LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Dear Editor:

From February 9-13, three County Council members attended the three-day "Globe" conference in Vancouver. My understanding is that two staff members also attended.

For some reason, only Councillor costs were provided. The total cost for the three Councillors was \$14,451.63. It can be assumed that the two staff costs would be about \$7,000 for a combined total of about \$21,500.

A number of questions arise from these numbers.

1. Why are staff costs not provided? Do we, the taxpayers, not bear their costs, and therefore, shouldn't those numbers be public as well?

2. Why does Mr. Guyon receive \$2105 honoraria, while K. Westerlund \$1613 and M. Gressler \$1792? Mr. Guyon as Reeve has no bearing on the conference, so shouldn't he receive the same honoraria as other Councillors?

3. The following costs were incurred for councillors only:

- Hotel costs were \$1311.32 each (3 nights)
- Mileage total was \$415.68 (why not carpool to the airport?)
- Meals were \$821.04; this seems like a lot considering that some meals are often provided (why not pay for their own meals out of their honoraria?)
- Flights were \$1348
- Registration Fee for 3 Councillors \$805 each (\$2415 total)

4. Policy "Council 5" requires a written report from attendees. These reports are important to ratepayers in order to determine who to vote for in upcoming elections as well as to evaluate the value of conferences. It seems Councillors don't make such evaluations.

5. Councillors often use the excuse that hold-

ing public meetings for voter input is too expensive. The nearly \$25,000 spent on this particular conference would pay for a pile of public meetings. Keep in mind that Councillors take \$1575 per month to deal with residents' concerns.

6. It should be noted that apparently no motion was made for the two staff to attend this conference. Policy "Council 5" does not provide for staff attendance at conferences. Therefore, is this expenditure improper and if so, shouldn't Councillors have to pay for staff expenses out of their own pockets?

Stay tuned shortly for an evaluation of the report submitted for this conference.








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MESSAGE TO MY CONSTITUENTS

Support has been announced for students and post-graduates. The Canada Emergency Student Benefit will provide \$1,250 per month for eligible students or \$2,000 per month for eligible students with dependents or disabilities and will be available from May to August 2020.

The government also announced the Student Service Grant. Under this program, students who choose to serve their communities during the COVID 19 pandemic will be provided with up to \$5,000 for their education in the fall.

New measures were also announced for small businesses. The Canada Emergency Commercial Rent Assistance will provide forgivable loans to qualifying commercial property owners to cover 50 percent of three-monthly rent payments payable by eligible small business tenants experiencing financial hardship during April, May and June.

The loans will be forgiven if the mortgaged property owner agrees to reduce the eligible small business tenants' rent by at least 75 percent for the three corresponding months under a rent forgiveness agreement, which will include a pledge not to evict the tenant while the agreement is in place.

Tenants can qualify if their rent is less than \$50,000/month and who have temporarily ceased operations or have experienced at least a 70% drop in pre-COVID-19 revenues.

I have received many emails asking when things will fully return to normal business operations. This question is not easy to answer. Why? There are too many variables.

- We need to know how the virus works
- Need to assist with worldwide efforts to develop a safe, effective vaccine.
- Will face masks, and physical distancing be frequent?
- Will large gatherings still be discouraged?
- For those most at risk from the virus, will they still be asked to spend as much time at home as possible?
- When will border and travel restrictions be lifted?
- When will essential industries start up?



Families across the country are changing routines and this can be stressful. Family resiliency is your family's ability to cope with life's challenges and bounce forward from difficult times. Research has shown that families that have gone through hardships don't just survive, they grow - they are stronger, more loving, have a sense of purpose and are better able to cope with future challenges. The following are things that can help strengthen your resiliency:

Routines and schedules

Can help children and parents feel calmer and more in control

Consistency and structure are calming in times of stress

Gives control over our day; provides comfort when we know what to expect

Move your body everyday

Exercise improves mental, physical and social wellness
Physical activity is linked to positive mental health outcomes

Can improve mood and self esteem; decrease stress and anxiety

Provides opportunities to connect with each other

Practice mindfulness

Mindfulness is paying attention on purpose to our thoughts, feelings, body sensations and surrounding environment.

Helps us focus, take a pause, and calm down when upset

Some mindfulness practices are deep belly breathing, tense and release muscle relaxation, and meditation

Expand your mind

Promotes positive mental health, builds resilience, and creates a healthy growth mindset

Building a strong brain includes understanding our feelings, thoughts and behaviours and learning skills and strategies to cope through difficult times.

For example, a regular gratitude practice has shown to reduce levels of stress hormones in the body, improves our ability to cope with stress, and improves our overall mood. Using a gratitude journal where you write down things you are grateful for everyday, or a gratitude jar with your family where you write down things you are grateful for your family for are beneficial.

Putting feelings into words helps people calm down when they feel mad or upset. Recognizing and naming emotions, connecting them with body sensations and teaching how to display them in socially appropriate ways are helpful

Simple connections; build a sense of togetherness by eating together, take time together to relax, or play

games together

Fuel your body

Fueling your body with healthy food can help combat stress and support your overall immune system and overall health

Creating a home that supports healthy eating habits is just as important as the foods you eat

Be a role model for others in your household - your healthy eating habits may encourage those around you to make healthy choices too

Sharing meals together is a great opportunity to bring the family together. It gives us an opportunity to share and connect with one another

Involving kids in planning and preparing meals helps nurture healthy eating habits as well as increases their self confidence. It gives hands-on learning experience and provides more opportunities to connect and spend quality time together

Wanting to mail a letter in those days, he asked a young boy where the post office was. When the boy told him, Dr. Graham thanked him and said, "If you will come to church tonight, I will tell you how you can get to Heaven." The little boy thought about it for a moment and said, "No, thank you, sir, I don't think I will be there. You don't even know how to get to the post office!"

Upon hearing of his death I talked with several individuals and each person had at least one story to share of how the ministry of Billy Graham had impacted their life. Weekly Summary for April 28

It seems that spring is finally upon us! The temperature is starting to warm up and plans for vegetable gardens and colourful flower beds are in process. I hope that you and your loved ones are finding ways to enjoy the warmer weather while staying safe and practicing physical distancing. While cooped up kids are yearning to get out and enjoy the sunshine, I urge you to continue to avoid playground equipment and other collective group play spaces.

COVID-19 is a challenging time for many of us. If you are struggling, support is always available through the Alberta Mental Health Helpline at 1-877-303-2642. Updated information on COVID-19 and resources for coping can also be found at alberta.ca/covid19.

I am pleased to share that our government has launched a new program to address the economic challenges that Alberta faces. The new Site Rehabilitation Program will provide grants to oilfield service contractors to perform well, pipeline, and oil and gas site reclamation. The program, which is expected to create 5,300 direct jobs for Albertans, will lead the cleanup of thousands of sites here in our province. Applications for contracts by service companies will open May 1, and will help get Albertans back to work during a period of unprecedented challenges for the oil and gas industry. Our government is taking action to get Albertans back to work and look ahead to economic recovery.

Our government is listening to Albertans and making significant investments to recognize the unique challenges of providing health care services in rural Alberta. This week, as a result of frank discussions between the Minister and rural MLA's our government made changes to physician compensation in rural areas, including removing the cap on incentives through the Rural, Remote and Northern Program, increasing rural on-call rates, and freezing rural and family medical liability rates at \$1,000. In addition,

our government is introducing a program to pay for 20 young Albertans from rural communities to attend medical school in exchange for working in a rural community for three years. These new investments will help recruit and retain physicians in rural areas of our province.

I am happy to share that additional relief measures are on the way for Alberta's small businesses. Many small businesses have been required to close or limit their operations to protect public health during the COVID-19 pandemic, and are facing extreme financial pressures. Our government is joining a Government of Canada program to support a loan program that will reduce the rent costs for small businesses by 75 percent. This program, which is expected to start up in mid-May, will offer forgivable loans. Small businesses are the backbone of our communities, and this program will help support them through COVID-19.

Thank you for doing your part to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Having said the government is now preparing to roll out the re-launch of the Alberta economy in a series of stages over the next few weeks and months. Stay tuned for upcoming announcements.
