

Ride For Dad Makes Stop in Thorsby Again

The Town of Thorsby and Ride for Dad organizers are thrilled to invite the residents to come out and support this great cause. The event is happening on Saturday, June 8th and the riders are expected to start rolling into Thorsby around 11:45 a.m. If you missed out last year, now's your chance to experience the roar of hundreds of motorcycles, enjoy the food, fun and music on Hankin Street and support this great cause.

The following is taken from The Summary Edmonton Motorcycle Ride for Dad 2019 written by Terry Willisko

The mission of Motorcycle Ride for Dad (MRFD) is to raise funds to save men's lives by supporting Prostate Cancer research and raising public awareness across Canada. THE MRFD is supported nationally by the RCMP Foundation. Our goal is for men to continue to be there for their families and friends for years to come.

The facts are this One in Seven men will get prostate cancer in their life. Can you imagine how many more Lottery tickets would be sold if you were guaranteed a 1 in 7 chance of winning ???

At any given time in Canada there are about ONE MIL-LION (about 7% of the adult male population) men who have prostate cancer and 800,000 do not know it because they have never been checked or tested.

Assuming a greater Edmonton area population of 1.2 Million split 50/50 male/female with 80% being adult males $1,200,000 \times 50\% = 600,000 \times 80\% = 480,000 \times 7\%$ (prostate cancer rate): 33,600 men who potentially have prostate cancer $\times 80\%$ (who have never been checked) = 26,880 adult males in the greater Edmonton area who do not know they have prostate cancer. Awareness and education leads to early detection of prostate cancer which is essential for effective treatment and long term survival.

The message is SIMPLE MEN over 40... see your doctor and get checked

These motorcycle ride events take place in over 32 communities across Canada having started with the Ottawa Motorcycle Ride For Dad in 2000. Since then, the Ride for Dad events across Canada have donated more than \$33,000,000.00 to the Prostate Canada Fight Foundation (Charitable number 851333179RR0001) to support prostate cancer research programs and awareness across Canada. The funds raised in a particular ride community stay in that community —we give where we ride. In our case, the research funds flow to the Cross Cancer research facility in Edmonton.

Our Edmonton MRFD chapter started in 2007 and is made up entirely of unpaid volunteers who come from all walks of life with a common goal to ultimately eradicate prostate cancer. The Edmonton MRFD Chapter is in the top three in Canada having donated just over \$3.2 million to the fight against prostate cancer since 2007.

The 2019 Edmonton MRFD ride event is set for Saturday June 8, 2019 with the 205 kilometer route including stops in Nisku, Calmar, Pigeon Lake, Thorsby finally finishing back in Nisku. These stops along the route form part of our poker run, a long standing MRFD tradition. The Edmonton MRFD event typically attracts 500 to 1000 motorcycles to this one day event and will run rain or shine. The parade of motorcycles through the communities of Alberta grabs the attention of the masses and the media on ride day and the funds generated from the ride day events will help to fund the prostate cancer research and awareness programs of today and into the future.

This will be the 13th annual ride for the Edmonton Chapter of the MRFD. Please consider making a tax deductible donation to this fight against Prostate Cancer or better yet.... if you are a rider join us on ride dway and be a part of this great event. 



CHARLES FENSKY Part 1 of 2

I was born in Sierra Madre, California and immigrated to Canada in 1975. I became a Canadian citizen in 1997 and current hold dual citizenship which has been extremely useful working around the world. I was very fortunate to grow up on a farm in the Thorsby area. The many years of farm work gave me skills of independence, perseverance and substantial hands on experience. It is hard to explain as many of the items that farmers do are not in a manual, that skill of figuring things out has allowed me to accomplish much and I am very grateful to my parents Ed and Elaine Fensky for giving me that environment and the opportunities to make mistakes. I graduated from Thorsby in 1991. I decided to pursue a degree in electrical engineering at the University of Alberta and graduated with distinction in 1995. I placed in the top 10 of 130 Electrical Engineers, a bit of culture shock given that my high school graduating class was 13. In my summers I worked on the farm, as a gas well operator for SaskOil in northern Saskatchewan and as production engineer assistant for Wascana in Edmonton. I had significant pressure from Faculty of Electrical Engineering to pursue a post doctorate degree. However I declined due to the uptick in the economy that was aggressively hiring engineers and soon after became a Professional Engineer in Alberta.

In 1995, I became a Wireline field engineer which used electrical downhole sensors ("tools") to evaluate the productivity potential of an oil or gas well. The role was a mixture of wellsite data acquisition ("logging"), data interpretation and equipment

maintenance. Initially I was based in Grand Prairie, and spent a lot of time in the well sites of northern Alberta and British Columbia. I worked a classic "Two and None" schedule which allowed me to acquire a lot of experience and exposure in a short time. My SLB wireline unit was recognized to be highest revenue generating and lowest failure rate in Canada in 1996.

In 1996 I was promoted to the Schlumberger Special Services based in Nisku, I was the historically the youngest specialist in Canada. This division is where specialized wireline products such as well seismic, wireline coring, pipe conveyed logging, nuclear magnetic resonance and wireline formation testing were based in Canada. I quickly learned to run & maintain all the services. The specialist engineer role greatly increased my experience, allowing me to use these specialized services on many high-profile wells across Canada. I was unique, in that not only could I operate the tools very well but could also make electrical & mechanical repairs which was very desirable. As such, I was often assigned new research prototypes to test and improve. I have many fond memories running MDT assets with serial number 001 & 003 (The current serial numbers are in 800's). These specialty tools were very expensive. One evening to attend a family get together at Morrowdale Hall, I came straight from wellsite to farm and the truck had easily 3M\$ of downhole tools on board. It was an interesting reflection as I had parked on the same location that I had repaired many a haybine in the past. It was clear that my favorite tools were wireline formation testers. These are unique devices that perform downhole production experiments. They can measure the pressure and permeability of many different reservoirs to identify the most productive locations. The advanced wireline line formation testers also had the ability to collect samples of the fluid from the well just after it had been drilled. They incorporated a downhole pump, sample chambers and an optical spectrometer. The combination allowed for very accurate PVT samples and the ability to know what the fluid properties downhole. This knowledge is very valuable on exploration wells as it allows for future planning of the economic viability of the well and the future production facility requirements.

In 1997, I was offered the opportunity to relocate to

St John's Newfoundland to have a dual role of Field Service Manager and Formation Testing Specialist for the exploration & delineation wells for Terra Nova, Whiterose and Hebron. As needed, I also worked on Hibernia and Sable Island. Coming from the prairies the offshore environment was a big change. My first well was on a very old Semi called the "Bill Shoemaker" which was a legacy rig from the 1980's and the wellbore was located 30km from the Ocean Ranger tragedy. In the very violent storms, you get an appreciation of the power of the Grand Banks & the movie scenes from "Perfect Storm" are scarily realistic. There are new elements related to working on semi submersible drilling rigs that are a lot different as you are always in perpetual motion, much more complicated logistics when you are 18hr boat ride from shore and much higher financial exposure. The north Atlantic is also unique for icebergs and frequently operations were halted as the rigs disconnected from the wellbore to get out of the way. In these many exploration wells, I used the first real time logging technology which allowed clients to participate in the data logging process from around the world at their offices in Calgary, Norway and UK all at same time. This often put me in high level drilling meetings and client discussions to ensure success on the exploration well programs. Often, that little downhole fluid samples were one of the most important pieces of information for the wells as they would define the future FPSO and platform facilities. I continued to test new research prototypes and had an abnormally high success rate with formation testing tools. I received the Schlumberger Bronze medal for Service Quality (a high global honor for wireline).

In 1999, I was promoted to work at Schlumberger Research Center in Houston. Working at a global research center for a large multinational was a unique experience. The group had experts from all around the world and PhD's from many high-level schools such as MIT & Cambridge. The ideas and technology were really cutting edge. The challenge however was turning these items into commercial field solutions, my role was a field test coordinator. This was my niche of making things work in the real world. These concept prototypes would need to be made operational such that they could be used in wells and then extensively tested in wells around the world. I spent many long days getting things

working on test wells and then even longer days on well sites around the world. It is a different situation when you are trying to make things work that have never worked before. My skill set evolved from one who repairs to one that was actively part of the design process. I added numerous enhancements to the final versions to allow them to be successful. This role exposed to working on wells in ultra deep water Gulf of Mexico where depths of 10,000m, wells on the North Slope of Alaska that had thick permafrost, wells in the North Sea where high technology is highly promoted for their challenging conditions, wells in the Middle East for the economic application, wells in Latin America which have unusual sand control issues and wells in China & South East Asia that have unique geology and reservoir challenges. These were the extremes to validate products and it gave me a very broad experience set. Numerous customers were impressed by my ability to do detailed wellsite; repairs that were required as there are no backups on early prototypes and intense pressure get the desired job done successfully. Some of my favorite memories were: the offshore Qatar close to the Iranian portion of Persian Gulf watching the race to deplete the largest gas reservoir in the world, in the jungles of Sumatra where you could not leave any hand tools unattended as the monkeys would take them, in the Tarim desert in Northern China at night where the sand was +40C and the outside air was a few degrees above freezing, and in the amazing offshore facilities in Norway. The item that made the biggest impact on me was working with oilfield hands around the world, that although we were from many different backgrounds, we all worked together and understood the universal language of oil wells & what was needed to be successful.

To improve existing field products, in 2002 I was transferred to Schlumberger downhole tool manufacturing. This is an art where basic raw materials are transformed into high tech devices for downhole extremes. It is not trivial to make a thin piece of metal that encapsulates advanced electronics survive 30,000 psi and 450C. I was responsible to lead a team that made formation testers and increase the reliability of the commercial field products. This completed the technology trilogy of design, manufacture and operations. These skills have been extremely valuable to this day.
