Healthy Communities Initiative Open Call for Applications

OTTAWA: Gerald Soroka Member of Parliament for Yellowhead wishes to advise that Infrastructure Canada has launched an open call to non-governmental not-for-profit organizations who will work directly with municipalities, local governments, Indigenous communities and not-for-profit community partners to identify and fund local projects through the Canada Healthy Communities Initiative.

Organizations with existing capacity and reach can participate in this open call for applications. Eligibility requirements include having national reach, experience with the delivery of programs and/or community grants, a mandate that aligns with advancing, strengthening and supporting communities, and established networks and expertise working at the community level in Canada.

Potential projects could include: supporting main street business associations to adapt seating arrangements, modifying recreational facilities to accommodate for physical distancing, building popup passage ways for bikes, scooters, and personal mobility devices to allow citizens to move around their communities safely, or developing apps or other digital tools to allow residents to access services remotely.

Intake for local projects will begin only after the organization(s) is/are selected and their Canada Healthy Communities Initiative funding program is established.

Organizations will have until October 16, 2020 to submit their applications.

A call for proposals for specific projects under the Healthy Communities Initiative will come at a later date.

Dear Editor:

At a recent Warburg Surface Rights meeting, our County Reeve, Bart Guyon, spoke. He reiterated that he was looking for an alternate solution to the Provincial Government proposals for the linear tax situation.

The solution is simple! Any and all resources belong to the citizens. They do NOT belong to those that exploit them; therefore, any benefit from their extraction must be to the owners—US.

He also stated that ". . . oil and gas profits sometimes leave the country . . ." This has been known for decades. It probably goes back to the 1920s when foreign interests became involved in the industry.

If you are interested in where more recent profits have gone (and under whose watch), you might want to read FOLLOW THE MONEY by Kevin Taft (Kevin Taft, PHD, Professor of Business at University of Alberta, former MLA-Alberta Legislature).

Unfortunately, it is no surprise that Norway has in excess of \$1.3 trillion in their bank account (at last reading that this writer saw). Their source of money was from the same resource (oil and gas) as Alberta with the same world price and a similar population.

Mr. Guyon, the answer is simple: get up to Edmonton and inform the appropriate ministers that the tax stays! It has probably been extremely low for a long time: therefore, any changes should be an increase.

The oil and gas industry has already received about \$4.5 billion tax break. How much more do they need?



Counselling Subsidies – Starting in September. Breton and Area FCSS is pleased to offer Counselling Subsidies. A subsidy is available for individuals, couples and/or families who are struggling with common, everyday issues to access short-term preventative counselling services. The goal is to:

- o Improve relationships with better communication and conflict resolution skills;
- o Improve mood with anger management and emotional support;
- o Enhance personal growth with creativity, spirituality, self-esteem, self-awareness, goal setting;
- o Improve parenting skills by focusing on attachment;
- o Reduce stress with life balance; and/or
- Learn new skills and behaviors

The cost of counselling can be a barrier for many individuals and families. This subsidy is available to those who do not have access to coverage through health benefits or employee benefits, such as an Employee Assistance Plan (EAP), and whose family income is less than \$75,000 per year. Fees are determined according to a sliding scale based on income and family size. Fees range from \$15 per session to \$55 per session. The maximum number of sessions available is seven for individuals and nine for couples or families. Counselling services are provided through a partner-ship with Karunia Counselling from Leduc. We know

that in this current environment many may have additional stress and anxiety. We also know that transportation may be an added barrier. These sessions can be arranged to be in person in the Karunia offices in Leduc, over the phone in your own safe environment or virtually on your computer. To apply for the subsidy services, application forms are available through the Breton FCSS Office at 4916 50th Avenue or by contacting them at fcss@breton.ca or calling 780-696-3636. ALL APPLICATIONS ARE STRICTLY CON-FIDENTIAL. Breton and Area FCSS will be doing the intake of the applications. Counselling services are provided by Karunia Counselling by Registered Psychologists, Registered Provisional Psychologists, Canadian Certified Counsellors and Masters or PhD level student interns under the supervision of a qualified psychologist. All applications will be kept in strict confidence. This program is being made available through funding from the Government of Canada's Emergency Support Fund, the Drayton Valley Community Foundation and Breton and Area FCSS.

IS GOD A LIAR?

I have detailed in the first two The Bible Truth Page articles how it is God's will that people should be healthy and free from sickness and disease. God declares himself to be our healer in Exodus 15:26 "I am the Lord that healeth thee." In his book, The Family of God, Batsell Barrett Baxter says the following:

"There are some who think of the church as an organization like other organizations. It is true that the church is an organization, but it is not primarily an organization. The Christian's loyalty to Church, however, should be unique, for in reality it is a loyalty to Christ Himself and His way of life. The church is like no other institution on earth and a person's membership in the church is like no other membership which he may sustain. The church is more like a vibrant, living organism, than it is like a cold, structured organization...

Some make the mistake of thinking that the church...exists for the entertainment and enjoyment of its members. On the contrary, the church exists in order that its members may have an intimate relationship with God, as well as a close relationship with mankind."

Paul gives us a wonderful picture of the church at it's best in 2nd Corinthians 13:11; "Finally, brethren, farewell. Become complete. Be of good comfort, be of one mind, live in peace, and the God of love and peace will be with you." That should be the desire and mission of every church. Love God and love one another.



Second World War Tribute Program

OTTAWA: Gerald Soroka Member of Parliament for Yellowhead wishes to advise that Veterans Affairs Canada's Second World War Tribute program, a symbol of our country's enduring pride and gratitude to all those who served, will receive a commemorative lapel pin and certificate of recognition to any living Canadian or Newfoundland Second World War Veteran.

The Second World War Tribute program concludes at the end of 2020, roughly coinciding with the 75th anniversary of the end of the war. The goal is to have as many Second World War Veterans as possible receive the tribute.

I encourage all Veterans organizations in the Yellowhead riding to identify living Canadian Second World War Veterans who have not already received the tribute.

Veterans that qualify for the Second World War Tribute can submit their application (individuals can also submit applications on behalf of a Veteran). Misplaced Second World War Tributes can be replaced by submitting another application.

The design of the commemorative lapel pin is based on the original "Victory Nickel", a coin that was circulated from 1943 until 1945 and re-issued in 2005 to commemorate the 60th anniversary of V-E Day. The coin featured a flaming torch and large "V", which stood for both victory and the coin's value in Roman numerals.

Re-opening of Community United Church

For nearly six months our church building and congregation have been without the comfort of each other. We've grieved a bit, for the gatherings we've missed, the goodbye to Rev. Bert that looked nothing like we had so hoped for, the absence of those jovial greetings as we step through the church doors.

Government permission to worship in buildings does not mean everything is stable – it means we have permission to take our own risks. Our Re-opening Committee has spent many thoughtful hours of research, walking through each step of arrival, worship and departure to prepare a safe environment to allow our congregation to return to the sanctuary for worship. The guidelines for Community United Church align with recommendations from Alberta Health Services, Government of Alberta and United Church of Canada.

Re-entry at Community United Church will be slightly familiar and greatly different. Knowing that familiarity comforts us, and that this experience may upset or traumatize us, the committee is hopeful that this information will help each of you become familiar with our new routine.

Safety protocols at C.U.C. during pandemic DO NOT enter if you are experiencing any symptoms such as fever, cough, runny nose, sore throat, shortness of breath or if you have been in contact with someone with COVID-19. Respect the 2m. physical distancing guidelines. Use hand sanitizer upon entering the building. Wear a mask if you have one.

What to expect: ARRIVAL

If arriving at the same time as others, please take turns entering the church using the physical distancing lines on the cement pad outside and on the floor just inside the church door. Shaking hands and hugging should be avoided.

Upon entering the church a greeter will ask you to use the hand sanitizer, offer you a mask if you do not have one, and collect your name and phone number. This information is only used for contact tracing by Alberta Health Services should someone test positive for COVID-19.

As you enter the sanctuary please collect your individual communion cup from the table as you pass through to your seat in a pew. The offering plates for monetary gifts will be available here as well and you

may make your contribution as you arrive or depart.

Seating in the pews will be marked and should be filled from front to back to avoid overlapping of people who are not from the same household. Members of the same household may sit together at a marked spot.

What to expect: WORSHIP

The worship leader will lead the whole service on their own. Participation from the congregation as readers cannot be accommodated because of our space restrictions.

Because of higher risk, activities like singing and passing of the peace will be avoided at this time. The organist will be playing the tunes, albeit perhaps shortened versions – feel free to clap, tap or snap along!

Individual communion cups are available as you arrive, just inside the sanctuary door. Please pick one up as you enter. A plate will be available here as well, to collect any monetary gifts given – you may do so as you arrive or depart.

After worship service September 20th, a church board meeting will ensue after a short break. If you are getting up from your seat, please remember to try to keep the 2m. physical distancing between yourself and others not from your family group. Food and drink will not be offered, please bring your own bag lunch and beverage.

What to expect: DEPARTURE

At the conclusion of worship (for September 20th as the meeting ends), the pews will empty from back to front. As you leave, please remember to space yourselves for physical distancing and immediately exit the building.

At this time the re-opening committee will be dedicated to the cleaning regime after everyone has departed. As we develop a routine and habits, we will ask for other volunteers who feel they can offer a turn in the scheduling.

Arrive with grace, Engage with grace, Receive with grace, Respond with grace and Leave with grace.


