

CHRIS SCHEETZ

Like many of us that grew up in Thorsby, my story started on a farm. The farm was full time for all of us, and we actually looked forward to school in September, as it was some time off the tractor seat. As Grade 12 was ending I still really didn't have a clue what to do with my life. and then one day it hit me. Back then, radio really was your only company on the tractor. No cell phones and GPS then! I loved listening to talk radio on 930 CJCA and really loved CISN COUNTRY 103.9 and remember the day it launched in 1982 when I was 11. To my Mom and Dad's credit they knew farming was not going to be my passion, and encouraged me to go to radio broadcasting school. Not only did I love radio. I loved to talk! Every one of the 30 people I graduated with, and most of these I had spent 13 years in school with, would agree I chose the right career. I remember the late Mr. Zurek telling me in grade 11 to pay attention, because I'd never get paid talking for a living. He was correct for many years as I worked below the poverty line.

Going to school downtown at Columbia Academy of Radio and Television, and living on Jasper Avenue, was quite the adjustment for this farm kid. The sound of coyotes howling was replaced with honking horns and car noise, and to be honest, I never slept well one night that year. I can say I was the only one in my apartment building driving a Ford pickup with a loud dual exhaust. The sound of my truck fit in much better in Thorsby.

As my year of broadcasting school was ending, I was prepared to try and get my first radio job away, in a small market no where near Edmonton. But I thought I'd call the radio stations in Edmonton and see if, just by chance, one of them would hire me to sweep the floors or anything for them. I believe at that time (1989), there were 7 stations in Edmonton and I called them all. To my surprise the only one that called me back and offered me an interview was CISN COUNTRY. In May of 1989, at 18 years old, I was working at my favorite radio station while still living on the farm, burning purple gas in my truck, and working downtown Edmonton. Don't get me wrong, it was not the glamour job I dreamed it would be. I started working behind the scenes in the promotion department, and did every job I could to make myself valuable. Everyone at the station thought I was working so hard; I believe it was the work ethic I learned from the farm and growing up in Thorsby. I didn't actually get on the radio as an announcer for about 2 years, and got my first big break flying in an airplane and doing traffic reports. I ended up doing that job for many years and it got me on the air in both the mornings and afternoons, and really helped me get my name out.

In 1992 I married Karen Harrish, my junior high sweetheart, also from Thorsby and we moved to Devon as she had a job at the Devon Hospital. Our children Baillie and Carter were born, and just like them, my career slowly grew and changed. I worked the overnight show and the evening show for many years, waiting for my breaks. It wasn't until 11 years into my career that I had my first weekend off, and that was with the mid day show, then the drive home show and music director role. Then I was promoted to Program Director, which is the manager of everything on air at the radio station. Seriously, for a kid from Thorsby who actually put CISN stickers on the intercom speaker of his grade 8 class and all over his pickup truck, to be the boss of the station is crazy when you really think about it. 9 years ago, I moved to the morning show and gave up my role as the boss, which has been a great move for me personally. I work with Jack Sweeny whose husband Bobby also grew up in Thorsby, a half mile from me, and Matt DeBeurs who unfortunately, has no ties to Thorsby (poor guy).

Dean Brody has a song called "People Know You By Your First Name" and it's the song I could have written about Thorsby. Google the lyrics and you'll agree. Thorsby taught me to be thankful and help your neighbors anytime you can, and that's what I've been trying to do for 30 years. Highlights include the Stollery Children's Hospital Radio-thon that we've done with your help for 20 years and managed to raise over 20 million dollars, living on the field at Commonwealth Stadium for the Hope Mission and Edmonton's homeless and raising a million dollars, and so many more in between.

In the early 2000's a drought hit Alberta and my farming roots told me I had to help. I spent 5 days living in a tractor and people from both the farm and city responded and we managed to raise \$150,000 for the plight. One of the highlights of my time in the tractor was coming to Thorsby and spending time at the schools. Everyone showed me so much love. My time in the tractor raised awareness about how important the farming community is. Then a few vears later when the "Mad Cow" BSE crisis occurred, I was moved to do a semi truck convoy to the border and have an Alberta Beef BBQ close enough to Montana they could smell it. I have my class one license and got a semi truck with cattle liner and invited others to join me. We thought we might have 10 trucks join us on that Saturday morning and boy were we wrong. Thousands of people joined us as we made our way down the QE2. We had an RCMP helicopter fly alongside us for safety, and at one point they estimated the convoy to be 52 kms long. In fact the City of Calgary closed the Deer Foot

for the convoy to go through, something they had only done once before when the Queen of England came to town. I don't tell you these stories to brag, these stories are about the people who joined me to help others. A few years ago I decided to raise awareness for drinking and driving, and distracted driving, by walking 250 kms in 5 days. My route included stops in both Warburg (my second home town) and Thorsby schools. Both of those stops were so special, and it makes me feel like my life has come full circle. So much of who I am is because of going to Thorsby School and the incredible teachers that I had.

I've been the 'On field' host for the Edmonton Eskimos for 12 years and again, for a kid from Thorsby who grew up loving the Eskimos, it's a dream come true, and I've also had the chance to host and work with the Oilers, which is crazy. Also with hosting the morning show on CISN, I have an hour program every Sunday at 5pm on 630 CHED called the "Scheetz Show" and will be launching a Podcast called "Chris Scheetz celebrity Pawdast" where I talk to celebrities about their dogs and I'm super pumped about it.

I don't think there is a day on the radio when I don't work Thorsby into the conversation. In fact many assume I still live there on the farm. It's a little too far out considering how many times I have to go into the city every day, but maybe when I retire at some point in the future, we will call Thorsby home again, though I feel like I've never left. People ask if I will ever write a book about everything I've had a chance to see and be a part of, and to be honest, if I ever thought it would have worked out like this, I would have taken some notes along the way. To be with your Jr. High School Sweetheart with 2 healthy adult children, working at your favorite childhood radio station for 30 years, working with your favorite childhood sports teams and just getting a chance to make a difference...all of it started on a farm in Thorsby and I give Thorsby all of the credit. As Paul Brandt would say "Small Towns and Big Dreams".


