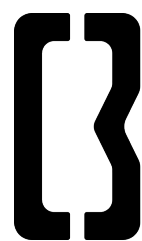

JASON PICHONSKY - Class of '88

Despite having now spent more time away from Thorsby than living in it I still fondly regard this town as home. A home that I visit to catch up with family and friends; a home that I bring my wife and kids to explore and share remembrances of my youth; and a home I've returned to many times since I first moved away from at the age of 18.

I grew up on a farm some ten miles from Thorsby when it was still considered a village. A village where my father, Harry, taught High School and my uncles, Steve and Walter, ran the local grocery store and the local gas station. My youth was spent exploring the woods in my 160-acre backyard, earning some cash to buy Famous Monster magazines at the drugstore by mowing my Baba and aunt Helen's lawn (she'd always have a lasagna waiting for when I was done) and riding around Thorsby on bikes with my sister and cousins. As for my high school years, some of my fondest memories were of spending summers at the Mulhurst golf course at Pigeon Lake. When it wasn't busy we'd sneak onto the second hole and play thru to the eighth hole, again sneaking off to avoid getting caught. To this day I cannot play more than seven holes of golf without losing interest.

It's also somewhat fitting that these formative high school years took place in the "Stranger Things" era of the mid-eighties. Much of the popular culture that the Netflix show celebrates also influenced my eventual career choices to become a visual storyteller. The goal then was to be like Spielberg, mak-

ing blockbuster films, but of course, life takes over.

I graduated in 1988 and promptly moved to the big city, eventually ending up at NAIT (the Northern Alberta Institute of Technology), in the Radio and Television Arts Program. I made some good friends and my experience there landed me a job as a videographer/editor at CHAT-TV, a local television station in Medicine Hat. I shot news stories, put them together in the edit suite as well as handling a number of other camera duties, from shooting commercials to operating cameras for live broadcasts. I spent 2 years there before I felt that it was time to move on. I packed my belongings and ended up back in Edmonton at the University of Alberta. Again I picked-up new lifelong friends and life-altering experiences. Through the University I travelled to the Gaspé region of Quebec as part of a French language exchange. I took on summer freelance work at Frame 30, a commercial production company where I was fortunate to train as a camera assistant in the film industry. I was able to shoot a number of short films in the province because of this experience. One of these films, a zombie film no less, was shot at the local High School.

In my late twenties and in search of new adventures I took a job in Toronto, Ontario that specialized in live production. Together with a friend from the U of A who had grown-up in Ontario, we packed a small Volkswagen Fox to the brim and made the journey in 3 days, sleeping in the car and taking turns driving. It wouldn't be my last cross country trip. I returned to editing and broadcast camera work. I spent a short 2 years there but with so many new experiences it felt like a huge chapter in my life. It's also where I would meet my future wife, Patricia, a guest coordinator then but now an accomplished High School teacher, a vocation she shared with my father.

Then around 2000 came my 7-year stint on a show called Road Scholars as director, editor and camera person. The show featured high school kids taking summer courses in other parts of the world; science in Kenya or drama in Ireland. While I spent most of the year in post-production, putting the shows together, I did get to shoot about a third of them and spent time in numerous locales; some of my favourite being, Ecuador and the Galapagos

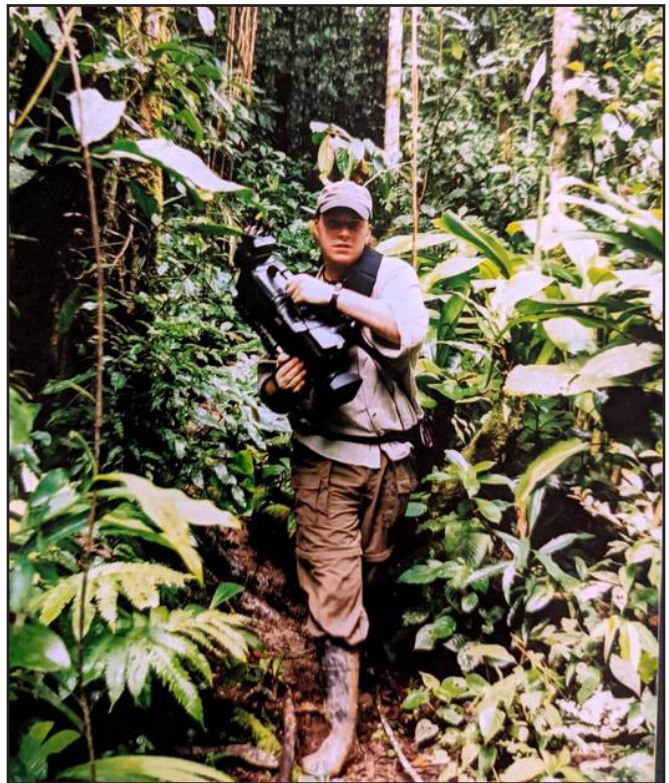
Islands, Thailand, Copenhagen, Botswana, and Iqaluit. During this time Patricia had gotten a summer gig at the Banff center as a den mother to the underage ballerinas in the dance program. As a result, she too would come to regard Thorsby as a second home. For most of those 7 years, we would spend a number of weeks each summer visiting my home in Thorsby. In 2007 Patricia and I would finally decide to get married and it wasn't long after that our first boy was born. We are blessed with three children, our oldest is 11, our only daughter is 9 and our youngest is 6.

After Road Scholars my career took many turns. I've spent most of my time editing animation, beginning with stop-motion (Glenn Martin D.D.S), then more traditional 2d animation like Johnny Test with some preschool in the mix, Blue's Clues and You. But there have been some side projects as well. I've written articles for magazines mostly focusing on genre and horror films, provided audio commentary tracks on a number of DVD and Bluray film releases, providing the occasional interview extra and short-form documentary as well. And just last year completed a restoration for an early Canadian genre film that starred Peter Falk (TV's Columbo) in his first leading role. It's called The Bloody Brood, check out the Blu-ray, I've included lots of extras on the disc.

We have of course returned to Thorsby a number of times to visit, but there were a few career returns as well. I returned to shoot a friend's short film, which we shot much of it near my old homestead. And when the feature film Freezer Burn chose to utilize Thorsby as it's a major location I was fortunate enough to get a gig documenting the making of. As the Tragically Hip once sang, "They shot a movie once, in my hometown."

Many of the faces I used to know in Thorsby have left and my father and his brothers are no longer with us but we still return to visit my mother on the farm and when I do I always say that I'm headed home.

Editor's Note: The film Freezer Burn was filmed mostly at the Thorsby Hotel, Arctic Spa's Rec Centre and the Community Hall. (I still have an autographed picture from the movie of leading man, Tom Green.) The movie also starred Crispin Glover and is full of Thorsby residents who were used as the extras!

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Alberta Health's Coverage for Seniors Program eligibility changes effective March 1, 2020

From Seniors and Housing Client Relations

Alberta Health is changing the eligibility criteria for the Coverage for Seniors program. Effective March 1, 2020, family members younger than 65 years of age—including spouses and dependants—will no longer be covered by Coverage for Seniors. Albertans 65 years of age and older will continue to be covered by the program.

Affected households received letters in January and February 2020 notifying them of the change and available coverage options. Below are some frequently asked questions that might be helpful if you are assisting seniors affected by this change.

When will the Coverage for Seniors change come into effect?

The change in coverage for seniors' family members under 65 will take effect on March 1, 2020. This means a non-senior spouse/partner and dependants will continue to have coverage until February 29, 2020.

I am a senior and my spouse/partner is also a senior. Does the change mean only one of us can be covered under the Coverage for Seniors plan?

If a senior and spouse/partner are both 65 or older, they are both eligible for the Coverage for Seniors plan.

Please note, however, that a spouse/partner may have been enrolled in Coverage for Seniors, prior to turning 65, as part of a senior household. As eligibility for Coverage for Seniors will be based on age effective March 1, 2020, both seniors must have provided proof

of age to maintain their coverage after February 29, 2020.

Seniors who have not yet provided proof of age will need to respond to the letter they received asking them to provide their documents as soon as possible. Visit <https://www.alberta.ca/seniors-health-benefits.aspx> for more information on how to provide proof of age.

What options are there for family members under 65 who will lose their coverage under the Coverage for Seniors plan on March 1, 2020?

These family members may want to consider options such as an employer-sponsored plan or other private coverage. Alternatively, the Government of Alberta has drug and health benefit programs available to ensure that all Albertans have access to economical health benefits. For more information about these benefits, please visit the Alberta Health website at <https://www.alberta.ca/drug-coverage-health-benefits.aspx>.

One of the government-sponsored options is the Non-Group Coverage program, administered by Alberta Blue Cross. The Non-Group Coverage program has the identical drug formulary as the Coverage for Seniors plan, and does not preclude patients with pre-existing conditions. Any Albertan who is no longer covered as a result of changes to the Coverage for Seniors Plan will be eligible for coverage under the Non-Group Program. The Non-Group Coverage program requires its members to pay monthly premiums and copayments on prescriptions.

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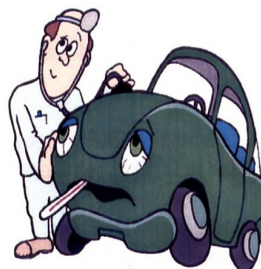

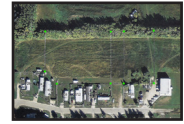

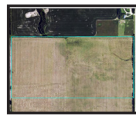
