Helping someone who may be suicidal If someone you know:


- o shows changes in behaviour, appearance, or mood

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

About three years ago, the corporate review found our County lacking in "due diligence" regarding a donation made to the town of Drayton Valley. It concerned an \$800 thousand gift for the refurbishment of a building to be the Eleanor Pickup Art Centre.

The reason for the "due diligence" issues was that the County didn't check out the building to be sure it was fixable (engineer's report). Nor did they confirm the value of the project or set up an oversight committee, nor was there an "out" clause in an agreement.

Unfortunately, the Municipal Government Act (MGA) doesn't provide for penalties for such oversight.

On Monday, August 24, 2020, the County held an unadvertised special meeting (topic not disclosed online) to deal with a proposed swimming pool issue. Here are some of the problems with this situation:

- a. The issue was discussed in "private" in spite of not involving land, labour, or legal issues:
- b. NO data was provided to the public as the proposed cost;
- c. No data was provided as to the source of project capital;
- d. No data on the viability of the project; i.e., user fees;
- e. No oversight provisions/committee
- f. No projected maintenance/operator costs and who pays for cost shortfalls.

Originally, this project was determined to cost \$30 million.

Should not a decision on a project of this size have been advertised for months in ad-

vance?

- Should there not be several public meetings for ratepayers' input?
- Should there not be a plebiscite as to the willingness of the public to pay for this project?

Since there are very few (if any) pool operations that are self-sufficient, it seems prudent to consider a shuttle to Stony Plain pool (a moneylosing project supported by THREE jurisdictions). Interest alone on \$30 million would pay for such a service and would/could take every resident of the County to that facility.

If this does not appear to be "... lack of due diligence," what would? Four councillors voted for this project. Check the minutes as to who they are and how they answer the above issues.





Counselling Subsidies

 Starting in September. Breton and Area FCSS is pleased to offer Counselling Subsidies.

A subsidy is available for individuals, couples and/ or families who are struggling with common, everyday issues to access short-term preventative counselling services. The goal is to:

- Improve relationships with better communication and conflict resolution skills:
- o Improve mood with anger management and emotional support;
- o Enhance personal growth with creativity, spirituality, self-esteem, self-awareness, goal setting;
- o Improve parenting skills by focusing on attachment;
- o Reduce stress with life balance; and/or
- Learn new skills and behaviors

The cost of counselling can be a barrier for many individuals and families. This subsidy is available to those who do not have access to coverage through health benefits or employee benefits, such as an Employee Assistance Plan (EAP), and whose family income is less than \$75,000 per year. Fees are determined according to a sliding scale based on income and family size. Fees range from \$15 per session to \$55 per session. The maximum number of sessions available is seven for individuals and nine for couples or families. Counselling services are provided through a partnership with Karunia Counselling from Leduc.

We know that in this current environment many may have additional stress and anxiety. We also know that transportation may be an added barrier. These sessions can be arranged to be in person in the Karunia offices in Leduc, over the phone in your own safe environment or virtually on your computer.

To apply for the subsidy services, application forms are available through the Breton FCSS Office at

4916 50th Avenue or by contacting them at fcss@ breton.ca or calling 780-696-3636. ALL APPLICATIONS ARE STRICTLY CONFIDENTIAL.

Breton and Area FCSS will be doing the intake of the applications. Counselling services are provided by Karunia Counselling by Registered Psychologists, Registered Provisional Psychologists, Canadian Certified Counsellors and Masters or PhD level student interns under the supervision of a qualified psychologist. All applications will be kept in strict confidence. This program is being made available through funding from the Government of Canada's Emergency Support Fund, the Drayton Valley Community Foundation and Breton and Area FCSS.

"Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me. I am the vine you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in Him, bears much fruit, for without Me you can do nothing." John 15:4-5

Stuart Briscoe, author and long-time pastor of Elmbrook Church in Brookfield, Wisconsin, tells about the time he traveled to Poland during the cold war. He was involved in several weeks of itinerant ministry, and one winter day his sponsors drove him in the dead of night to the middle of nowhere. Briscoe walked into a dilapidated building crammed with one hundred young people.

It was a unique opportunity, and through an interpreter he preached from John 15 on abiding in Christ. Ten minutes into his message, the lights went out. It was pitch black.

His interpreter urged him to keep talking, and so he did. Unable to see his notes or read his Bible, he continued. Then, after he had preached in the dark for twenty minutes, the lights suddenly blinked on, and what he saw startled him: everyone was on their knees, and they remained there for the rest of his message.

The next day Briscoe commented on this to one man, and the man said, "After you left, we stayed on our knees most of the night. Your teaching was new to us. We wanted to make sure we were abiding in Christ."

Infrastructure Canada Grant Awarded to New Aquatic Facility Project in Drayton Valley

EDSON, AB: Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, Gerald Soroka is pleased to inform constituents that he attended a federal funding announcement to build a new Aquatic Facility in Drayton Valley. Minister of Infrastructure, the Honourable Catherine McKenna was virtually in attendance. Physically present were: His Worship Michael Doerksen, Mayor of the Town of Drayton Valley, Alberta Minister of Infrastructure Prasad Panda, Mark Smith, MLA for Drayton Valley—Devon and Reeve Bart Guyon of Brazeau County. Member of Parliament Gerald Soroka thanks all representatives that were in attendance for this announcement.

Just over \$7.5 million in federal funding will be used to build a new Net-Zero Aquatic Facility, including a six-lane pool, 25-metre lap pool, leisure pool, and lazy river. It will also have a steam room, hot tub, multi-purpose room, and change rooms. In addition to providing residents with a new hub for fun and fitness, the facility will be heated with waste heat recovered from a nearby hockey arena, giving it a netzero energy balance. This use of renewable energy will cause no harmful emissions while also significantly reducing long-term operating costs.

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
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MLA REPORT

from The Office of MLA Mark Smith, Member of the Legislative Assembly for Drayton Valley - Devon

In the 2019 Provincial Election the United Conservative Party ran on a platform of reducing government spending by trying to find about 3 cents of savings for every dollar spent by the government. The debt under the previous government had grown to close to \$63 billion dollars, the economy was in a recession and who ever was elected was going to have to start to address the debt and government spending. Between finding efficiencies and growing the economy the UCP government believed it could eventually have a balanced budget and then begin looking at how best to reduce the debt that the government had accrued.

Alberta has been hit especially hard by the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, the oil price crash and an already weakened economy. On August 27, 2020 the Minister of Finance presented Albertans with a provincial update and the fiscal reality that Albertans must now face is serious indeed. Here are some of the numbers you need to know:

Revenue is down

- Resource revenue has dropped drastically to \$1.2 billion a \$3.9 billion decrease.
- Bitumen royalties of \$686 million are forecast, \$2.5 billion lower.
- Personal income tax revenue is forecast at \$10.7 billion a \$1.9 billion decrease.
- Corporate income tax is forecast at \$2.1 billion which is \$2.4 billion lower.
- Total Revenue is projected to be \$38.4 billion a decline of \$11.5 billion or 23% from Budget 2020.

The Deficit and Debt are up

- The yearly deficit now sits at \$24.2 billion
 \$16.8 billion higher than estimated in Budget 2020.
- Alberta now faces a debt burden of \$99.6 billion, or \$22,400 per Albertan.
- Interest payments on the debt have increased by \$21 million and is a net \$154 million higher.

The Economy is struggling

- Manufacturing shipments and goods exports are down 20%.
- Non-Energy exports are down more than 10%.
- Drilling rig activity is down nearly 80% on a year to year basis.
- Investment in oil and gas extraction is forecast to fall by over \$8 billion or more than 30%.

When the Premier told Albertans that a time of economic reckoning was coming he was not exaggerating. Albertans have not faced these kinds of economic times since the "Great Depression". But we are not without hope! Albertans are a hard-working, entrepreneurial people who are prepared to pull together, address the problems set before them and work to overcome our challenges. That was the message of the Finance Minister in his update to Albertans. We will face the challenges, we will work towards living within our means and we will work hard to grow the economy and provide a pathway of hope for all Albertans.

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
