DONALD HIER -THS CLASS OF 1970 (50th Anniversary) PART 1

Growing up in Thorsby was a great experience for me. It had the feeling of being in the country, but had the benefits of "city life" wow..., a movie theatre, a pool hall, a barber shop, a drug store, a real outdoor hockey rink and several school yards to play in. Back then, we could walk or ride our bikes anywhere in town or out of town – all by ourselves!! I was fortunate to have grown up with a large extended family, so it was never a problem to find anyone to play with.

I have many happy memories of growing up in Thorsby. Most of them revolved around our family gettogethers, lots of sports and helping my dad on our small ¼ section of land out by Telfordville. I also remember working for my brother-in-law, Louis Hostyn. Growing up, we did all kinds of things that a lot of kids don't and can't do today, like: shooting gophers, collecting magpie/crow eggs (a County Bounty at that time), hunting ducks/geese, (mostly ducks because seeing a Canada goose was a rarity), hunting/trapping beavers and drilling water wells.

My dad, John Hier, was Thorsby's very first mayor and I saw a lot of changes during the time I grew up in "Town". Before we got any paved streets, springtime in Thorsby meant a steady diet of rubber boots!! My dad could pretty much do everything and make just about anything. He was a mechanic, a welder, a blacksmith, a carpenter, a bus driver, you name it, he could do it. He even built the house that I grew up in. My biggest regret though, is that I wish I had learned a lot more from my dad than I did.

I have vivid memories of walking home from a full evening of playing hockey on Thorsby's outdoor rink (which we had to shovel nearly every day) and breathlessly watching the endless stream of colours from the brilliant Northern Lights. Tobogganing on the hills by the creek, swimming in a swimming hole where the reservoir is now located, and endless softball, football and all kinds of other games.

I have many memories of my school days – and most of them happy. How many of you can say that you had the benefit of having your sister-in-law (mine was Josephine Hier, who taught me in elementary), and your brother (this was Lyle Hier who taught Industrial Arts in High School) as your teachers?

My school years were filled with lots of sports, gymnastics, hockey, baseball, volleyball, flag football, track/field, a little bit of basketball (little, because I was height - challenged), a ton of badminton, and then later, curling.

I also remember lots of times riding the school bus with my dad taking the country kids home after school and that gave me a good taste of what it was like to see what they had to go through. Up early to catch the bus, and then home late. They didn't have the opportunity that we "city kids" had – play sports and either walk or ride our bikes to school and home.

Senior high school years were a struggle for me between having fun, playing sports and trying to keep up with school/home work. There were lots of memorable teachers I had, and apologize if I don't list or talk about all of them. One was Allan Senio, my math teacher, who was tough on the outside, but when you really got to know him, was great and was one of the smartest teachers I had and he taught me to love math. Unfortunately, calculus and algebra weren't my strong suits. John Elson was a relatively new teacher to the school when I was in grade 11, and a likeable character, but he taught English Lit (which was not a class I loved). I remember him in a better light for being involved with flag football. Then there was Stan Zurek, who taught physics and physics was my absolute favorite subject. And of course there was my brother Lyle, probably the best teacher I had!!

Thorsby had a pretty good Pee-Wee hockey team thanks to Harold Stein, but by age 13, because the town didn't have an indoor rink, my hockey career was over, so I turned to curling. My dad was making the ice in the old 3 sheet curling rink Thorsby had at that time, so I started curling in addition to helping him make ice. I couldn't get enough of curling then, and still can't, it's such a great sport.

The legal drinking age was lowered to eighteen in 1971 and since I graduated in 1970, I was of course under age. At that time, all alcohol was sold through the Alberta Liquor Control Board, so it wasn't that easy to get beer. But, like most resourceful kids, we found ways to get around these rules and certainly had our share of Keg parties and other "out of town events"!! But nobody got crazy or out of control, we just had fun (at least as far as I can remember).

High School flew by fast and I graduated as part of the Class of 1970. But now what? I really wanted to go into Engineering, but my marks in physics weren't high enough (certainly not Stan's fault), so I enrolled at N.A.I.T. and took Business Administration, and then majored in Accounting.

While attending N.A.I.T. and living in Edmonton, I still came home on the weekends, where my mom more than happily did my laundry and I was able to hang out with my friends and family. During the summers, we managed to get guys together to play baseball as most of the towns around including Thorsby would have sports days featuring weekend baseball tournaments. In the winter, I did a lot of curling and bonspieling.

My time at N.A.I.T. was filled with sports, card games up in the NAIT lounge (I became a pretty good Hearts player) and lots of "happy hours" at the Kingsway Bar. I was selected to be part of the curling team that represented NAIT at the Alberta Winter Games, which was held in Grande Prairie. Needless to say, I can't remember much of the ride up or back. The legal drinking age was now 18 and there might have been some drinking on the bus up and back!!

While NAIT was fun, it was also a lot of hard work and many hours of studying. I graduated in 1972, with a Business Admin Diploma, (major in accounting). After graduating, I was offered a job by the Bank of Montreal and my first posting was in Edmonton at the Jasper Avenue and 100 Street Branch. The Branch had 4 young guys like me and 29 young girls and they were paying me to work there!!! From the Jasper Ave. Branch, I got transferred to the Baker Centre Branch in Edmonton and wasn't quite there a year when I was promoted to Administration Manager. The promotion required that I move, this time to Calgary and the Elbow Park Branch. So I packed up all my belongings on a Thursday night, loaded them in my car and reported to work in Calgary on Monday morning!

I was now really away from home. As a young naïve country bumpkin in a new, big, city working in a bank there were way too many good-looking girls for even me to count. While things were going great, around this time my dad suffered a major heart attack and died on Christmas Eve, 1974. This was devastating for our entire family, but with the love and support of family and friends, I knew life had to go on. While at the Elbow Park branch, I met the love of my life, Bonnie Beregszazi. Unfortunately, she didn't know that at the time and wouldn't go out with me, no matter how hard I tried. Elbow Park was a great experience where I learned a lot and I really grew to love Calgary. Of course, I had met this Bonnie girl who wouldn't go out with me.

The Bank quickly provided me another opportunity and I was moved from Elbow Park in Calgary, to Rimbey, Alberta. This was a bit of a culture shock, but for me, Rimbey was a whole lot bigger than Thorsby. Again, through sports, I met a lot of great people there, but I just couldn't get this Bonnie girl off my mind. I continued with my pursuit of her until one day she finally gave in and agreed to go out with me. After putting many, many miles on my then '72 Olds Cutlass, travelling to and from Calgary, we got engaged and married in Calgary in May 1975. We've just celebrated our 45th wedding anniversary this year and she keeps telling me that's two life sentences. I still don't know what she's talking about?

I am proud to announce that the Alberta Government will be doubling its funding towards the Strategic Transportation Infrastructure Program as part of Alberta's economic recovery plan. This grant program will insure an additional \$50 million towards critical infrastructure such as bridges. roads and community airports across smaller municipalities over the remainder of 2020. This infrastructure boost will also help to provide over 475 jobs across the province with as many as 70 different projects kicking off. The STIP grants funding is awarded in four categories: improvements to local bridges; community airports; resource roads for industrial use; and local municipal initiatives. These are cost-shared projects, with the province covering up to 75 per cent of the eligible cost and will be awarded based on initiatives identified by municipalities.

Our government is also investing \$150 million in water infrastructure grants that will support 55 water and wastewater improvement projects and approximately 1,300 jobs. These water infrastructure grants support improvements to water supply and treatment facilities, and upgrades to wastewater services, including lagoons, berms and sewage treatment. In particular the County of Brazeau will be seeing long awaited improvements to the wastewater lagoon at our local water treatment plant.

This week, several new bills were introduced into the Legislature to help make our communities safer places to live. Bill 25, the Protecting Alberta Industry from Theft Act, 2020, takes important steps to combat metal theft. If passed, this bill will require scrap metal dealers to report all transactions involving commonly stolen metals and items, such as catalytic converters, to law enforcement. Thieves terrorize property and business owners by trespassing and stealing materials such as copper wire and industrial batteries, and frequently damage and interfere with critical systems like electrical lines, telecommunications networks and transportation infrastructure. Our government is taking action to protect the safety and property of our community.

Finally, I am pleased to share that our government is upholding its commitments to Albertans and protecting choice within Alberta's robust and diverse education system. This week, the Choice in Education Act passed third reading in the Legislature. This bill will amend the Education Act to affirm that parents have the right to choose the kind of education they feel is best for their children, and it will strengthen Alberta's successful history of education choice, including public schools, Francophone schools, charter schools, and home education. This legislation also expands options for parents to deliver home education for their children, and will allow charter schools to be established with a focus on vocation-based education. Our government believes that parents know what is best for their children, and this bill creates more choice for parents on this important issue.


out by 50 cents for every extra dollar earned over the \$1,000 threshold.


For a part-time server making \$2,000 per month, the Back to Work Bonus would result in a top-up of \$1,500, for a total monthly income of \$3,500.
