Currently the Thorsby Network of Trails (TNT) is located almost entirely on private land. The property owners along the creek graciously allowed the use of the trails. The trails were developed and constructed by dedicated, hard-working volunteers, who continue to manage the network. The Town of Thorsby appreciates the generosity of the landowners.

One of the current landowners has discussed the possibility of transferring part of this great recreational asset to the town. The property will be rezoned from agriculture to recreation. The subdivision process is a requirement to facilitate the transaction. Once the transfer occurs, only then will the trail network be protected for future generations. No residences can be built on land designated recreation use only. The Lions campground will have expansion and development room, including more protected public green space.

We, on council, will continue working with our residents to improve recreational green space so today's and future generations can enjoy the lifestyle offered in our community.

Community involvement and consultation will continue so every resident in town and the sur-

rounding area can have input to both Taylor Park on Hankin St. and TNT/Lions RV Park along Weed Creek.

JEANINE MCINTOSH

I was born and raised in Thorsby on an acreage just outside of town. Our house was always busy and full of laughter with my parents Marlene and Dwayne Brod as well as my two older brothers Chad and Ryan. We lived so close to Thorsby that it was only a 10 minute walk on gravel then another 10 min rollerblade on the pavement.

I had a great childhood and as far back as I can remember I loved to draw! it seems like I was always drawing something, that is when I wasn't involuntarily playing goalie against my brothers slap shots. I was about 6 years old when I would set up my stuffed animals to sketch them, then in high school drawing classmates (during class). In grade six I wrote a report on working for Disney when I grew up. I was obsessed with being an artist. Thorsby High didn't offer an art program so in grade 10 I began taking art at Leduc Comp, their program was amazing and built my confidence with paints and colors as well as introducing me to new techniques. My mom would drive me into Leduc to do window paintings for car dealerships and store fronts. It was great to get paid to do something I loved. I was also featured on "The Breakfast Show" to do a window painting on live tv...no pressure.

My parents were always very supportive of my art, even allowing me to do a "lion king" mural in my room. I remember mom asking me in grade 11 what I wanted to do for when I was done school? I instantly replied "be an artist!". She paused and then asked "what's your second choice?"but there was no second choice and immediately af-

ter graduating high school in 1999 I headed to the big city and attended collage at ACAD in Calgary. My first year was a huge eye opener, I loved being surrounded with like minded people and so much creativity. I had no idea how school would end for me or what I would major in, it seemed like I had endless options to pursue but just like that in my first semester life got heavy. My eldest brother Chad who had been struggling with an illness for many years had gone into the hospital with a bleak prognosis. I packed up and moved back home, I will never regret the following months I got to spend with Chad before he passed in May 2000.

During my time back home I received some amazing opportunities thanks to John Elson with the Lions Club, I worked with them on several murals in Thorsby depicting its history on several buildings. Some which still can be seen in the community. I tried another run at ACAD that fall, driving back and forth almost every weekend. In my first semester (second time around) During class I was asked by my professor what I had done during fall break. I showed him photos of a mural I had just completed, he seemed impressed. When I told him I was actually paid he encouraged me to drop schooling and pursue murals full time. Returning home once again Thorsby gave me a great opportunity. Mr. Bratland, the principal of Thorsby High School, asked me to paint the school mascot in the gym. This had a domino effect as I have now painted in almost every school in the Black Gold School District.

I moved to Leduc with my boyfriend and opened a shop and gallery on main street called J.A.D.E custom art. I did countless murals, portraits and paintings. Everything was going great! Thats exactly when life gave me a pleasant surprise. We welcomed my beautiful daughter Brooke Taylor on March 25th (sharing a birthday with my sweet grandma, Irene Lawrence). I moved my business to a home based business and was married the following year. I continued to do murals in the greater Edmonton area including Thorsby, Calmar, Millet, Devon, Stony Plain, Leduc, Edmonton and Calgary. In 2005 I did my largest mural to date (approx. 7000 sqft) in CareFree Rv Edmonton, this gave me a chance to work with my talented grandmother, Ivy Brod. I have always looked up to her as an artist,

her wisdom on life and painting I forever treasure. Shortly after completing that mural my son Linken Ray was born on my grandpa Raymond Brods birthday June 16th.

In 2010 the Leduc Rec Centre approached me to do a mosaic mural, 300 individual square paintings that made up one large image. The mural called "Generations" is close to my heart having my daughter and grandmother work with me to create the squares.

After 14 years in Leduc we moved to Spruce Grove, this fresh start in life has had its ups and downs. My daughter is an equestrian and my son takes after my creativity. I've remarried so my blended family has grown with 3 new sons, Art is still my life and every time the phone rings for a job I'm amazed that I could be so fortunate. Just last year I was honoured when another former Thorsby student, Chris Scheetz asked me to do a mural at the Ronald McDonald House in Edmonton. This was tribute to his father, Roland Scheetz and the book he had published. I was happy to add color to the house of this caring organization. I have also had the pleasure to complete a painting for the Humboldt Broncos. It was an emotional painting from the heart and I really didn't know how it would be received but with a generous donation of prints its now in the homes of all the families and those affected by the tragedy. I'm currently working on murals for the Stony Plain hospital and other commissioned artwork, I also have many custom pieces going all around the world thanks to instagram. In the near future I would like to have an exhibit to display some of my personal paintings that I've done over the years.

Growing up in a small town gave me opportunities I most certainly would never have received in a big city. I'm not just talking about the chance to play basketball in high school when I could barely dribble the ball but the support Thorsby and its residents has always been amazing. I have been given chances to prove myself as an artist over and over again, from the early years with teachers to the mayor and local businesses. Every time I visit Thorsby without a doubt I will run into someone I know and catch up. It is such a great community and I'm so proud to have called it home.
