
The Origins of Black History Month

The origins of Black History Month began in the United States on February 19, 1926 as the vision of Carter G. Woodson. Mr. Woodson was born to parents who had been slaves. He eventually became a high school teacher and was sad to discover that none of the schools taught black history as part of the curriculum in the United States. Until 1976 one week in February was devoted to Black History celebrations. In 1976 the entire month of February was designated as Black History Month in the United States. In Canada, it wasn't until 1995 that the Parliament of Canada officially recognized February as Black History Month.

Shortly after the turn of the 20th century approximately 1000-1500 African Americans from Oklahoma and other neighboring States turned northward towards Western Canada seeking refuge from racial prejudice and segregation. Not only did they have to contend with the harsh winters and isolation common to all pioneers of the time, they faced many racial prejudices which they hoped to leave behind. Four rural communities were established in Alberta: Amber Valley, Junkins (Wildwood), Campsie (near Barrhead) and Keystone. The Keystone area was renamed Breton with the coming of the Lacombe & North-Western Railway in 1926.







Several years ago, in the fall of the year, Linda, a young woman, was traveling alone up the rutted and rugged highway from Alberta to the Yukon. Linda didn't know you don't travel to Whitehorse alone in a rundown Honda Civic, so she set off where only four-wheel drives normally venture. The first evening she found a room in the mountains near a summit and asked for a 5 A.M. wakeup call so she could get an early start. She couldn't understand why the clerk looked surprised at that request, but as she awoke to early- morning fog shrouding the mountain tops, she understood. Not wanting to look foolish, she got up and went to breakfast. Two truckers invited Linda to join them, and since the place was so small, she felt obliged. "Where are you headed?" one of the truckers asked. 'Whitehorse'

"In that little Civic? No way! This pass is dangerous in weather like this." "Well, I'm determined to try," was Linda's gutsy, if not very informed, response. "Then I guess we're just going to have to hug you." the trucker suggested. Linda drew back. "There's no way I'm going to let you touch me!"

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Backgrounder

What is the Leduc Beaumont Devon Primary Care Network?

The Leduc Beaumont Devon Primary Care Network (LBD PCN) provides services for patients in the cities of Leduc and Beaumont, town of Devon and all communities in Leduc County. A group of 56 family physicians in 13 clinics along with additional healthcare professionals (nurses, dietitians, an exercise specialist, behavioural health consultants and mental health clinicians) work together to improve primary care for our patients. The LBD PCN offers support to our patients through the following services:

- Health promotion and disease prevention
- Diabetes management
- Weight management
- Nutrition concerns
- Exercise and activity support
- Mental health support

- Tobacco reduction and cessation
- Health education classes and workshops
- Senior care
- Specialty clinics
- Referral coordination
- After-hours clinics in Leduc and Beaumont

Primary Care Networks (PCNs) use a collaborative team approach to provide care for patients and to coordinate primary health care services provided by family physicians, Alberta Health Services and other health care professionals.

PCNs are a way to provide team support for family doctors by bringing teams of health professionals together; doctors, nurses, dietitians, social workers, mental health professionals, pharmacists, occupational and respiratory therapists and others. PCNs also manage 24-hour patient access to appropriate primary care services.

What are Primary Care Networks?

PCNs are a made-in-Alberta approach to improving access to and better coordination of care for patients across the province. In a PCN, a group of family doctors working with a multidisciplinary team and Alberta Health Services coordinate health services for patients. A PCN is not necessarily a bricks and mortar building – it is a network of doctors and other health providers such as nurses, dietitians, mental health professionals, therapists, pharmacists and others working together to provide primary health care to patients.

A PCN can be comprised of one clinic with many physicians and support staff, or several doctors in several clinics in a geographic area. Each network has the flexibility to develop programs and to provide services in a way that works locally to meet the specific needs of patients. This is done within the provincial Primary Care Initiative framework. The flexibility to develop local solutions to local health issues makes each PCN unique and encourages the PCN team to focus on the needs of the local patient population.

There are 41 PCNs operating throughout Alberta with more than 3800 family physicians and 1400 healthcare professionals are working in PCNs. Approximately 85% of Albertans receive care through a Primary Care Network.



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






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
