#### **RESPONSE TO LETTER FROM THE TOWN OF DRAYTON VALLEY**

Earlier this month, you received a letter from the Town of Drayton Valley encouraging the provincial government to consider merging municipalities. This letter was on a Council agenda, but not sent to Brazeau County.

Brazeau County is strongly opposed to any amalgamation and regionalization measures. They will have significant impact on rural Albertans. To address these in order:

Amalgamation is not in the interests of either urban or rural residents. Residents of these municipalities expect and pay for different services at different costs. What makes sense in an urban municipality may not make sense in a rural one. For instance, one of our main priorities in Brazeau County is the construction and maintenance of roads to support our petroleum and agricultural industries. The needs, wants, and lifestyles of urban and rural residents do and will differ.

The Intermunicipal Collaboration Framework (ICF) already provides ample opportunity for delivery of shared services, and the Town of Drayton Valley and Brazeau County have a long history of cost-sharing and collaboration on planning, infrastructure, and recreation services. In addition, Brazeau County has for years provided millions of dollars in cost-sharing transfers. In fact, among neighbouring counties (Leduc, Clearwater, Sturgeon, Parkland, Wetaskiwin, and Yellowhead), Brazeau County is currently by far the biggest contributor on a per-capita basis to recreation cost-sharing with urban partners. Brazeau contributes \$132.07 per capita to recreation in the Town of Drayton Valley. The other counties contribute an average of \$58.49 to their equivalent urban recreation partners for things such as pools and arenas.

The Town of Drayton Valley letter asserts that cost savings could be realized through a merger for services such as recreation, water and wastewater, and waste management. We submit this will not be the case, as the vast majority of the County and its residents do not live close enough

to the town to make most of the shared services feasible. The mere fact of the distances involved make those efficiencies unrealistic. The letter also asserts that conflicts over costs sharing would cease in a unified region. We find this naïve, as we know that while urban and rural residents share a desire for good government, how that good government is realized through the delivery of services will differ. Cost sharing conflicts would simply move from two Council chambers to one.

A forced partnership is unlikely to be a successful partnership. It will create resentment amongst all ratepayers, who have made choices about where to live based on a number of factors unique to their municipality, including the tax rate and the services offered. A forced partnership would also not be democratic. Any decisions regarding amalgamation or regionalization should be made by the local residents. And I can assure you, Brazeau County residents are opposed to any form of forced partnership.

As for regionalization, I am confident your government, which shares Brazeau County's desire to cut red tape, would not be in favour of another level of government, especially for the Drayton Valley/Brazeau County region, which has less than 15,000 residents. We certainly do not need another level of government.

Finally, this time of pandemic, a time when our oil and gas and agricultural industries are suffering greatly, and our residents are struggling financially, is no time to be considering mergers or regionalization. Taking from one family member to give to another does not make the family any wealthier. This is true for municipalities as well.

My request is that you publicly reject consideration of amalgamation or regionalization for Alberta's municipalities, and make it clear the Alberta government is opposed to undemocratic change that will bring with it additional red tape, conflict, and uncertainty to Albertans.



Through the IFI program, the government will invest almost \$13 million to support Indigenous participation in forestry-related opportunities, businesses, careers and governance.




