LETTER TO THE EDITOR

I would like to begin my letter on a positive note: I feel that a Youth Appreciation is a wonderful concept. Unfortunately that is where my positivity will end. I personally believe it was extremely disrespectful of Patti Skarpinsky (FCSS Coordinator) to host it during the school day, not only did she take the youth from their education, but she also excluded the grade seven and eight students from participating. Not to mention holding it during the day made it difficult for other supporters who may have wanted to contribute to or otherwise appreciate the youth in our community from participating. I am aware that when the event was first considered, it was planned to be a collaboration between FCSS Youth Appreciation and the High School's College/University Fair, but the timing change as well as the lack of invitation to the entire school made this collaboration fall through, because the principal was unwilling to leave students behind. Students were allowed to go to the event without penalization, but because they were missing classes, some decided to stay at the school. So for community members who have been misled as to why Thorsby High School had a low attendance at Youth Appreciation, please remember there are always two sides to a story.

I would also like to say Thank You to the principal at the high school, Jon Ganton, as well as his staff. As a community, we should thank Jon Ganton for all that he has accomplished at the Thorsby Junior/Senior High School. He knows every student by name and takes time out of his day every morning to greet each student as they come into the school, as well as doing the crosswalk with the Elementary Principal, Mrs. Jubinville after school. Within the last three years as principal, Jon has made leaps and bounds, our children are held accountable for their actions and the school has been able to offer a multitude of dual credit courses to senior high students. Our high school has improved from 75.6% to an 85.3% grade twelve completion rate. PAT marks have also improved from a 63.9% average to an 80.3% average. Perhaps the school's greatest accomplishment is the rise in the Safe and Caring School level from 80% to 90%, which is above the provincial average!

I hope that in future years our youth can be appreciated at an appropriate time without any negative remarks to the staff at the school.

COUNCIL REPORT From Mayor Rod Raymond

At the last town open house, organized by Councilor Foster, it was decided a monthly report to the residents from council will be provided. At the first of every month, a member of council will write a report. It will be sent to the Target, added to our webpage, put in with the water bills and possibly sent to the Leduc Rep. These articles will highlight the activities of council, issues that need discussion and items we wish to get resident feedback on.

We have hired a new part time Bylaw Officer, Mitch Newton He is very professional at enforcing bylaws, which are in place to ensure public safety, protection of property rights and quality of life.

Our, made in Thorsby, Economic Development Committee, regularly meet to define options for growth. A few things have become evident. As a municipality, we are uncompetitive, reducing our ability to attract larger corporations. It has become abundantly clear we need to do more for our existing business's. In the new year, I will personally organize a meeting with town business leaders to define issues and explore possible avenues for improvement.

On a positive note, Thorsby has a strong core of volunteers who work every day for the betterment of the community. These groups include the Seniors, Legion, Minor Sports, Communities in Bloom, Historical Society, Lions, Cadets, PTA, 4H, Thorsby Ag Society, Chamber of Commerce, FCSS, Library, Fish and Game. If I forgot to mention a group: I apologize.

The community spirt is evident from the attendance of the September fundraiser for the new public park on Hankin Street. Kudo's to Carol and the Spirit of Thorsby Committee made up of local business people and residents. We are also in the process of finalizing the second recreation area, behind Madison. This parcel of land will allow the connection of town to the trail system. It will give the Lion's campground the required room for expansion and put in place a proper RV dump station. We will require public consultation for both Taylor Park and the new un-named park, this year. Some consideration already presented include: a BMX track for the kids, an off-leash dog park and a natural vegetation area. These properties, although managed/controlled by the town, belong to you, the residents, so public input is welcomed. They both need proper development to reflect well on both areas of the town: Hankin Street and Trail/campground area. We need to keep in mind what we do with these areas will be for the long-term benefit of residents.

Our Christmas in the Village event, coming this Friday, shows the awesome character of our community. Organized by the volunteer members of the Thorsby Chamber of Commerce. The event is funded entirely by donations from town business and Leduc County. The event has been very popular for many years. This year, the former Home Hardware building will host local vendors, crafters, makers and pie bakers, offering assorted gift ideas.

Council has identified ways Thorsby can grow. The advantage we have is lifestyle and quality of life. It was what attracted me to move my business and family members here. It came down to the affordability of real estate, K to 12 schools, RCMP detachment, recreation and proximity to the airport. One of my sons lives on the southside of Edmonton. His lot is so small that he can touch his neighbor's house. His pickup truck does not fit in his garage. There is virtually no room to park on the street. He paid \$100,000 more for a similar size/style house in Edmonton, compared to here in Thorsby. He pays more in property taxes than I do for my double lot and oversize lot/garage. His taxes are going up again this year. If he gets his street plowed, they windrow the snow/ice onto his sidewalk (he got plowed only once last year) The worst part is he doesn't know or talk to his neighbors! My 8-year-old granddaughter walks 10 blocks to school. She plays hockey in Edmonton and some of her practices are at 6:30 AM on a Saturday morning! Such a contrast in city to small town living

On a side note, we as council continue to work with staff to find efficiencies in both capital projects and operations. We have very good town staff, which allows us to explore options for improvement and reducing costs. Hopefully this will allow us to continue with zero tax increases, as we have in the past. A zero tax increase is actually a tax reduction, due to inflation. We are facing some increased cost for police funding, to which we will keep everyone informed. We want to start a voluntary recycling program as well. The existing recycling program is ineffective with most items taken to the landfill at greater cost. We hope to hear from residents for ideas to move forward.

BRIAN STERN

Growing up on a farm, in my mind, is the best place to grow up. My parents are great examples of dedication to family, faith and the importance of hard work. There was always something to do which kept my four brothers and I busy.

My memories of going to school all seemed to begin with standing by the back window of our house staring through the large spruce trees looking for Mr. Besler's bus. His bus coming down the hill signaled it was time for us to go to the end of our driveway to catch the bus to Thorsby.

I attended all the schools in Thorsby and have many fond memories of being there. It was there that I had the chance to sing which I enjoyed very much. Mrs. Hamilton and Mrs. Knopp stand out as the two teachers who taught me many wonderful songs. I appreciated the opportunity to sing in the many performances and Christmas concerts. I believed that Mrs. Knopp is one of the reasons singing became an important part in my future.

I appreciated all the help the Jr/Sr High teachers did to prepare me for my continuing education. Whether it was Mr. Elson's great social classes, Mr. Kobeluck's biology, Mr. Evan's Shakespeare, Mr. Pichonsky's shop class or Mr. Cunningham's P.E., they all helped me to

discover the path I would take later in my life.

A special thank you to Sam Kobeluck for bringing bantam football to our community and giving me and many other boys a chance to play football. Go Bearcats!

I left Thorsby for the University of Alberta to begin a bachelor's degree in Science. I soon discovered that although I have a great interest in all areas of science, I did not enjoy being in the science faculty, especially the three hour labs in the afternoon and so I left after a year.

I felt a calling to go to Camrose and attend the Canadian Lutheran Bible Institute. I was there for two years and received a Certificate of Biblical Studies. I joined their choir and toured western Canada. It was during those two years that I had the opportunity, during the summer, to lead a team of six students across Western Canada teaching Vacation Bible School at a number of different Lutheran Camps. It was a great experience practicing the leadership skills I learned during my time at CLBI.

While I was attending CLBI I took the Emergency Medical Technician-Ambulance program through a NAIT satellite classroom program. I completed the program with the expectation to work as an EMT-A as I furthered my education but jobs were few and I found going to school a full-time job all by itself.

The years at CLBI helped me realize that I wanted to become a teacher. I enrolled the following year at Camrose Lutheran College (now known as University of Alberta- Augustana campus) in their Education program.

While attending CLC I joined their choir and received a bursary to take singing lessons, otherwise know as voice training. I took lessons for six months and realized that I wanted to continue studying voice.

As a culmination to my two years at CLC in 1984, the CLC choir toured West and East Germany for two weeks. It was an eye opening experience to travel through free West Germany and then to travel into the Communist controlled East Germany. The freedoms, ample stopping and colorful architecture of West Germany were a stark contrast to the high fences, machine gun nests, food shortages and dreary buildings of East Germany.

The program at CLC lasted for two years and at which time students were expected to transfer to a university for their final two years and I chose the University of Alberta in Edmonton. Two years later I left the U of A with my Bachelor Degree in Secondary Education.

I spent the next year, 1986-87, teaching one semester in New Norway and one in Bashaw. After finishing this year I decided that I wanted to pursue a degree in drama so I went back to Augustana to get a Bachelor of Arts-Drama degree.

I studied and performed for the next two years all the while driving to Edmonton once a week to continue my voice training. I enjoyed the time I spent Augustana, working with the variety of instructors and students. The theatre arts program had a small enrollment, less than ten, and at the end of two years graduated from Augustana University College with my B.A. Drama degree in 1989.

I had the opportunity to audition for a part in the Edmonton Lyrical Operatic Performance Ensemble's, "Rosemarie". I won the part of the comic lead role and we performed the musical at Fort Edmonton during the month of August. I enjoyed being on stage and more importantly getting to know Elsie Hepburn, our conductor and voice coach. It was during this time that Elsie agreed to become my voice teacher, which began a seven year period of weekly vocal training.

I applied for a job and was hired on to the high school department at Concordia College in Edmonton. Part of my job description included directing one play each year for the college, which I enjoyed very much. I look back at those plays as a very rewarding experience.

I had the opportunity, after two years at Concordia, to go back to New Norway to teach a number of different grades and courses for one year while the school shared their French teacher with another school. The idea did not work out for the teacher nor for the school and at the end of the year I was out of a job. It was then that I questioned whether teaching senior high was what I was meant to do. A good friend of mine who was an elementary teacher always said, "You are an elementary teacher that hasn't realized it yet."

I spent the next ten years working on my parent's dairy farm along with my brother, Lorne and doing some substitute teaching on the side. You can take the boy off the farm but you can't take the farm out of the boy.

Elsie challenged me during this time to expand my vocal training by auditioning for the Edmonton Opera. To make a long story short I was asked to join the Opera Chorus and performed in 26 different operas and musical performances. The Opera Chorus is a group of singers who provide the voices for the large musical numbers of most operas. Rehearsing for 4-6 weeks in the evenings, usually singing in a foreign language; costumes, wigs, and make-up done for me, performing on the Jubilee Auditorium stage and accompanied by the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra...I had the time of my life.

During this time I had the opportunity to join the teaching staff at Thorsby Elementary School teaching grade five and six. I was blessed to work with a wonderful, dedicated staff and many, many terrific children. This past June I decided to retire from teaching with very fond memories of my 18.5 years at TES.

Six years ago I married the love of my life, Erna for which I am truly blessed. Two years after that our lives were made complete with the birth of our granddaughter, Olivia. I love the path my life has taken and I thank God and all my family, relatives, friends and acquaintances who helped me along the way.

Leduc County Council Approves Interim 2020 Budget From Leduc County

This afternoon, Leduc County council approved the 2020 interim municipal budget, which represents a zero per cent tax dollar budget increase over the 2019 final budget. The decision followed four days of public deliberations. This interim budget demonstrates Leduc County's continued commitment to efficient, cost effective operations. The proposed zero per cent tax dollar budget increase allows us to maintain the high-quality services that our ratepayers deserve, while being mindful of the economic realities facing our residents and business communities.

The interim operating and capital budgets are set at \$85 million and \$14 million, respectively. The interim operating budget includes \$25.5 million in provincial requisitions, collected on behalf of the Government of Alberta and the Leduc Regional Housing Foundation.

The approved interim budget allows important projects to proceed or continue before council approves the final budget in the spring. Council will approve the final budget and set tax rates in April. Once tax rates are set, tax notices will be mailed out to all ratepayers.

2020 interim budget highlights

\$14.9 million for road projects and maintenance

\$1.6 million for bridge projects

\$2.2 million in cost-share recreation support to six partner municipalities

\$1.7 million for capital and operating support \$500,000 to the Beaumont Sport and Recreation Centre expansion (\$2.4 million over five years)

\$266,500 for support to not-for-profit facilities and community recreation and cultural grants \$148,000 for support to six libraries

\$2.6 million for protective services initiatives
