Notice is hereby given that the combined assessment and property tax notices for the 2020 taxation year have been prepared for distribution and mailed on May 29, 2020 to all registered owners recorded on the 2019 Assessment Roll for 2020 Taxation.

The Assessment Roll is open for viewing by any person during regular office hours at the Village Office located in the Carolyn Strand Civic Centre, 4916 – 50 Avenue, Breton, AB. Anyone wishing to appeal the assessment value on any property listed on the assessment roll must do so by October 1st, 2020, using only the prescribed "Assessment Review Board Complaint" form #LGS1402 (2009/08), which is available at the Village Office. The appeal must be accompanied by a \$50.00 fee per residential parcel or \$100 per non-residential parcel, which will be refunded to the complainant if the complaint is successful.

A copy of "Filing a Property Assessment Complaint and Preparing for Your Hearing" booklet as well as a "Guide to Property Assessment and Taxation in Alberta" can be obtained at the Village Office or online at Municipal property assessment and taxation – Overview | Alberta.ca.

All assessments and tax notices are deemed to have been received seven (7) days after mailing within Alberta and fourteen (14) days outside of the province.

MP Soroka Co-hosts Virtual Town Hall on Firearms Ban

OTTAWA: Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, would like to thank everyone who responded to his post on Facebook and participated in the virtual town hall he co-hosted with Dane Lloyd, MP on the government's firearms ban.

Many constituents raised concerns over the new gun regulations, which in many cases arbitrarily ban certain firearms and noted that this does little to combat illegal guns, most of which are smuggled in from the US.

MP Soroka stated, "Many police chiefs are coming out and saying that this ban is not going to do anything to combat gun crime. Unfortunately, the Liberals don't want to listen to anyone whose views don't fit their narrative."

"The fact of the matter is that the vast majority of illegal guns are smuggled in from the US. These changes do nothing to address that. Once again, we have a case of the Liberals punishing honest, hard-working Canadians to make a symbolic gesture that does nothing to affect the underlying issue."

"The money the government is spending on this, which could be up to a few billion dollars, would be better spent keeping guns out of the hands of criminals".

Youth Hub: A Place for All of Us

You may have heard talk of the Youth Hub opening in Drayton Valley for individuals aged 11-24. Our Youth Hub will be youth-designed. It will be a space that youth want to be in with supports in place that they want and need.

First, let's talk about the space for our Youth Hub. Research shows that having a 'place' to belong creates an increased likelihood of setting roots in their home community, less crime and more volunteerism. Prior to Covid-19 outbreak, the Drayton Valley Integrated Services Hub for Youth was in the process of leasing a building in Drayton Valley. The idea of the Youth Centre came from youth following the research being done by RYSE in our community. Researchers heard youth ask for a safe space to be and to get more access to mental health supports. Before the COVID 19 restrictions, we had a group of youth help pick the space. It was so much fun to tour a few different potential sites and allow the youth to pick the one that they felt would be the best. Hearing their ideas of what each room in the building could be used for, layout of furniture and the types of games they wanted to see was amazing. The excitement was palpable. The space will be inviting, allinclusive and safe. When youth walk through the door, they will be welcomed whole heartedly.

Why has there been so much devotion to develop the Youth Hub? Did you know that the majority of mental health concerns typically begin prior to age 24? Barriers that youth face when accessing mental health supports includes stigma, lack of understanding of services, long wait lists, and difficulty navigating the system. Our Youth Hub will decrease the stigma around mental health and addictions support, assess where youth are at and help them navigate the system to determine the right supports for their needs. The integrated services model of the Youth Hub will increase service access for individuals and strengthen our community's capacity to support its youth. Besides connecting youth with services they need, these individuals will greatly benefit from natural supports and relationships that develop informally and locally within the Hub. The balance between professional and natural supports is critical for healthy development. Our Youth Center will provide an environment where this balance can be accomplished.

Our Youth Hub will be successful because of the involvement of youth themselves in the project. We are calling out for help from youth to make decisions on the youth hub space, to determine what services should be offered and to help promote it within our community. Until we can open our Youth Hub, our supports are available through social media, including Facebook (Brazeau Empowerment and Support Team), Instagram (dv_b.e.s.t), SnapChat (dv_best) and TikTok (dvbest2020). 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
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

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
