Breton Museum Update From Allan Goddard

The Board and staff of the Breton museum would like to bring the readers of the Breton Booster an update on the Breton Museum and their plans for the immediate future. While museums and art galleries were included in Phase 1 of the Alberta Government's relaunch strategy to reopen as of May 14, the Board of the museum felt that it would not be in the best interest of the museum to reopen at this time.

The necessary requirements needed to be in place to assure the safety of the public and staff, combined with numerous other factors such as: no school programs, large community gatherings, or group tours likely to take place over the next few months would prevent the museum from offering a satisfying museum experience. In addition, there is uncertainty about what level of general visitation would occur over the summer months, as non-essential travel is still not recommended.

The Board of the museum did not make this decision without careful consideration to the health and safety of not only the museum, but our community and the general public. The museum is disappointed that we will not be hiring a summer staff position this year to assist with museum duties. They realize that it is one less employment opportunity for the youth of the area to gain experience in the heritage field, but took into consideration the requirements of social distancing and safety measures which would have to be in place to offer a safe work

environment considering the hands on nature of the position.

Even though the Breton Museum will remain closed to the public at this time, work will carry on behind the scenes to continue to preserve the history of the Breton and District. Also look for future articles in the Breton Booster as the museum endeavours to keep the community engaged with the museum from a safe distance. 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LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

To the Editor

It is easy to see why our County attendees at the Global Conference enjoyed attending this conference. It is indeed inspiring to see and hear the innovations and inventions that corporations and countries are accomplishing.

What is not as easy to understand is why our Council feels that attendance by three Councillors and two staff members was necessary, and perhaps you will understand why I say this when you read the rest of this letter or if you have in fact read their report in the Agenda of April 7 (available online on the County website).

From the report, it seems that about four sessions were attended—and of those four, only one seemed to pertain to County benefit.

While attending such a conference would be an eye-opener of methods and innovations to make our planet more viable and sustainable, most of what was reported appears to be of provincial or federal responsibility. The one report on the Volstak Power Station (which was part of the trade show) does appear to have County interest considering Cynthia and Lodge Pole situations. However, one must consider the cost of the Algae Cube Tech that is discussed, as opposed to the return in benefit to the environment and its users. It was suggested that it may be incorporated into the Ag Service Board tour of 2021. The value and benefit need to be determined. Did we need to send three Councillors and two staff to find this?

In terms of the "report" published regarding what went on at the conference, the following observations are provided.

It should be noted that reading the report was made somewhat difficult by the number of typos, grammatical errors, and punctuation omissions. A little proofreading would have helped. The list of speakers represents a number of high-powered individuals from various high-powered institutions. In three days, it seems there would be at least 10 sessions presented through the panel discussions, arm chair talks, and plenary speakers. The report describes only four. It seems that an evaluation of all attended sessions would be in order. Policy "Council 4" requires each attendee to submit a report. Additionally, there is no indication who wrote the summary. Most importantly, it is hard to connect the topics to municipal interest as the ideas given are of either provincial or federal concern.

Most of the report consists of pictures of a trade show. While interesting and inspiring as this may be, it is again of little benefit to the municipalityonly to federal or provincial governments.

Last but not least, the last paragraph seems to represent a highlight when Mr. Guyon met MP Mr. J. Wilkinson (Minister of the Environment) and Mr. B. Gillespie (the head of ALUS), who is "delighted with the ALUS program in Brazeau County and hopes to see it increase in the coming years."

The above represents only a handful of questions as to the "value" of this conference to the County of Brazeau.

Keeping in mind that we sent five people on public dime to this conference, the report is woefully short of volume, given there must have been at least 10 sessions presented by experts. Nor is there an evaluation as to the value of this conference to the County. This conference is an example of why we probably shouldn't send people to out-of-province events. Perhaps Councillors could their pay own costs if they feel strongly that there would be a benefit.

This "report" in the view of this writer does not rate a Pass, but read it for yourself and give it your own rating.

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

Max Lucado tells us a story about a girl named Christina. She lives in a small dusty village in Brazil. She's bored with her young life. She feels like her strict and protective parents have cheated her out of the joys of life. She longs for the excitement of the big city of Rio.

One morning her mother Maria finds Christina's bed empty. Maria knew immediately where her daughter had gone. So she quickly throws some clothes in a bag, gathers up all her money, and heads for the bus station.

On her way, the mom enters one of those photograph booths in a local drug store and takes pictures of herself. She puts the pictures in her purse and takes the next bus to Rio de Janeiro.

When she arrives in Rio she puts up pictures of herself all over town. She searches everywhere but she can't find her daughter. The weary mother gets back on the bus and weeps all the way home.

Months later, Christina slowly walks down the hotel stairs. She's already worn down by life. Her young face is tired. Her brown eyes no longer dance with youth but speak of pain and fear.

A thousand times over she longed to go back home. She remembered the warm secure feeling of love and acceptance she had experience back with her mom in their little village. But she thought it was too late to turn back, she had gone too far, done too much.

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


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MLA REPORT

from The Office of MLA Mark Smith, Member of the Legislative Assembly for Drayton Valley - Devon

This year's spring season has presented many unexpected challenges for our community. Undoubtedly these have been difficult times, both financially and emotionally, for many of us. I want to assure all of my constituents that our government is considering every possible step to support Albertans as we look towards economic recovery.

The COVID-19 pandemic has presented many challenges and uncertainties. Mental health is an important part of our well-being. Our government is investing \$53 million to boost mental health services in communities across the province, ensuring that all Albertans have access to the mental health supports that they need. I encourage everyone to reach out to loved ones to help boost their spirits. Resources are also available to anyone who is struggling during COVID-19. The Mental Health Help Line provides 24/7 confidential support at 1-877-303-2642.

Throughout the pandemic, sharing accurate and up-to-date information to the public has been an important component of our province's response. Information on public health guidelines, resources for coping, and supports for individuals and businesses in Alberta can all be found at alberta.ca/covid19.

We recently announced funding to meet new staffing needs at hard-hit continuing care facilities during COVID-19. New funding will help with staff hiring of health care aides, and will relieve some of the pressures on these facilities during the pandemic. Additional funding will be available to top up wages of an additional \$2 per hour for health-care aides, and create up to one thousand paid student practicum positions to fast-track certification and help meet staffing shortages. In addition, \$24.5 million is being advanced to continuing care operators to help address immediate cost pressures from the pandemic. Continuing care facilities have been disproportionately affected by the COVID-19 pan-

demic, and our government is committed to supporting staff and helping residents get the quality and compassionate care they deserve.

And finally, our government has announced new measures to connect and celebrate volunteers during the COVID-19 pandemic. The new Alberta Cares Connector will connect volunteers with organizations during COVID-19, and can be found at volunteerconnector.org. This week, the Alberta Northern Lights Volunteer Recognition Program was also launched. This award program is accepting nominations of any individual or group who is helping make their community a better place. As we respond to COVID-19, Albertans are building on our province's culture of volunteerism by stepping up and finding new ways to support their communities.

Finally, the government has decided that the provincial numbers are trending in a positive direction to the point where we can begin to re-launch the Alberta economy. Assuming that those numbers continue to trend in the appropriate direction we have set the date of May14th for the launching of the first phase of the economic re-opening. The goal is to allow business to gradually and safely ramp up over a period of time through the 3 stages. It will be important to remember that should at any time this very contagious virus flare up again that the government could move back towards a more restrictive position of self-isolation and the shutting down of businesses. As the economy continues through the 3 phases of the re-launch we must all remember to continue to live the lessons that we have learned about self-isolating and hand washing so that society is safe and working once again.




