Successful Black History Performance Held February 23 From Allan Goddard

This year marks the 25th anniversary for the museum to celebrate Black History Month to pay tribute to the early African American families who settled the area and founded the community of Keystone. The early events were small open houses held at the museum, but over the years the event has grown, and ten years ago the museum was fortunate to be able to partner with the Faith Covenant Church to use their facility to hold our event.

This year the seven piece Edmonton based group called, the "Shiloh Centre for Multicultural Roots Collective" (SCMRC) impressed the audience as they took them on a musical journey through time and different musical genres, of Plantation songs, call and answer songs from the time of slavery, and how these early songs were the foundation of Gospel music the Blues, Jazz to the modern times of Hip Hop.

Allan Goddard, museum manager, opened the program welcoming the audience to the event,

thanking them for their support of the museum over the years, and to the successful partnership with the church. In conjunction with the event the museum conducted a food drive for the Breton Food Bank and numerous donation of food filled the baskets at the church.

The museum was pleased to have Mr. Mark Smith, MLA for Drayton Valley – Devon, attend the event and bring greetings from the Provincial Government. After the performance, coffee and desert was served by volunteers from the church, as many attending caught up on old friendships. Museum volunteers opened to the museum prior to the event and again after the performance, with numerous individuals and families viewing the displays at the museum.

The museum would like to thank all the volunteers from the church who helped prepare and serve the lunch, and the church for the use of their beautiful facility. It has made hosting the event so much easier. Finally to all who attended and for their donations to the Food Bank.

Community Volunteer Income Tax Program - FREE IN-COME TAX PREPERATION - For Low Income Persons, Families, seniors and students. We will begin taking information for tax season on March 1. Although this is something, that most of us would like to avoid thinking about and doing, I am afraid that this is unavoidable. You need to file your income tax each year, even if you have no income to report. By doing this you may receive benefits that you did not know you were eligible for. Also, in the event of the death of your spouse, benefits can easily be transferred to you, if you have filled a return for the last calendar year. If you did not file a tax return in 2019, you may not be receiving benefits from the government that you are eligible for. The focus of the Community Volunteer Tax Program is to assist those individuals who have limited income. This includes seniors, families and students. If your income was in one of the following categories you may qualify for assistance.

1 person	30,000
2 person family	37,000
3 person family	40,500
4 person family	43.500

We are not able to complete returns with income from the following sources:

Capital Gains or Losses, Farming Income, Rental Income, Self-Employment, Interest exceeding \$1,000, Bankruptcies, Deceased Persons

This service is FREE to those who qualify. If you require this service, please gather your information and bring it to the Village of Breton office Monday to Thursday between 8:30 – 4:00. Clients will be notified when your return is completed. The program will run from March 1 – April 30, 2020

We require the following information in order to complete your return:

Personal Information (Social Insurance Number, Birth date, Marital Status, Address)

Dependant's information – spouse/ children's names, birthdates.

All "T" Slips (T4's, T4A, OAS ect.)

All Forms, Schedules, and Labels you have received from Revenue Canada. Receipts for any expenses such as medical, moving, tuition, sporting activities. Printouts from your pharmacist are available for those with numerous prescriptions. Previous year's tax returns

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






Local Author To Visit Warburg Library
