Are You Struggling? Do you need someone to listen to you without judging?

A subsidy is available for individuals, couples and/or families who are struggling with common, everyday issues to access short-term preventative counselling services. The goal is to:

- Improve relationships with better communication and conflict resolution skills;
- Improve mood with anger management and emotional support;
- Enhance personal growth with creativity, spirituality, self-esteem, self-awareness, goal setting;
- Improve parenting skills by focusing on attachment;
- Reduce stress with life balance; and/or
- Learn new skills and behaviors

The cost of counselling can be a barrier for many individuals and families. This subsidy is available to those who do not have access to coverage through health benefits or employee benefits, such as an Employee Assistance Plan (EAP), and whose family income is less than \$75,000 per year. Fees are determined according to a sliding scale based on income and family size. Fees range from \$15 per session to \$55 per session. The maximum number of sessions available is seven for individuals and nine for couples or families. Counselling services are provided through a partnership with Karunia Counselling from Leduc.

We know that in this current environment many may have additional stress and anxiety. We also know that transportation may be an added barrier. These sessions can be arranged to be in person in the Karunia offices in Leduc, over the phone in your own safe environment or virtually on your computer. To apply for the subsidy services, application forms are available through the Breton FCSS Office at 4916 50th Avenue or by contacting them at fcss@breton.ca or calling 780-696-3636. ALL APPLICATIONS ARE STRICTLY CONFIDENTIAL. Breton and Area FCSS will be doing the intake of the applications. Counselling services are provided by Karunia Counselling by Registered Psychologists, Registered Provisional Psychologists, Canadian Certified Counsellors and Masters or PhD level student interns under the supervision of a qualified psychologist. All applications will be kept in strict confidence.

This program is being made available through funding from the Government of Canada's Emergency Support Fund, the Drayton Valley Community Foundation and Breton and Area FCSS.

Additional Supports Through Breton & Area FCSS

Light Housekeeping Services for older adults and individuals that have a medical condition. Fees for service are based on household income and are on a sliding scale. Available to residents in the Village of Breton and Brazeau County in the communities of Buck Creek, Berrymoor, Lindale, Carnwood and Alsike. Travel fee may apply in Brazeau County.

Meals on Wheels – available to residents in the Village of Breton and within a 10 km radius of the Village of Breton within Brazeau County. Available Tuesdays and Thursdays for a lunchtime delivery by Volunteers. Meals are prepared at the Breton Healthcare Centre. **Assistance and Information on Income Tax for Low income individuals** and Families, GST, OAS, CPP and additional government benefit programs.

Dear Editor:

As there is a movement towards publishing "sunshine lists," the following information is provided as a basis for public discourse.

The numbers are taken from honoraria claims of Brazeau County Council from January to December of 2019. Any errors are entirely those of the writer.

Bart Guyon: Heidi Swann Donna Wiltse Anthony Heinrich Marc Gressler Kara Westerlund Sara Wheale \$103,435.53 \$61,774,47 \$60,979.43 \$55,482.16 \$49,552,81 \$39,000 (plus RMA) \$47,578.24

These numbers raise some interesting ideas/questions:

• These people are paid "portal to portal" (time + mileage); who else in society is? Plumbers? Lawyers? Store clerks? If there has been a change in the portal to portal, it is very recent.

Jobillico (stats collector) numbers are \$52,600 for full-time average for working people in Canada in 2019;

• NO qualifications or training required to be a councillor; only parenthood matches this;

Per diems--\$296 per day (portal to portal); this equals \$37 per hour (national average Stats Can for 2018 is \$26.83 per hour (overtime rates go berserk?);

• Up until this year, 1/3 of their honorarium was tax free;

• Resident concerns are an additional \$1595 per month—who decides what value this is to the taxpayer? Where is the data to support this amount?

• Telephone allowance is \$275 per month this writer's phone with 5Gig of data and unlimited cross-Canada calling is \$87 per month, including the cost of buying the phone;

Who decides the per diem amounts and who

approves the claims each month? Councillors do! Should there not be an arm's-length oversight for this?

What role does the Rural Municipalities Association (RMA) play in all of this? Taxpayers pay for its existence as well.

• Take in a council meeting sometime and see for yourself if there is value for the money or you may also like to talk to someone who has taken in a meeting or two;

• What other corporate entities place people in charge of a \$40 Million budget and an entire government document, the Municipal Government Act (MGA), to administer without appropriate credentials?

• Why is there no oversight regarding the following policy; i.e., reports from out-of-province conferences?

Compare the above to your own work situation.

Ask your councillor how he or she justifies these numbers. More on all of this later.

This bomb was tested above the Arctic Circle on October 30, 1961. The explosion was so intense that the flash was visible over 600 miles away. People felt the air move over 160 miles away. Everything in a radius of 15.25 miles was completely destroyed. Very severe damage extended to a distance of 21.5 miles & the heat was so intense that people over 60 miles away would have experienced third degree burns if anyone had been there. All this came from a bomb that was a little over 26 feet long & with a diameter of a little over 6 feet. It was large to be sure, but it was tiny when you look at the power it packed. The point was that a small package can deliver an absolutely incredible punch. The same is true of sin, many people view it as, "no big deal," but God sees sin as a monster that brings incredible harm to those who are involved in it.


WHY DOESN'T EVERYONE GET HEALED?

MP REPORT from The Office of MP Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead

Improved Process to Notify Air Travellers Potentially Exposed to COVID-19 on Domestic Flights

OTTAWA: Gerald Soroka Member of Parliament for Yellowhead wishes to advise that Transport Canada, provincial and territorial governments, public health authorities, and Canada's largest air carriers have established a consistent approach for air carriers to collect and share passenger information necessary to alert Canadians of possible COVID-19 exposure while travelling by air, in compliance with applicable privacy legislation. This would facilitate timely contact tracing and exposure notification for passengers on domestic flights.

The national enhanced notification allows contact tracing to be done in a more consistent manner across all jurisdictions. If a public health authority deems it necessary to conduct contact tracing by notifying passengers directly of possible COVID-19 exposure, complete and accurate passenger contact information will be readily available from Canada's largest air carriers.

Provincial and territorial public health authorities maintain authority and decision-making over contact tracing while the Public Health Agency of Canada provides guidance.

As part of the improved process, passengers will be asked to provide contact information when they check-in for their flight with large Canadian air carriers.
