

Local Musicians Release Rock Album From Ben Tobiasson

On May 11, 2020, my brother Clint and I released our first "rock" album and it's based on the music we used to play in the '70s.

Clint and I have been working on this for a few years and had to dust off some old recordings to help us 'remember' how some of it went.

We released it under the Tunecore Label and it's all over the world now. We are proud to say it was recorded entirely in the Warburg area. The new album is entitled "Fresh Tracks Tobiasson Brothers".

Many may remember Clint and I playing sockhops in the gym in Warburg School. In later years Clint and I (hiring and rehearsing a drummer) played all over Western Canada with our band "Equinox". We were mostly a smaller venue band.....the biggest bar we played was The St. Albert Inn before the bar was all chopped into pieces....would have seated about 500 people then. We BARELY had enough amplification on stage to play there. We have played some bigger venues (not a lot of them): Winstock 2016; Winstock 2019 and the reopening of the Sunnybrook Hall. Both the Winstock shows did have some amateur video done and we had some of them professionally produced.....unfortunately too late to replace the audio recording that we had released already.

Our new album can be heard very easily on YouTube. Just search "Tobiasson Brothers" and find Fresh Tracks.....play all. There are 12 tracks on the album and all of them Clint and I wrote and have performed live. This 70's rock album and the recording are available on all major retailers: iTunes, amazon, etc..
