#### New Program Announcement From Healthy Communities Coalition

In early 2018 the Drayton Valley Primary Care Network identified that there were challenges in accessing appropriate mental health services for youth and young adults. Appropriate mental health services includes promotion of good mental health and resiliency, prevention of mental illness and its progression as well as treatment of the full spectrum of mental illness.

In August 2018 the Healthy Communities Coalition, a not-for-profit organization that supports the people of Drayton Valley and Brazeau County, responded to the recommendations proposed by the DV PCN. An action plan was created through consultation and partnership with community organizations and service providers. HCC also received data from over 500 youth through the RYSE project, which stated that youth and young adults were asking for better access to mental health support.

In May of 2019 the HCC was successful in obtaining a grant to develop a community-based integrated service delivery hub for youth through PolicyWise for Children & Families.

The hub supports individuals between the ages of 11 and 24 within Brazeau County. The hub focuses on the encouragement of healthy relationships between individuals, families and communities. The hub also supports awareness around living well with addictions and/or mental illness, reducing stigma and barriers to accessing support for addictions and men-

tal health, encourages resiliency and provides positive opportunities for all youth.

The hub is happy to announce the hiring of two staff members known as the Brazeau Empowerment Support Team (B.E.S.T.). The role of our staff includes developing healthy relationships with youth and their support network to assist in the navigation and access to the services best suited to need. Our staff will be developing and supporting programs that include all youth and providing guidance to those who require more specialized support. Some of these programs may include life skill supports, job preparedness, financial literacy, healthy relationship development etc.... Our staff will also be supporting the RYSE project in youth and family relationship development and data collection.





#### **2020 No Spray Program**

Brazeau County property owners who do not wish to have roadside spraying performed adjacent to their property must enter into a No Spray agreement. In the agreement, the landowner consents to maintain the adjacent municipal right of way themselves, for the purpose of weed and brush control without herbicides, in compliance with the Alberta Weed Control Act. For highway right of ways, the landowners must contact Alberta Transportation if they do not want herbicides applied to the area adjacent to their property.

To enter into a No Spray agreement with the County, please fill out an application form by visiting the Brazeau County office or visiting www.brazeau.ab.ca. Agreements must be renewed annually.

Deadline to apply for the program is May 1st, 2020. No late agreements will be accepted.

#### **Roadside Vegetation Control Program**

Brazeau County Agricultural Services Division will be carrying out roadside spraying of prohibited noxious, noxious weeds and woody vegetation (brush) throughout the County from May to October. For public safety, a buffer zone will be maintained between these roadside spray areas and county residences/yard sites.

As per our Vegetation Management policy, spraying on roadsides is done under the authority of Alberta's *Weed Control Act*. Brazeau County is required to control the weeds in the roadside just like any other landowner is on privately owned land. As well, in the public interest of safety, brush control is performed to increase the sightlines on roadways and intersections. As a result, costs of maintaining these open roadways are reduced where brush and trees are managed properly as it makes snow removal easier and allows roads to dry out quicker after precipitation falls.

The following programs related to herbicide use are available to residents:

- Fence-line Program (County staff will treat area up to 5 meters inside a fence line at no cost)
- Hawkweed Program (County staff will treat up to 5 acres infested with Hawkweed on private land at no cost)
- Herbicide Rebate Program (the County will reimburse landowners 60% of the cost of herbicide used on the landowner's property)
- No Spray Agreement (the County will not use herbicides in the ditch adjacent to a landowner's property; responsibility for weed control is assumed by the landowner)



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Federal tax & income support measures to combat the effects of COVID-19 By: Mackenzie Investments Tax & Estate Planning Group Updated March 30, 2020

#### **Federal Measures**

On Wednesday March 25, 2020, legislation received Royal Assent to provide \$107B of economic support to combat the effects of COVID-19 pandemic. Included are several tax measures designed to support Canadian individuals and businesses during these unprecedented times. The tax relief will be in the form of both direct support payments (\$52B), as well as tax deferrals (\$55B). Here is a summary of the key tax measures and additional income support the government has introduced as of March 30, 2020. **Tax Measures for Individuals** 

- The minimum amounts from Registered Retirement Income Funds (RRIFs) will be reduced by 25% for 2020, recognizing that the volatile markets will have an impact on the retirement savings for seniors. Individuals who have already withdrawn more than the reduced 2020 minimum amount will not be permitted to re-contribute to their RRIFs an amount up to the 25% proposed reduction. However, withholding tax will only apply if more than the unreduced RRIF minimum amount is withdrawn for 2020. These measures also apply to LIFs and all other locked in RRIFs. In addition, similar rules will apply to individuals receiving variable benefit payments under a defined contribution Registered Pension Plan (RPP).
- The 2020 tax filing deadline (for filing 2019 T1 personal tax returns) has been deferred by one month, to June 1, 2020.
- Trusts with a December 31, 2019 tax year end will have a filing due date deferred to May 1, 2020.
- The deadline to pay any income tax balance arising from the 2019 tax filing has been extended from April 30, 2020, to September 1, 2020. No interest or penalties will be assessed if payment is made by September 1, 2020. This measure also applies to trusts with a tax balance or installment requirement prior to September 1, 2020.
- A special one-time payment through the Goods and Services Tax credit (GSTC) to be made by early May 2020. The payment will double the maximum annual GSTC payment amounts for the 2019-20 benefit year. This will boost income for eligible taxpayers by approximately \$400 for single individuals and approximately \$600 for couples. The GSTC is a tax-free benefit.
- The maximum annual Canada Child Benefit (CCB) payment amounts will be increased for the 2019-20 benefit year by \$300 per child. The benefit is expected to be paid in May 2020. The CCB is a tax-free benefit.

#### Businesses

- Businesses of any size (large and small) whose revenue has decreased by at least 30% because of the pandemic, as well as unin corporated employers, certain partnerships, non-profit organizations and charities, will be eligible for a temporary wage subsidy for 3 months, to help prevent layoffs by businesses with lower revenues. The subsidy is equal to 75% of remuneration paid up to the first \$58,700 earned. This equates to approximately \$847 per week and will be backdated to March 15, 2020.
- Similar to individuals, the CRA will allow businesses to defer, until September 1, 2020, the payment of any income tax amounts that become owing on or after March 18, 2020 and before September 2020. No interest or penalties will accrue during this time.
- The Business Credit Availability Program (BCAP) will work with Business Development Bank of Canada (BDC) and Export Development Canada (EDC) to provide small and medium-sized businesses more than \$1 OB of additional support.
- The government introduced the Canada Emergency Business Account. This funding will provide interest-free loans of up to \$40,000 to businesses with payrolls of less than \$1 million. A quarter of this loan (up to \$10,000) is eligible for complete forgiveness.

#### **Employment Insurance Benefits**

- Waiving the one-week waiting period for those individuals in imposed quarantine that claim Employment Insurance (EI) sickness benefits, effective March 15, 2020.
- Waiving the requirement to provide a medical certificate to access El sickness benefits.
- The government introduced the Canada Emergency Response Benefit (CERB). The CERB is a taxable benefit replacing the previously announced Emergency Care Benefit and Emergency Support Benefit. This is a \$2,000 per month benefit, payable for up for 4 months for workers who lose their job as a result of COVID-19. Specifically, this payment is designed for Canadians who:
- 1. have lost their job, are sick, quarantined or taking care of someone who is sick with COVID-19
- 2. working parents who must stay at home with children who are sick or at home because of school/daycare closure
- 3. wage earners, contract workers, self-employed individuals who would not otherwise qualify for Employment Insurance and;
- 4. workers who are still employed but not receiving income because their work is disrupted due to COVID-19.
- The benefit is available regardless whether the individual is eligible for EI or not. However, individuals who are already receiving EI benefits as of today would continue to receive the EI benefits and should not apply for CERB.
- Introduce the EI Work Sharing Program, providing EI benefits to workers who agree to reduce their normal working hours as a result of the developments beyond the control of their employer (this was previously announced on March 11, 2020).

All measures are expected to be implemented either immediately, in early April or May.

Adam Hamilton tells the story of leading a team of church volunteers down to Bay St. Louis to help gut houses after Katrina. They were assigned to a woman whose little brick house had become completely inundated with water.

There task was to gut a two-story garage. In the room above the garage were literally hundreds and hundreds of dolls this woman had collected. They carefully removed them all and the mold-covered interior of the room. When they finished, Hamilton talked with the owner who said they had stayed in their home during the storm because in all of their years the water had never reached them.

But the storm came and flood waters rose. They like so many receded into the attic, along with all her dolls, and there they waited the storm out. They could hear a tornado ripping and tearing as it traveled across the street from their house.

This grandmother said it was absolutely terrifying. Meanwhile, the house next door which belonged to her daughter had washed away. And then she said, "We were terrified but this one thing I knew: I belong to God. I did not know how this was going to work out but I knew my life was in His hands."
