



BYLAW NO. 2019-11

OF THE TOWN OF THORSBY

(hereinafter referred to as "the Municipality")

IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA

This bylaw authorizes the Council of the Town of Thorsby to incur indebtedness by the issuance of debenture(s) in the amount of \$278,413 for the pavement replacement on 54 Avenue between 53 Street and 52 Street within the Town of Thorsby Municipal limits

WHEREAS:

The Council of the Town of Thorsby has decided to issue a bylaw pursuant to Section 258 of the Municipal Government Act to authorize the financing, the undertaking and pavement replacement within the Town of Thorsby.

Requests for proposals have been submitted and specifications have been prepared and the total cost of the project is estimated to be \$295,470 and the Municipality estimates the following grants and contributions will be applied to the project:

Capital Reserves \$ 17,057 Provincial Grants \$000,000 Debenture(s) \$278,413 Total Cost \$295,470

In order to complete the project, it will be necessary for the Municipality to borrow the sum of \$278,413 for a period not to exceed 20 years, from the Alberta Capital Finance Authority or another authorized financial institution, by the issuance of debentures and on the terms and conditions referred to in this bylaw.

The estimated lifetime of the project financed under this bylaw is equal to, or in excess of 25 years.

The principal amount of the outstanding debt of the Municipality at Dec 31, 2018 is \$3,262,159.30 and no part of the principal or interest is in arrears.

All required approvals for the project have been obtained and the project is in compliance with all Acts and Regulations of the Province of Alberta.

THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF THORSBY DULY ASSEMBLED, ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. That for the purpose of purchasing municipal paving the sum of TWO HUNDRED AND SEVENTY EIGHT THOUSAND AND FOUR HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN DOLLARS be borrowed from the Alberta Capital Finance Authority or another authorized financial institution by way of debenture on the credit and security of the Municipality at large, of which amount the full sum of \$278,413 is to be paid by the Municipality at large.
- 2. The proper Officers of the Municipality are hereby authorized to issue debenture(s) on behalf of the Municipality for the amount and purpose as authorized by this bylaw, namely the pavement replacement.
- 3. The Municipality shall repay the indebtedness according to the repayment <u>structure in effect, namely semi-annual payments of combined principal and</u> interest instalments not to exceed TWENTY (20) years calculated at a rate not exceeding the interest rate fixed by the Alberta Capital Finance Authority or another authorized financial institution on the date of the borrowing, and not to exceed FIVE (5) percent.
- 4. The Municipality shall levy and raise in each year municipal taxes sufficient to pay the indebtedness.
- 5. The indebtedness shall be contracted on the credit and security of the Municipality.
- 6. The net amount borrowed under the bylaw shall be applied only to the project specified by this bylaw.
- 7. This bylaw comes into force on the date it is passed.

Gear up your child for school the right way, with a comprehensive eye exam

It's that time of year again: summer is winding down, and it's time to get ready for back to school. Most parents' routines involve shopping for new clothing and school supplies so their children are prepared to succeed. What many parents tend to overlook is their child's most important learning tool: their eyes.

"Early comprehensive eye exams are critical to helping children succeed in life" says local optometrist Dr. Sara Starko. "A child's eyes are constantly used in the classroom and at play."

One in four children has a vision-related learning difficulty. A child with a visual problem won't know how the world looks and will assume that what they are seeing is normal. What's more, children with uncorrected vision or eye health problems face many barriers in life: academic, social and athletic.

It can be hard for a child to catch up after struggling and falling behind through the basics of reading, writing, and math. Countless children in Canada are told every day that they have a learning disability when in reality the problem was their vision. A vision screening is not enough. "A child who sees 20/20 can still have a vision problem," says Dr. Starko. Visual acuity is one aspect of our visual system, but the skills needed for successful reading and learning are much more complex. Vision-related learning problems can cause children to reverse words when writing or copying, confuse the same word in the same sentence, skip lines while reading or read the same line twice. "Optometrists don't just check sight. They check how well the eyes work together and how sight is processed."

Vision problems aren't always obvious (especially if it's a problem with only one eye), and the development of a growing child's eyes doesn't stabilize until age 20. Alberta Health Care covers a comprehensive eye exam every year for children 18 and under. Dr. Starko recommends that babies have their first eye exam between six and nine months.

HARVEY ZINGLE Summited by his wife Donna Zingle

Harvey was born March 1, 1934 to Nick and Stella Zingle. They resided on a farm a few miles out of Thorsby. Nick and Stella remained on the farm until retirement when they moved into Thorsby and became active in the Seniors' Association.

Harvey attended a small one room school (Weed Creek) until grade 9. This school was across the road from their farm. From there he attended Thorsby High School until he graduated in 1952. He was the only male amongst the females that graduated. One fond memory of his time there occurred when an inspector came to his math 31 class. Mid way through the class Mr. Spanner and the inspector began to argue about the correctness of a math solution Harvey had presented on the blackboard. The argument continued even when the dismissal bell went. As Harvey said "to this day he didn't know who won the argument". Harvey was very appreciative of the calibre of teachers such as Mr. Spanner that taught at THS. He was convinced that it was due to this excellent teaching that he received the highest math score in the Grade 12 Departmental Exams, and was given a scholarship as a result. He then attended the University of Alberta where he obtained is B.Ed. (1956), M.Ed. (1960) and Ph.D. (1965).

Most of his career was spent in the Faculty of

Education at the University of Alberta, working in the area of Educational Psychology. His last role before retirement was that of Dean of Education (1991-1996).

His professional accomplishments and awards were numerous. He received professional awards such as: Honorary Life Memberships in the Guidance Council of the Alberta Teachers' Association as well as the Canadian Guidance and Counselling Association. He was made a fellow of the Canadian Psychologist's Association of Alberta. When he retired, he received the distinction of being called Professor Emeritus. The honor he was most delighted with was when his former graduate students initiated a scholarship called the Harvey Zingle Scholarship which has been awarded each year to a Master's level student in Counselling Psychology (presently in the amount of \$4500.00).

He lectured, presented workshops and papers, evaluated university programs and served as external appraiser of counselling in many countries. He wrote several books and hundreds of articles for professional journals.

While working full time at the university, Harvey also had involvement with other roles. In 1967 he started the Family Counselling Clinic in Leduc. For a span of time he served part time as the Head of Psychology at the Glenrose School Hospital as well as at the Misericordia Hospital.

Along with his academic career, he served on various boards and committees in the community such as: President of the CORE Committee of Young Life Edmonton, Chairman of Advisory Committee of the Canadian Mental Health Association and President of the Greater Edmonton Fastball Association. He also served on the board of St. Steven's College in the Pastoral Counselling Program, ran the youth group in his church and conducted many workshops for church members.

As an only child he vowed he would never just have one child. We ended up with three chil-

dren: Wade (Patrizzia), Sheree (Shawn) Rankin and Randy (Melissa). They gave us 9 grandchildren: Nicole (Rob) Wells, Christopher (Laceigh), Sabrina, Adam, Hannah, Molly, Gabriel, Rafael and Beckett. There are now 2 great-grandchildren Finn and Nash. He loved our kids and wanted them to grow up God loving, compassionate towards others, wise, respectful and hoped that they would use their talents in a positive way. As a result of his modeling these qualities, they achieved those goals, as they have found careers such as: teachers, psychologist, businessman, computer programmers, builder and hospitality industry worker.

On top of raising our kids our home was open to all. When people were hurting, or in distress, or for whatever reason his comment was always "come and stay with us for a while" and in his own special way he encouraged others to overcome whatever problems they experienced. Many people came and stayed with us. He was a great listener and seemed to make everyone he met feel they were important and special (and to him they were). He was an eternal optimist (saw the glass half full), He never seemed to panic over events.

He will be forever remembered as a man who loved his family; and was deeply respected and loved in return. He touched the hearts of many people in all areas of his life: work, community, church and the various boards he served on. He was a blessed man who thought nothing mattered more than his wife, children and grandchildren.

Upon retirement he spent many hours building decks, basements and on other projects for his family. In the process he enjoyed the many hours he spent with his grandchildren. He also travelled and played Slo-pitch Fastball.

Harvey passed away on December 16, 2007. His big hugs, compassionate nature, willingness to help others and big smile continues to be missed by many.




