, many people with high incomes do invest to the RRSP limit, which is \$26,230 for 2018, often year after year. Yet, a number of them still have more money to save. Where should you put your money when your RRSP is at capacity? Here are some ideas.

Max out your TFSA

Tax-free savings accounts (TFSAs) should be most Canadians’ Plan B, says Todd Sigurdson, Director, Tax and Estate Planning at IG Wealth Management. Investment earnings and growth inside a TFSA is completely tax free. And, the contribution room is now fairly significant, he adds. Anyone who was 18 or older in 2009, has lived in Canada since that time and has never contributed to a TFSA has a total of \$63,500 of TFSA contribution room. As of January 1, Canadians can contribute \$6,000 per year, up from \$5,500.

Invest in other registered accounts

The RRSP isn’t the only registered account where money can grow tax free. Parents or grandparents can invest extra funds in a registered education savings plan (RESP) to save for a child’s education. Like an RRSP, an RESP is tax-deferred. Unlike the RRSP, though, the government will chip in 20 percent of a contribution up to a maximum of \$500 per year. “The grant is free money and anyone saving for a child’s education should be taking advantage of it,” says Sigurdson.

Similarly, for individuals who are disabled or have disabled children, registered disability savings plans (RDSPs) offer grants and bonds, while any income earned in them gets taxed only when it’s withdrawn.

Make use of non-registered accounts

If you’ve maxed out your RRSP and your TFSA and still have money to invest, then consider opening a non-registered account. However, investments in these accounts get taxed, so it’s important to know which securities to keep inside them.

Stocks, mutual funds and other equities should be held in non-registered accounts, as capital gains – the money made off a sale of a stock – and dividend income are taxed favorably. “Earnings from fixed-income investments are fully taxable, so you want the tax-sheltered growth,” says Sigurdson. “But only 50 percent of capital gains are taxed and dividend income provides a dividend tax credit.”

Get creative with other investments

Other tax-efficient investments include some life insurance policies, as the proceeds go to the beneficiary tax-free upon the policyholder’s death. “When you think about how you’re going to pass along your wealth to the next generation, it can really help shape how you structure your investments,” says Cheung.



The election is over and it is now time to roll up our sleeves and start turning political vision into fiscal reality and start rebuilding the Alberta economy.

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
