One morning in 1888 Alfred Nobel, inventor of dynamite, awoke to read his own obituary. The obituary was printed as a result of a simple journalistic error. You see, it was Alfred's brother that had died and the reporter carelessly reported the death of the wrong brother. Any man would be disturbed under the circumstances. but to Alfred the shock was overwhelming because he saw himself as the world saw him. The "Dynamite King," the great industrialist who had made an immense fortune from explosives. This, as far as the general public was concerned, was the entire purpose of Alfred's life. None of his true intentions to break down the barriers that separated men and ideas for peace were recognized or given serious consideration. He was simply a merchant of death. And for that alone he would be remembered. As he read the obituary with horror, he resolved to make clear to the world the true meaning and purpose of his life. This could be done through the final dispersal of his fortune. His last will and testament--an endowment of five annual prizes for outstanding contributions in physics, chemistry, physiology or medicine, literature, and peace (the sixth category of economics was added later.) This would now be the expression of his life's ideals and ultimately why we would remember him today. The result was the most valuable of prizes given to those who had done the most for the cause of world peace. Today it is called, the "Nobel Peace Prize."

It is easy for us to get caught up in seeking the things of this world that simply will not last. When we look back over our lives we wonder what was it all for? Jesus says, "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures here on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal. But lay up for yourselves treasure in heaven where nothing can steal or destroy. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also!" Matt. 6:19-21

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

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
