Return To Schools From Mark Smith, MLA

The suspension of in-person schooling in March has been hard for many students and their families. Kindergarten to Grade 12 education changed significantly as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, and I know that students, parents, teachers and school boards did their best to adapt to a different way of learning. However, we all know that students who attend schools learn best in the classroom with their teachers and peers, and our goal is to get us back to normal learning as soon as possible. With back to school season approaching, many parents have been eagerly waiting to see what school will look like this upcoming year.

This week, Alberta's government announced that students will be returning to classrooms across the province, and here in Drayton Valley-Devon, at the beginning of the new school year. This is great news for families in our community. The decision to re-open schools has been made with the safety of students, teachers, and other staff members being the highest priority. For in-person learning to proceed. health measures are being put in place for their safety. Each school will implement public health measures, including frequent cleaning of surfaces, introducing hand sanitizers to school and classroom entrances, grouping students in cohorts, and adjusting schedules to allow for greater physical distancing. While school may feel a little different at first, these changes will allow a safe, near-normal return to class.

Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, keeping Albertans informed on new measures has been a key part of Alberta's response. To help prepare families, Alberta's government has developed a re-entry toolkit to help prepare parents and students for what to expect in the new school year. This toolkit includes videos for students explaining some of the health measures, a guide for parents, frequently asked questions, school posters, a self-screening questionnaire in multiple languages, and links to health guidelines. The resources in the school re-entry toolkit will help families discuss changes with their children.

As Alberta's students prepare to go back to school, the Minister of Education will continue to work closely with Chief Medical Officer of Health Dr. Hinshaw, as well as school boards, to ensure that all schools are prepared to welcome students back.

The re-opening of our schools, and our entire economy, is a result of the hard work of Albertans to slow the spread of COVID-19. As students return to school, each of us has the tools to ensure that we can safely return to daily life. I have been passionate about education for many years. I believe this plan to be truly beneficial for students overall.





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K-12 Re-entry Information

K-12 School Re-entry Information – The Province has been updating the re-entry information for schools starting in September. Here is some of the information. There are many good documents for parents and staff. Overview

Students across Alberta will return to class for the 2020/21 school year under Scenario 1: In-class learning with enhanced health and safety measures.

COVID-19 information: Guidance for schools on reentry scenario 1

Get the facts: Back to class for 2020-21

Masks

School health measures now include mandatory masks (Aug 4)

Mask use for grade four to 12 students, and all school staff, will be mandatory where physical distancing cannot be maintained, including on school buses.

Exemptions will be made for students and staff who are unable to wear a mask due to medical or other needs

Mask use for kindergarten to grade three students will continue to be optional.

All students and staff will receive two reusable masks from Alberta's government. More than 1.6 million masks will be distributed to 740,000 students and 90,000 staff.

School staff will receive one reusable face shield for their use in the schools to use at their discretion. A mask must still be worn while wearing a face shield.

Additional supports

Hand sanitizer

Alberta government will distribute 466,000 litres of hand sanitizer between all school authorities based on students population

Thermometers

Each school will receive two contactless thermometers

Staff Testing

Alberta Health and Alberta Health Services are

working hard to expand testing capacity and reduce turnaround times for testing, including in school staff, teachers, and students.

Screening measures

Self-screening questionnaire

Parents, students and school staff must review the self-screening questionnaire each day before going to a school building. Visitors must also use this questionnaire to determine if they may enter a school. Self-screening questionnaire (PDF)

People with medical conditions

For students with pre-existing or underlying medical conditions or risk factors, parents should:

Consult your child's physician to consider the health risks and make a decision about returning to school that will best support the child.

Contact your child's school to discuss available options and support.

Staff should also consult a physician and discuss options with their school board.

In addition to consulting with a physician, Albertans can assess the risk of experiencing severe health outcomes from COVID-19.

A student showing COVID-19 symptoms who has allergies or other pre-existing medical conditions that cause similar symptoms should get at least one negative COVID-19 test result before returning to school.

These symptoms would be their baseline health status. The student can attend school as long as they stay the same. Talk to your school about your child's pre-existing medical conditions so the school may keep a confidential record of these conditions. Tool kit and resources

Hello from West of the Fifth Law! By now you've hopefully seen our Ads or heard that a law firm has opened in Warburg. We thought it would be good to introduce ourselves and take a moment to talk about our practice.

Our firm is staffed by myself, Clayton Swan, a Lawyer and my fiancée, Linnée Peters, who will become a Lawyer on August 19. Both Clayton and Linnée have roots in Rural Alberta.

Our firm has four values: Being Innovative, Being Local, Being Affordable, and Being Available. This article, being the first of a four-part series, is going to focus on what it means for us to be "Available".

Our vision for our practice is to provide legal services to Rural Albertans. Small communities across North America have suffered in recent years as young professionals have been drawn to urban centres leaving few remaining local professional services behind. We believe that Rural Albertans deserve legal services just as much as Urban Albertans do, and to that end, we're being the change we want to see by making ourselves fully Available to Rural Albertans.

So, let's talk a little bit about what being Available actually means. We're not an Old School lawyer who sits in their office all day expecting everyone to come to them. In order to be more Available our firm structure is decentralized. This means we intend to find locations in communities where we can meet people. We would like to find a way to meet with you where you're at. We haven't completely fleshed out the plan yet so please bear with us as we figure this out. You can read more about it on our website w5law.ca/value/community-calls, and stay tuned for more columns from us on this subject and many others.

As a consequence of a decentralized model your odds of meeting with a lawyer will be much higher if you call ahead. We may be out meeting clients in other locations or we may be working from home that day but still able to drive out and meet you. We eventually hope to create a regular schedule of locations, but while we gauge demand our physical location will vary day-to-day.

A further point I'd like to bring up that sets us apart from typical Old School Lawyers, and is in keeping with our firm value of being Available, is that upon request we are able to be flexible about what times we meet with you at. Most Lawyers are limited to meeting with clients only during the 9-5 business day. We recognize that for many people this increases costs by requiring you to take time off from work. Our response is to provide some limited capacity for scheduling appointments with clients after-hours for no additional cost. This can also include telephone and video conferencing appointments.

One-Time Payment for Persons with Disabilities

OTTAWA: Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, would like to inform constituents that Bill C-20, An Act respecting further COVID-19 measures, has received Royal Assent, extending CEWS to December 19, 2020.

Bill C-20 will also allow for the sharing of information to facilitate the delivery of a one-time payment for persons with disabilities with a non-taxable and non-reportable payment of up to \$600 who:

- Are holders of a valid Disability Tax Credit certificate (eligible persons not yet in possession of such a certificate will be able to apply for one up to 60 days after today's Royal Assent to be considered for the one-time payment);
- Currently receive Canada Pension Plan disability benefits or Quebec Pension Plan disability benefits; or
- Are in receipt of disability supports provided by Veterans Affairs Canada.

Canada Revenue Agency Update

OTTAWA: Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, would like to inform constituents that the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) is extending the payment deadline and applying relief to interest on existing debt. The payment due date for current year individual, corporate, and trust income tax returns, including instalment payments, from September 1, 2020, to September 30, 2020. Penalties and interest will not be charged if payments are made by the extended deadline of September 30, 2020. This includes the late-filing penalty if the return is filed by September 30, 2020.

Interest on existing tax debts related to individual, corporate, and trust income tax returns from April 1, 2020, to September 30, 2020 and from April 1, 2020, to June 30, 2020, for goods and services tax/harmonized sales tax (GST/HST) returns will also be waived. While this measure for existing tax debts does not cancel penalties and interest already assessed on a taxpayer's account prior to this period, it ensures that a taxpayer's existing tax debt does not continue to grow through interest charges during this difficult time. This measure provides immediate relief to impacted taxpayers.

The previously extended filing due dates for individual, corporate, and trust income tax returns remain unchanged. However, the CRA will not impose late-filing penalties where a current year individual, corporation, or trust return is filed late if it is filed by September 30, 2020.

Remember to file your individual, corporate and trust returns as soon as possible, even though payment deadlines are being extended. This is particularly important for individuals receiving credits and benefits, such as the Canada Child Benefit.



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
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Breton Municipal Library Announces Availability of Non-Medical Masks



These masks are part of the Masks for Albertans program and coordinated by Alberta Municipal Affairs Public Library Services Branch.



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
