

## The traffic safety focus for the month of November is Occupant Restraints.

It's important to buckle up every time you drive. No matter how short the trip a seat beat and child safety seat protects you and your family if involved in a collision.

Occupant restraints facts:

From 2012 to 2016, there were 341 unbelted fatalities in Alberta.

Nearly a quarter of those fatalities were 18- to 24year old men.

Properly used seat belts can reduce fatal and serious injury by 45-65 per cent depending on the type of vehicle and seating position.

A 2017 Driver Attitude Survey indicated 69 per cent of Albertans agree all children 5-9 years of age should be in an approved child restraint. 95 per cent of Albertans agree when driving or riding in a motor vehicle, one should always wear a seatbelt.

Without a booster seat, a child is three and a half times more likely to suffer a significant injury.

Overall, 97.4 per cent of Albertans are using occupant restraints, combining urban and rural areas, according to CCMTA

During 2016, 53 people died and 375 people sustained injuries as a result of not being properly restrained at the time of the collision. Restraint users had a much lower injury rate (6.8 per cent) than those not using restraints (24.1 per cent) in collisions. Occupants using a restraint reduce the likelihood of sustaining an injury and the severity of injury decreases (2016).
