Property has been graciously donated in the downtown core in Thorsby for the development and construction of a park. The preliminary proposal of Taylor Park will have an outdoor stage, equipped with power, electrical, solar lighting and audio capacity, as well as a gazebo, a water fountain with a water bottle dispenser, drinking area and pet bowl to provide free drinking water to the community. Solar lighting, flower planters, and free WIFI throughout. At the entryway, a paving stone walkway will assist those that need wheelchair accessibility. Benches and picnic tables will be dispersed in various locations for picnics, lunches, and relaxation. A 5' fire pit will provide warmth for our Annual Winter "Christmas in the Village" event. The design proposes to include a mural depicting our cultural heritage. Also at the entry, a statue of Thor will be designed and constructed in metal, set in a concrete base as Thorsby was named after the Norse God of Thunder, Thor, and will be designed to be a tourist attraction.

The primary activities will be for outdoor concerts, music jams, picnics, farmer's markets, Christmas and May long weekend festivities, lunches, games, exercise, photo opportunities, weddings and relaxation. The quality of life in

Thorsby will be enhanced by the development of Taylor Park.

Taylor Park is needed in the downtown core as a green space and a place that will accommodate families, seniors, youth, children and all those that appreciate the outdoors. Many people will be volunteering who will be participating and leading community activities. There will be programs and activities to help keep the community active and vibrant.

With the help and assistance by many organizations, volunteers, fund raising events, and grants, our goal will be achieved! Thank you for your consideration with this proposed endeavour. Your input is invaluable and we encourage you to attend.

Although Warburg is funded somewhat differently and is under the Village of Warburg's umbrella, our county tax dollars are still being spent to protect the rate payers on the west end of the county.

As Former Deputy Chief, I have attended several Fire District meetings where we were repeatedly told, "we are one family working together to protect our county". Apparently Leduc County feels like we are the adopted child that's not allowed in the family picture!

I feel disrespected as a former Deputy Chief and a county resident. It is a shame that Leduc County Fire Services did not include an integral part of their fire districts in their year review. I can only hope that this is a factor that does not get missed in 2019's yearly review.

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
Father - Daughter Team from Thorsby Continues to Ride in Support of the MS Bike Tour



ELIANE MILES (NEE WEYERMANN)

It's the Saturday evening of a long weekend in ('wintery') Sydney, Australia, and I'm with my gas heater and a glass of Merlot. My 9 month old baby boy, Jacob, hasn't woken 40 minutes into his evening sleep (unlike many nights this week), which means I have a rare 2 hours of 'me-time' to reflect on my Thorsby upbringing.

Having spent the last 12 years in a city of (now) 5 million people, I am increasingly thankful for the privilege of having grown up on land. I say increasingly because for most of my Thorsby life I both resisted and resented farm life: the large yard that had to be mowed, the neverending fencing, battling the winters with my unrelenting Raynaud's, and being forced to endure the tune of country music on the school bus home.

These days I wish I had taken more notes, both from my own family and other skilled people around me. Perhaps I would now know how to plant a garden (a duty which I felt I was too studious for at the time), cook a few traditional Swiss meals (which I avoided learning as my taste for them grew cold over time), and even mend some jeans (my mother was, after, all, a seamstress and could have shown me a few of these skills). At the time, however, these things seemed more trivial than practical to me.

I also took a few other, even more important things, for granted. The community spirit, the support that people gave to each other, and the way everyone seemed genuinely interested in each other's business. To this day, I admire the religious nature by which the farmers gather near my parents' farm for their daily chat: Filtered coffee and cigarettes between 8 and 9am, every day including weekends. In a big city, inviting your neighbours around for 'tea' is always too big of a deal than it really should be.

My family of six moved to a farm five miles south-west of Thorsby in 1998, a year after we emigrated to Alberta from Switzerland. As an enthusiastic 10 year-old, I was fortunate to have spent the first year of our time in Canada learning English and adapting to the Canadian culture in Warburg. Fortunate, I say, because it allowed me to start Grade 5 in Thorsby with a fresh start. No kid (especially a new kid) wants anyone else to know they spent a significant period of time in a Special Ed class (even for the very legitimate reason of learning English). I did my best to fit in to Thorsby life during my pre-teen and teen years. As a migrant kid, I naturally felt 'on the outer' and worked extra hard to make up for that.

I give credit to the leaders and teachers who imparted so much into my life and continuously went over and above to champion me. Mr Holbrow's unrelenting passion for music widened my song appreciation beyond my (then) Christian rock repertoire; Ms Gramlich's patience in teaching us how to use the blue 1998 Apple iMac computers for print-screening was second-to-none; Mr Olsen's constant presence at girls' volleyball tournaments demonstrated an immense investment in us beyond the maths classroom; and Ms Tosi's unrelenting passion for Shakespearean sonnet has left a lasting appreciation for the English language. I also give credit to the community and leadership teams of Thorsby New Life Christian Fellowship, including the youth pastors at the time, Brian and Janice Westnedge, for imparting so much into my life.

One of my most impacting high school memories was an activity instigated by Ms Van Steenis. In Grade 10, she asked each class member to write down three positive things about every other person in the room, which she then collated and laminated. Years later members of my class still had their 'Great Things About Me' list blue tacked to the inside of their lockers. I believe this one act of positivity changed how many of us saw ourselves; and our ability to see the good in others.

I left Thorsby the week I finished Grade 12, in June 2006 (and not a week later). My father says he still has a memory of me packing up the car with my belongings and leaving the driveway without as much as a second thought. To him, that moment was more powerful in saying goodbye to his little girl than my wedding day. I'm thankful for the many opportunities I've had since

I'm thankful for the many opportunities I've had since that day. I initially started a nursing degree at the UofA in Edmonton, only to become a nursing school dropout just 12 months later. Australia was calling and, in true millennial fashion, just couldn't wait. At the time, I

was desperate to be closer to a global youth and music movement that had gripped my heart during my earlier teen years.

I started at Hillsong International Leadership College in July 2007, joining 1200 other young people from around the globe in exploring faith and being a follower of Jesus. After a year I transitioned to a Bachelor of Theology through an affiliated college, and upon graduating, served as a youth and young adults pastor in a local Sydney Baptist church. I met my (Sydney born and raised) husband and got married during this time, and grew in my interest for business through growing exposure to professional families. I felt challenged to step outside my comfort zone (which were the church and care worlds, having also applied my UofA skills to work in palliative care and disability care) and to enter the business landscape.

This opportunity arose as in 2013 I transitioned from working in the church to join a Sydney-based consulting firm specialising in social and market research. My role initially involved supporting the director, a well-regarded Australian Demographer and Social Researcher, in the area of media relations. My role quickly grew to leading the team of researchers to win, execute, and deliver more than 100 bespoke projects to clients each year. I loved leading a brilliant young team (median age of 23!) and advising clients across various industries (including the for-purpose sector) to make strategic business decisions founded in data – it seemed a perfect fit for my maths brain and love for language (Thanks, Mr Olsen & Ms Tosi!).

During this time, our firm (particularly director and our key leadership team) was increasingly called upon to deliver keynote speeches on the latest demographic and social trends. During a two-year period with the firm I prepared and presented more than 60 keynote speeches and workshops across Australia and internationally. Each audience I engaged with pushed me to re-think the story and re-contextualise the latest insights. I loved the pace and the challenge (and sometimes, the travel!). One particular career highlight was advising 300 global leaders of a \$1B not-for-profit in Colorado Spring on how they could re-think the way they do things into the future. In early 2018 I resigned from the firm and started my own business, a strategic social trends consultancy by the name of The Curious Co. I work with clients across various industries to help them grapple with the trends taking place beyond their immediate business context, both through project-based work and keynote speaking. At the same time as starting the business I fell pregnant with our first son, so both motherhood and business are a constant juggle and learning curve!

I am passionate to see people find faith and purpose in their lives. Some ways I've been able to stoke this passion is by serving on the board of a large Australian youth organisation, and until recently I also served on the board of CBM Australia (a Christian international development organisation). Out of personal interest I also completed a Masters in International Public Health, which I'll one day find a use for! My journey is not atypical to that of many young people these days (the average Gen Z will have 17 jobs across 5 careers in their lifetime).

It's an exciting time to be alive and navigate what it looks like to live well in our rapidly changing world. Thank you, Thorsby, for playing your part in shaping my story.

Rundle's Mission invites you to come to the lake, see the tipi and explore the trails and amenities of Rundle Mission. It is a wonderful meeting place!







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

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


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
