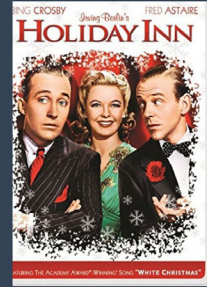

3 reasons why chasing big returns is a losing race

Over time, stock markets may be more predictable than you think. A long-term strategy can be more effective than trying to time the markets and chasing big, one-time returns.

3 reasons to avoid market timing:

1. Long-term investors benefit from not jumping in and out of the market.

2. Over the short term, it's anybody's guess

The stock market gives little or no warning when it tumbles. Individual stocks can take a dive based on economic events or bad press. Geographic sectors can drop based on speculation about political events. While these things can't be timed with any accuracy, a good financial plan, that is based on your time horizon and matched to your risk tolerance, provides a balanced approach to investing and can help you ride out the turbulence with confidence.

3. Timing requires selling

Timing the market means buying low and selling high. Investments have to be sold in order to realize any gains. When you sell, your money will be out of the market, sitting on the sidelines. During the time you are not invested, you could miss out on returns that could have been predicted by simply staying invested.

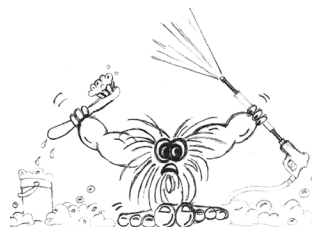


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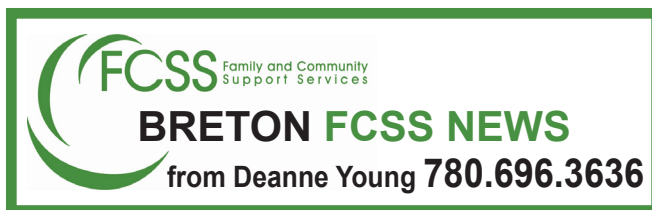
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November is Family Violence Prevention Month – For the next few weeks we will be featuring information on various topics around Family Violence Prevention.

November is Family Violence Prevention Month. Each week we will feature an article around Family Violence to bring awareness during the month.

Are you in a home where people abuse alcohol or other drugs and are violent?

Here are four things you should know.

1. Your environment is dangerous to you and everyone there. Canadian research tells us that: · People whose partner was a heavy drinker (defined as someone who consumes five or more drinks on five or more occasions in a month) were six times more likely to experience spousal violence than those whose partner never drank more than five drinks. · People who are violent towards their spouses and/or children and who abuse alcohol or other drugs cause more serious injuries. · Nearly two-thirds (62 per cent) of Canadians accused of murdering their spouses had consumed alcohol and/or other drugs at the time. These statistics do not reflect the emotional injury caused by living in an environment of substance abuse and violence.

2. Children are harmed – even if they are not in the room when substance abuse and violence occur. Children who live in homes where there is violence and substance abuse have more learning and behavioural problems at school, more self-esteem issues and more physical and mental health problems than children who live in substance-free non-violent homes. As adults, children who have lived with substance abuse and violence are more likely to have substance abuse problems and be involved in abusive situations.

3. We are each responsible for our words and actions. Substance use does not cause violence and it does not excuse violent actions. Even drunk or stoned, people make a choice to be violent. Substance use does not make the pain or guilt of violence go away. Getting drunk or high might blot out the pain for a while but it will not make the situation better and, in fact, it will likely create

more problems. Drunk or sober; high or clean; angry, scared, upset or happy – each of us has the power to choose our words, actions and reactions.

4. There is hope. The cycle can be changed. Help is available. Changing an addiction or an established pattern of behaviour can be challenging, but there are people who understand, who care, and who can help you. If you need help in understanding and changing abusive behaviours or substance abuse, make the call to restore safety and well-being to your life and loved ones.

Family violence and substance use: What's the connection? Substance use and family violence may not cause one another, but they can go hand in hand. When people are under the influence of alcohol or other drugs, their inhibitions are lowered and they can become abusive to their partner or other family members. Though they may blame their actions on the alcohol or other drugs, people choose substance use and they choose to abuse others. Substance use does not cause abuse. When people are subjected to violence, they sometimes use alcohol or other drugs to deal with the pain. However, the violence does not cause substance use. When substance use and violence are both present, the risk of injury or death to one or more people is greatly increased

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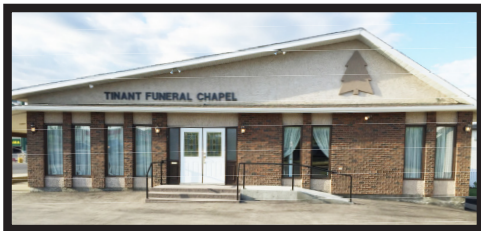
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A Cold Car or No Car?

The RCMP would like to remind the public not to leave vehicles running to warm up with the keys inside.

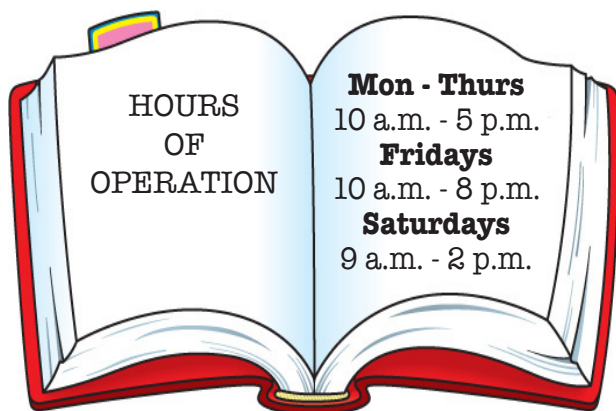

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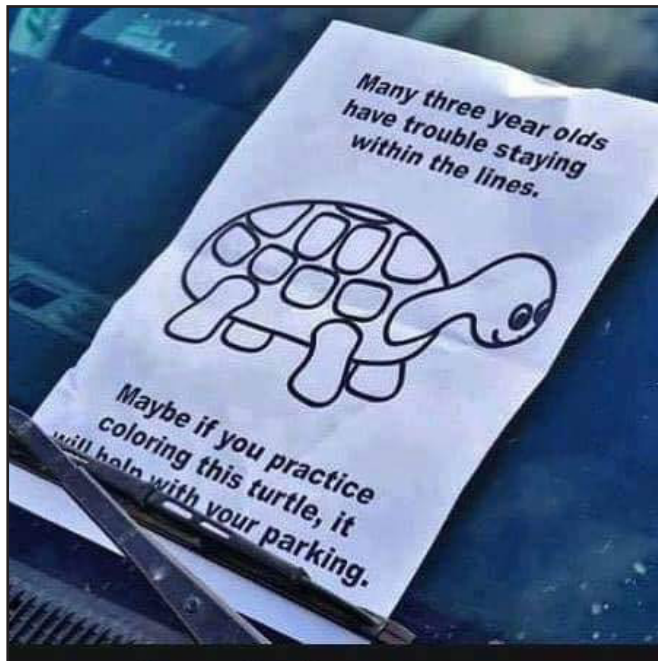
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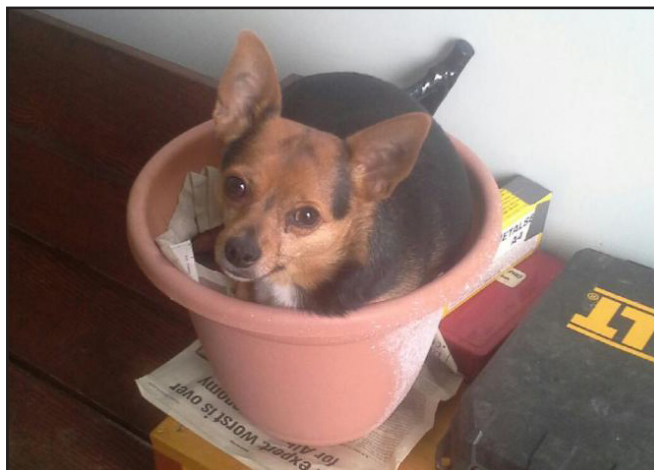
