



The consensus is that we are only half way through this round of the virus. I am proud of how this community, has followed the guidelines as set out by AHS. We do have a few citizens, that need a little reminder, from time to time, but overall, compliance is working. If you go out in public, wear a face mask and social distance. If we wear face masks and social distance, things will get back to normal more quickly. We are fortunate to be in a low risk area, but that can change quickly if we don't take precautions. The Thorsby Communities In Bloom Society has a lot to be excited about. We are wanting to celebrate serving our community for the last 15 years. To kick off our spring in style we want to tell you about a few things that are currently being planned.

This year the Alberta Provincial Communities In Bloom Program Theme is "Bloom Where Your Planted" which is a theme that speaks to all of us in some form as we navigate through the Covid 19 Pandemic. We have been notified that there will be no judging of any communities across Alberta and Canada this year. Instead all communities will enter into the Friends Non-Evaluated category. What we can expect to see with this new format is:

- Webinars for Alberta Communities with Special Guest Speakers and Gardening Personalities
- · Contests Good News Stories
- Showcase Places/Spaces submit 3-4 photos and a small description of a CIB Project in our community that will be featured in the Alberta Communities In Bloom -Blooms and Bits News Letter across Alberta
- Fall Gardening Workshop will be dependent on where we are at
- New Technical Resources Pieces stay tuned
- · Video Tours stay tuned

This year Thorsby CIB will also organize a Yard In Bloom with details to follow soon, so get ready to show off your talents. We are committed to still doing our projects as planned that you will see below:

Project 1 – Thorsby CIB and the Thorsby Chamber of Commerce will partner up to improve the North Entrance Shrub Display in front of the sign. This will include land-scaping, shrub replacement with mulch to give a renewed look entering our community.

Project 2 – Thorsby CIB and the Town of Thorsby will partner up to develop and create an addition to the Thorsby Network of Trails. Yes, you heard correctly, a new trail!!! CIB will provide the budget while the town will provide the lane access. This location will be located on 45 Street on the far southeast side of town or east of the Hay Maker Centre. The lane has been a closed laneway for over 20 years and has since grown in with young poplar trees creating an ideal walking area with a level easy walking or biking terrain of 1447 feet. We will be clearing an 8-foot path. The

trees taken down will create a mulch base through the trees heading north or south. The entrances will only allow for residents or pedal bikes to enter and not motorized sport bikes and will be a walking delight for your pets while on a leash.



A garbage can will be located on site at an entrance and we may have access for a few picnic tables and benches to place along the route. This will be Phase 1 with the hope of creating Phase 2 the following year that will be able to connect to our Recreational Fields. If all goes to plan, we should see the pathway created towards the middle of May. Thorsby CIB currently has three grants submitted for trees and recycling containers. They have been postponed for a bit, but we are hopeful we will be able to secure some support in the coming months, so fingers crossed.

Lastly CIB will be getting ready for the plants to arrive soon which will either be the last week in May or the first week in June. This is always dependant on our ever-changing weather. This year we will also be helping to water the plants to support the town. We encourage everyone to maintain a clean and tidy property and pick up garbage if you see any blowing around in our trails, recreation fields and overall community. If you have some time to give, Thorsby CIB is always looking for volunteers to help with our projects, and we remain very flexible to meet everyone's schedules. CHRIS NICHOLS, THS CLASS of 2001

It was with great pleasure that I received an invitation to write my story for "Straight out of Thorsby" – pleasure, coupled with the realization that the A-list Thorsby alumni had been exhausted and it was at last time for the rest of us. Finally, the people will have their due.

My memories of growing up in Thorsby are vivid and fond. Though it seemed like an unremarkable upbringing at the time, living now in Vancouver and telling stories of my youth helps me grasp its uniqueness. Consider this: 1) some people have spent their formative years without a 'tire town' to play on/injure themselves. This was our elementary playground, a mishmash of tractor tires with heavy bolts protruding out from angles eager to catch the unwatchful child playing tag; 2) some teenagers never experienced the character-building shame of having their high school signage broken to display TRBY HI HOL; and 3) most egregiously, some people don't know what a bush party even is, let alone how to light a bale on fire to keep warm in the dead of winter on an abandoned ski hill.

So I'm thankful for those memories, among others, that made me the person I am today. Growing up I played most sports in town, including hockey, basketball, soccer, volleyball

and golf. We were the first midget AA team in Thorsby (I think), and used the opportunity to rename our team the Thorsby Thundercats. No doubt it struck fear in the heart of our competition to be facing such a ferocious, if somewhat nonsensical, animal.

I remember teachers who cared more than we deserved and townspeople who indulged our loitering. I was a member of grad class '01, and our motto was "Remember yesterday, dream of tomorrow, but live for today". A bit of a catchall. However, like a fine wine, it has fermented from neglect while nevertheless inviting reflection into how good it could have been if used properly.


Upon graduation and a year 'finding myself', which involved working for town cornerstone G and N Contracting, freezing to death in unfinished basements, I moved to Camrose and completed a bachelor's degree in Sociology, after which I moved to the West Coast for my masters at the University of Victoria and discovered there is a land where Spring begins in February. After a short stint beginning and then dropping my PhD in New York, I returned to the west, settling in Vancouver and getting married on a gulf island on a cooperatively owned farm with no power or potable water. When in Rome, I guess.

After a time devoted to writing and tutoring university students, I've spent the last six years building a worker's cooperative called Wood Shop (www.woodshop.coop). We make reclaimed wood furniture, custom interiors and conduct DIY workshops in a shared building we recently established with other cooperatives and non-profits. Our organization tries to be a force in building an alternative, cooperative economy that is socially, environmentally and economically just. It's hard work, but I couldn't imagine doing anything else. Either this is laudable or a product of poor imagination. I'll let you decide.

I get the opportunity to speak and write from time-to-time on what I do and why I do it. Mostly I use these platforms to argue for workerownership and the prioritization of people over profits – something our current pandemic has taught us is not only intuitive but essential. Often these opportunities for reflection bring me back to Thorsby and the ethic that was instilled in me from a young age. I'm lucky to have my brother, mother, and other relatives in the Thorsby area and I'm able to get back a couple times a year to see the lake I grew up on and the arena I called home in the winter. Maybe if there's time I can get a game of bowling in or do some fishtails around town for oldtimes sake.

Back in Vancouver my days are spent running my business, hiking and biking, and trying to find time to continue work on writing projects. I love it out here, but sometimes on the cold, rainy Vancouver nights I still feel the pull to light up a bale, stand back and watch it blaze up into the endless prairie sky. After all, Thorsby still lives in my heart – literally, in the cholesterol from the many lunchtime fries at Thorsby Family Restaurant and sweet and sour pork at Ku's. I wouldn't trade it for the world.

MESSAGE TO MY CONSTITUENTS

Support has been announced for students and post-graduates. The Canada Emergency Student Benefit will provide \$1,250 per month for eligible students or \$2,000 per month for eligible students with dependents or disabilities and will be available from May to August 2020.

The government also announced the Student Service Grant. Under this program, students who choose to serve their communities during the COVID 19 pandemic will be provided with up to \$5,000 for their education in the fall.

New measures were also announced for small businesses. The Canada Emergency Commercial Rent Assistance will provide forgivable loans to qualifying commercial property owners to cover 50 percent of three-monthly rent payments payable by eligible small business tenants experiencing financial hardship during April, May and June.

The loans will be forgiven if the mortgaged property owner agrees to reduce the eligible small business tenants' rent by at least 75 percent for the three corresponding months under a rent forgiveness agreement, which will include a pledge not to evict the tenant while the agreement is in place.

Tenants can qualify if their rent is less than \$50,000/month and who have temporarily ceased operations or have experienced at least a 70% drop in pre-COVID-19 revenues.

I have received many emails asking when things will fully return to normal business operations. This question is not easy to answer. Why? There are too many variables.

- We need to know how the virus works
- Need to assist with worldwide efforts to develop a safe, effective vaccine.
- Will face masks, and physical distancing be frequent?
- Will large gatherings still be discouraged?
- For those most at risk from the virus, will they still be asked to spend as much time at home as possible?
- When will border and travel restrictions be lifted?
- When will essential industries start up?

2020 DUST SUPPRESSION PROGRAM

Application deadline: Friday, May 15

Applications and payment must be received by **May 15**, **2020**. After road bans have been removed, dust suppression product will be applied to the road as soon as possible.

Two product choices:

- 1. <u>Calcium Chloride</u> two applications of product will be completed for every residence applying for this dust suppression product. The second application will be automatically applied approximately six to eight weeks following the first application (weather permitting).
- 2. <u>Incorporated DL10</u> warranted one year from date of application.

Residents desiring a calcium chloride dust control product on the county road adjacent to their residence will be required to complete an application form and to prepay a fee of \$374.50 plus GST for the first 122 metres (400 feet). Leduc County provides a subsidy of \$695.50 for this strip. Dust suppression requested beyond 122 metres (400 feet) will be charged at \$8.77/metre, plus GST.

Residents desiring a DL10 incorporated dust control product on the county road adjacent to their residence will be required to complete an application form and to prepay a fee of \$2934.50 plus GST for the first 122 metres (400 feet). Leduc County provides a subsidy of \$695.50 for this strip. Dust suppression requested beyond 122 metres (400 feet) will be charged at \$29.75/metre, plus GST.

MLA REPORT

Weekly Summary for April 28

It seems that spring is finally upon us! The temperature is starting to warm up and plans for vegetable gardens and colourful flower beds are in process. I hope that you and your loved ones are finding ways to enjoy the warmer weather while staying safe and practicing physical distancing. While cooped up kids are yearning to get out and enjoy the sunshine, I urge you to continue to avoid playground equipment and other collective group play spaces.

COVID-19 is a challenging time for many of us. If you are struggling, support is always available through the Alberta Mental Health Helpline at 1-877-303-2642. Updated information on COVID-19 and resources for coping can also be found at alberta.ca/covid19.

I am pleased to share that our government has launched a new program to address the economic challenges that Alberta faces. The new Site Rehabilitation Program will provide grants to oilfield service contractors to perform well, pipeline, and oil and gas site reclamation. The program, which is expected to create 5,300 direct jobs for Albertans, will lead the cleanup of thousands of sites here in our province. Applications for contracts by service companies will open May 1, and will help get Albertans back to work during a period of unprecedented challenges for the oil and gas industry. Our government is taking action to get Albertans back to work and look ahead to economic recovery.

Our government is listening to Albertans and making significant investments to recognize the unique challenges of providing health care services in rural Alberta. This week, as a result of frank discussions between the Minister and rural MLA's our government made changes to physician compensation in rural areas, including removing the cap on incentives through the Rural, Remote and Northern Program, increasing rural on-call rates, and freezing rural and family medical liability rates at \$1,000. In addition, our government is introducing a program to pay for 20 young Albertans from rural communities to attend medical school in exchange for working in a rural community for three years. These new investments will help recruit and retain physicians in rural areas of our province.

I am happy to share that additional relief measures are on the way for Alberta's small businesses. Many small businesses have been required to close or limit their operations to protect public health during the COVID-19 pandemic, and are facing extreme financial pressures. Our government is joining a Government of Canada program to support a loan program that will reduce the rent costs for small businesses by 75 percent. This program, which is expected to start up in mid-May, will offer forgivable loans. Small businesses are the backbone of our communities, and this program will help support them through COVID-19.

Thank you for doing your part to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Having said the government is now preparing to roll out the re-launch of the Alberta economy in a series of stages over the next few weeks and months. Stay tuned for upcoming announcements.


