

Counselling Subsidies

Starting in September. Breton and Area FCSS is pleased to offer Counselling Subsidies.

A subsidy is available for individuals, couples and/or families who are struggling with common, everyday issues to access short-term preventative counselling services. The goal is to:

Improve relationships with better communication and conflict resolution skills;

Improve mood with anger management and emotional support;

Enhance personal growth with creativity, spirituality, self-esteem, self-awareness, goal setting;

Improve parenting skills by focusing on attachment;

Reduce stress with life balance; and/or Learn new skills and behaviors

The cost of counselling can be a barrier for many individuals and families. This subsidy is available to those who do not have access to coverage through health benefits or employee benefits, such as an Employee Assistance Plan (EAP), and whose family income is less than \$75,000 per year. Fees are determined according to a sliding scale based on income and family size. Fees range from \$15 per session to \$55 per session. The maximum number of sessions available is seven for individuals and nine for couples or families. Counselling services are provided through a partnership with Karunia Counselling from Leduc.

We know that in this current environment many may have additional stress and anxiety. We also know that transportation may be an added barrier. These sessions can be arranged to be in person in the Karunia offices in Leduc, over the phone in your own safe environment or virtually on your computer.

To apply for the subsidy services, application forms are available through the Breton FCSS Office at 4916 50th Avenue or by contacting them at fcss@breton.ca or calling 780-696-3636.

Breton and Area FCSS will be doing the intake of the applications. Counselling services are provided by Karunia Counselling by Registered Psychologists, Registered Provisional Psychologists, Canadian Certified Counsellors and Masters or PhD level student interns under the supervision of a qualified psychologist. All applications will be kept in strict confidence. This program is being made available through funding from the Government of Canada's Emergency Support Fund, the Drayton Valley Community Foundation and Breton and Area FCSS.

The Bible Truth Page From Tyler Untinen

Hello to all readers, from Tyler Untinen and family. We have been doing some extensive studying of the Word of God, and have made some awesome, amazing and exciting discoveries that we would like to share with you. The topic for this week is:

What is God's Will Concerning Healing?

The answer is simple, God's will is that all would be in good health all the time, and I can prove it from His own word. I will start with Exodus 15:26 in the last part of the verse God identified himself as **"the Lord that healeth thee"**. When God brought his people out of Egypt **"there was not one feeble person among their tribes"** Psalm 105:37. There were about 600 000 men besides children that left Egypt, Exodus 12:37, and no body was sick or weak. There are several healings recorded in the Old Testament but I would like to look at the New testament now.

We can know God's will by looking at what Jesus did because as He said in John 6:38 "For I came down from heaven, not to do mine own will, but the will of him that sent me." And Jesus said in Hebrews 10:7 "Then said I, Lo, I come (in the volume of the book it is written of me,) to do thy will, O God." So what did Jesus do while he was on earth? Acts 10:38 sums it up "How God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Ghost and with power: who went about doing good, and healing all that were oppressed of the devil; for God was with him" Notice that it says he HEALED ALL THAT WERE OPPRESSED OF THE DEVIL. Matthew 4:24 "And his fame went throughout all Syria: and they brought unto him all sick people that were taken with divers diseases and torments, and those which were possessed with devils, and those which where lunatic, and those that had the palsy; and he healed them."

Matthew 12:15 "But when Jesus knew it, he withdrew himself from thence: and great multitudes followed him, and he healed them all;" In Luke 19:10 Jesus said "For the Son of man is come to seek and to save that which was lost". The word save in this verse is translated from the Greek word "sozo" which is defined in the Strongs Concordance as: to save, that is deliver or protect, heal, preserve, save, make whole. So according to Luke 19:10 Jesus came to seek and to save and HEAL the lost. The Greek word "sozo" is also used in John 3:15-17 "That whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have eternal life. For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved." Did you see that?!! "that the world through him might be saved", saved is "sozo" saved and healed!!! That is exactly what Jesus did. He saved and healed people and he did it because it is the Father's will.

As Jesus said, he came to do the Father's will, and that is exactly what he was doing when he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed of the devil. Here is another place where Jesus said why he came. John 10:10 "The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly." Sickness and disease is not abundant life, health and healing is abundant life!! I would also like to add that "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever," Hebrews 13:8. Jesus healed then and now.
