Charges down this Canada Day long weekend From Leduc County

Over the four-day period from June 28 to July 1, Leduc County peace officers travelled 1,252 kilometres and issued a total of 19 charges and 10 warnings for speeding, improper passing and others.

Over the same four-day period in 2018, a total of 52 charges and 27 warnings were issued. This was down from 2017, when 81 charges and 19 warnings were issued for the same time period.

We are pleased to see that the majority of residents and visitors celebrated Canada's 152 birthday responsibly. Leduc County peace officers work hard to keep the public safe and we appreciate the public's cooperation in making our community a safe place for all.

Proactive patrols are important to enhancing traffic safety in Leduc County. While these patrols sometimes result in fines or warnings for motorists, these patrols also provide an opportunity for peace officers to maintain a presence in the community and educate the public about traffic safety.

Excessive speeders charged

A motorcyclist was charged after speeding more than 70 kilometres per hour over the posted speed limit on Saturday afternoon. The adult male driver from Warburg was caught speeding 161 kilometres per hour in a 90 kilometre-per-hour zone on Highway 622 near Range Road 24.

Two additional motorists were charged with speeding more than 30 kilometres per hour over the speed limit; one driver was travelling 35 kilometres per hour over the speed limit on Township Road 502 near Range Road 24 and another was travelling 37 kilometres per hour over the speed limit on Airport Road near Township Road 242.

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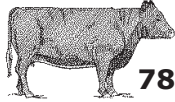
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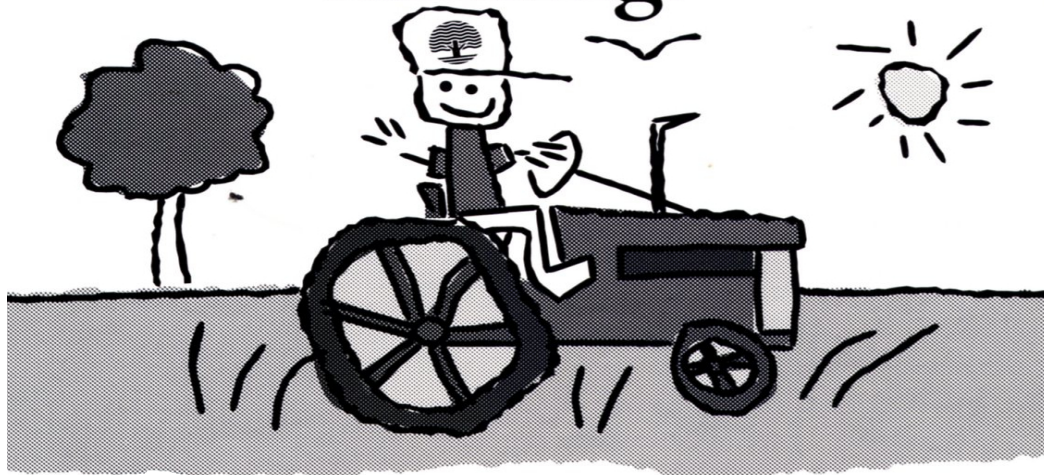
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Straight Out of Thorsby

BARRY RASCH

Parents and Kids

I arrived as a bouncing baby boy of 2 lbs. 12 ounces at the Leduc Hospital, second son of the Rasch family. My proud parents were David and Gayle Rasch, and my brother was Dale. Later on, he and I would join up with other childhood friends in the area and look out! anything could happen. In 2001 I would marry Shelley Anderson and we would start our family in Thorsby. In 2005 our son Matthew would arrive and in 2006 our second son Michael would come into the world creating a very busy household with never a dull moment.

Growing Up On the Farm

Looking back on the memories of my childhood, I had many happy times. With the freedom of growing up on the farm, the outdoor learning classroom was always in session. We were always busy, active to the extreme. We raised 4-H steers, milked forty-five Holsteins, fixed and replaced fences and my personal favourite was sorting and vaccinating cattle. This was always done on Sundays. Overall it was pretty great being able to work together alongside my family at farming. Dad and Mom worked hard to run the farm operations and provide us boys with some pretty amazing camping trips throughout the summer. As well there was all the fishing we could want as the farm was only a short four miles from Pigeon Lake. They always say farming is a life choice filled with the challenges of hard work, repairs, weather, and the necessary saying of a prayer to pull it all together and achieve the agricultural goals. That is certainly true, and, as I look back, I think to myself "Wow! My parents were quite the gamblers to juggle all that and still make it work".

Memories of School

To this day I cherish many memories of my school years in Thorsby. Our teachers did their very best to instill the knowledge we needed to make an impact in the world. Who knew at the time that it would sculpt us to be who we are today and what we would most value now and in the future. After-school sports I enjoyed were badminton, curling, ski club, and volleyball. We took some pretty big trips e.g. to Jasper in elementary school and our various trips to the Citadel Theatre were always a favourite. There was also, although outside school, the

4-H Exchange Trip. Home Economics class would teach us how to cook an amazing meal and the Industrial Arts Projects are still in my mind, revolving around how hard that darn thing was to build. Perfection was often in the eyes of the beholder, very abstractlol. In grades 11 and 12 I would apply for my first grant and secure funding to build a 20' x 80' greenhouse. I really enjoyed plant production, or, as I would often discuss with my father, farming under plastic. This is where I would continue to develop my knowledge and experience.

In 1994 I graduated from the Thorsby High School. I do recall our class was larger than average and one of very diverse interests. Some friendships were infused for eternity while others would be challenged with the big world when students left to meet new people and build new experiences. I'm happy to say many of the friendships that I developed in school are still intact. Maybe we don't see each other as often but those friendships are forever.

Breaking Into the Work Force

Entering the work force was definitely frightening as you leave the protection of your parents and learn to be responsible for YOURSELF while building on your knowledge and skill set. Often many jobs will present themselves so you give it a good effort to see where things go

My first job straight out of school was with the United Farmers of Alberta in Leduc working out of the lumber yard. I really enjoyed serving the customers.

By having a strong back and a desire to travel around I would next be employed by Jade Drilling. For the next twelve years we criss-crossed the province in search of black gold. At Jade I would work with some pretty great guys and there were non-stop comedy acts daily. It was a rough and tough job but I learned many lessons from it and the money looked good in my bank account. I would work my way up to Derrick-man which I found to be the best position for me. While I was working away from home I could still get involved with the Thorsby Rec Board and would hold a position with this Board for nine years. I was asked to join the Thorsby Fire Dept. and stayed there for five years. I admit that when that pager went off the adrenaline rush was like nothing I had ever experienced. We would train hard to learn best practices to deal with everything from grass to structure fires and traffic control. At a certain point the Thorsby Fire Dept. began responding to vehicle accidents and this was more than I was comfortable with. I hung up my hat and left knowing that it was a great experience working with some very dedicated volunteers.

I would eventually be forced to leave the drilling rigs due to an injury and slowing oil patch. The next four years were spent managing at the Home Hardware in Thorsby where I would again really enjoy working with customers. My journey would transition to repairing pumps at JC Industries for three years. The change in work was once more enjoyable as the job would allow flexibility. At the same time I worked relentlessly in supporting our community at the table during negotiations or representation. Working in a shop day in and day out would eventually become tiresome and I would take on a role in Shipping - Receiving and in the handling of repairs at Akita Drilling. Here I would find some of the most amazing people and would really come to enjoy working with them. There would be tiring days working in a very fast paced business where everyone worked hard to keep things going as we dealt with 30 plus rigs.

Running For Municipal Politics

In 2004 I would take a big leap into the unknown and what was to have the biggest impact on myself and a challenge at every corner. I would enter local politics as an Elected Official for my community at the age of 28. In the months that followed I would have to call on all my experiences to date in order to deal with the decisions I would have to make - decisions that would affect the residents of Thorsby. I would learn the value of debate and justification and the inner workings of the community. This would involve budgeting, high level planning, service delivery, negotiations, capital project planning and the most important of all: how to talk to people. The meetings would be long, diverse, and at times tiring, navigating through the highest priorities of our community. Strategic meetings with staff, engineers and funding support approvals from the province or feds would be high on the list of important undertakings. These were all lengthy to sort out and would often take months to go through. Talking in the community at times wasn't easy as each citizen would hold different ideas and different perceptions. In the end, with a solid pitch and plan, a project would be agreed to and formed. Some of the lengthy projects I'm proud of having a direct hand in as a councillor and mayor are:

Thorsby Water Treatment Plant, Arctic Spas Curling Rink/Field House Redevelopment, Annexation of additional lands for Thorsby, Axia High Speed Fibre, LED Street Lights Retrofit, Seniors Club New Building, and numerous Street, Sewer, Water and Sidewalk Projects. We would rewrite the Municipal Development Plan, Land-use Bylaw, Community Standards Bylaw, Strategic Plan, and Sustainability Plan. These will be the planning documents for the town to follow for many years going forward with priorities and focused approach. Meetings would be my life for 13 years: 6 as councillor and 7 as mayor. This experience would see highs and lows. Making choices to further advance Thorsby's success were occasionally unpopular but nevertheless necessary. In the end I'm proud to have been part of some amazing opportunities most being essential in changing our village to a town by dedication and focus on community growth.

Thorsby Communities in Bloom Society

With a passion for our great outdoors I started up the Thorsby Communities In Bloom Society in 2005. We have focused our attention on improving our outdoor space. To date I'm proud of what we have accomplished as a small dedicated group of volunteers, securing over \$80,000.00 in grants which has provided funding for: trail development, numerous landscaped projects such as Community Hall Bed Display, Recreation Complex Grounds Display, Lions Campground Display, Chamber Sign Display, Sponsorship of New Playground, the Sprouts Program, Park Benches, Picnic Tables, Bleachers and of course organizing the plantings of trees and flowers, and many workshops. We have encouraged development of green policies such as battery collection, recycling, cleanups, and overall community support where needed.

Words to Live By

I can honestly say life as we know it is a journey. It is not always an easy journey but one that is worth the fight. Keep your family close to you and always give the necessary time it takes to do the simple things with your children as those are

the memories they cherish forever.

As for politics I'd say fight for what you believe in and show some passion doing it. Stay positive and give it your best step forward. You're there for a short time so make your efforts count. The easiest thing you can do is know how to talk to people with patience and respect. Promote and communicate always. Remember volunteering builds a community so remember to give back

Where Am I At Currently?

After my leave from politics, which was a huge adjustment, I found myself feeling empty, maybe even a bit lost you may say. I had all the work I needed, and I even had more opportunities to volunteer but I just remained at a distance as I needed to refocus and rest as I was really quite exhausted from politics. So with a hem and a haw I started thinking about the idea of going back to school, an idea which is terrifying at age 45. But nothing comes easily and with that I enrolled in school to take a Business and Digital Marketing Management Diploma. The course began on January 15, 2019 and will be completed in November 2019. The main reason, I guess, for going back to school, was the uncertainty of the oil patch. It was no longer an option to wait on, so making the big leap for change was necessary. It's my feeling that this is just one step in learning and on the horizon I hope to start my own business focusing on my own passions, aspirations and skills that I have learned over the last 25 years.

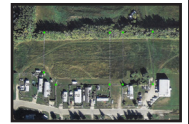
