



Looking for a Volunteer Opportunity this Fall- consider the Big Buddy Mentoring **Program** – For the past several years Breton FCSS together with Breton Elementary and the Family Wellness Worker have offered a mentorship program called Big Buddies. The program has been very effective. Big Buddies involves partnering students with a mentor from the community. The program is 100% dependent on volunteer mentors from the community. Big Buddies is a volunteer adult mentoring program funded by FCSS that occurs at the Breton Elementary School (BES). Adults are matched with students who would prosper from positive interactions. The Big Buddy commits 1 – 2 hours of their time a month to come to the school, typically at lunch time, to do an activity with the student. All adults engaged in the Big Buddy program must have a current criminal record and child welfare checks completed. All Big Buddies will be orientated, and assistance will be given by the Family Wellness Worker (FWW). Thorsby RCMP Investigate Two Break and Enters

Thorsby, Alberta - Thorsby RCMP are investigating two break and enters targeting ATM machines that occurred early Sunday morning

At approximately 4:30 a.m. on Sunday, October 6th, 2019, Thorsby RCMP were dispatched to an alarm at the Village Supermarket, 5101 50th Ave, Thorsby. A short time later, a resident reported that they had heard a loud noise and looked outside and saw that the Thorsby Esso gas station looked like someone had just broken in.

RCMP officers attended the gas station first. CCTV cameras show a silver F-350 with aluminum rims backed up the glass door of the business. A male wearing a black hoody then broke the glass and entered the store where he attached a sling to the ATM. The truck then drove forward, removing the ATM and causing significant damage in the process.

Investigators also discovered that the Village Supermarket had been broken into in a similar fashion and the thieves attempted to steal the ATM from that business as well but were unsuccessful.

Images from CCTV cameras are attached. It is believed that the F-350 may have broken a tail light during the crime and there is pre-existing damage noticeable on the drivers door. 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
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MI.A REPORT
