



A subsidy is available for individuals, couples and/or families who are struggling with common, everyday issues to access short-term preventative counselling services. The goal is to:

- o Improve relationships with better communication and conflict resolution skills:
- o Improve mood with anger management and emotional support;
- o Enhance personal growth with creativity, spirituality, self-esteem, self-awareness, goal setting;
- Improve parenting skills by focusing on attachment;
- o Reduce stress with life balance; and/or
- o Learn new skills and behaviors

The cost of counselling can be a barrier for many individuals and families. This subsidy is available to those who do not have access to coverage through health benefits or employee benefits, such as an Employee Assistance Plan (EAP), and whose family income is less than \$75,000 per year. Fees are determined according to a sliding scale based on income and family size. Fees range from \$15 per session to \$55 per session.

The maximum number of sessions available is seven for individuals and nine for couples or families.

Counselling services are provided through a partnership with Karunia Counselling from Leduc. We know that in this current environment many may have additional stress and anxiety. We also know that transportation may be an added barrier. These sessions can be arranged to be in person in the Karunia offices in Leduc, over the phone in your own safe environment or virtually on your computer. To apply for the subsidy services, application forms are available through the Breton FCSS Office at 4916 50th Avenue or by contacting them at fcss@breton.ca or calling 780-696-3636. ALL APPLICATIONS ARE STRICTLY CONFIDENTIAL. Breton and Area FCSS will be doing the intake of the applications. Counselling services are provided by Karunia Counselling by Registered Psychologists, Registered Provisional Psychologists, Canadian Certified Counsellors and Masters or PhD level student interns under the supervision of a qualified psychologist. All applications will be kept in strict confidence. This program is being made available through funding from the Government of Canada's Emergency Support Fund, the Drayton Valley Community Foundation and Breton and Area FCSS.

HOME ALONE - Online Course - This safety program is ideally suited for children aged 9-12 years old. Safety and accident prevention are the common themes throughout the program. The information is relevant and current to today's young learners. Course content includes:

Street smarts and bike safety, People safety ("Tricky People" and Safe strangers), Online and internet safety, Snacking and kitchen safety, Home fire safety, Sibling rivalry, Preventing accidents, How to handle emergencies and other situations, Basic first aid skills. Cost-\$10 - two weeks to complete from the time of registration. Please contact our office to register for the course. Payment can be made at our office or on your credit card through Option Pay on our website at www.breton.ca

Programs and Services through Breton and Area FCSS

Home Support Services – light house keeping service for older adults and individuals that have a medical condition. Fees for service are based on household income and are on a sliding scale. Available to residents in the Village of Breton and Brazeau County in the communities of Buck Creek, Berrymoor, Lindale, Carnwood and Alsike. Travel fee may apply in Brazeau County.

Meals on Wheels – available to residents in the Village of Breton and within a 10 km radius of the Village of Breton within Brazeau County. Available Tuesdays and Thursdays for a lunchtime delivery by Volunteers. Meals are prepared at the Breton Healthcare Centre.



The Bible Truth Page #5

Was Paul Sick?

I have heard it said that Paul was sick and that God would not heal him. Where does that idea come from? Certainly not from the Bible. Paul wrote in 2 Corinthians 12:7-10 '7 And lest I should be exalted above measure through the abundance of the revelations, there was given to me a thorn in the flesh, the messenger of Satan to buffet me, lest I should be exalted above measure. 8 For this thing I besought the Lord thrice, that it might depart from me. 9 And he said unto me, My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness. Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me. 10 Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in necessities, in persecutions, in distresses for Christ's sake: for when I am weak, then am I strong.' In 2 Corinthians chapter 11 and 12 Paul is listing off many troubles, and persecutions, that he suffered as a minister of the gospel. Some of which are: stripes above measure, imprisonment, beatings with rods, he was stoned (with rocks) and left for dead, shipwrecked three times, 24 hours in the sea, trouble from various men, wilderness, and in sea. He never once mentioned that he was ever sick. WHAT DOES HE CALL ALL OF THESE THINGS THAT HE SUFFERED? He calls it a thorn in the flesh, the messenger of Satan to buffet him. The expression thorn in the flesh does NOT represent sickness. As used in the Bible it always refers to persecutions from people, which is also the way Paul used it. See Numbers 33:55, and Joshua 23:13, Judges 2:3.

The **messenger of Satan** is a demon spirit that was sent from Satan to buffet him. Buffet means to hit over, and over again. This all fits with the context of what Paul was writing in chapter 11, and 12 of 2 Corinthians. All the persecutions that he received at the hand of man where provoked by the messenger of Satan. No mention of sickness. Infirmities, and weakness mentioned in verses 9 and 10 above, applied in context and in reference to the Greek word it is translated from, is referring to the physical and mental weakness which was brought on by the persecutions Paul suffered at the hands of men.

God did not say that he would not heal Paul. Paul was not sick. God said that 'My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness.' As we can see from Paul's comment on that statement from God, Paul understood that the power of Christ would rest upon him during persecutions and that it would be enough to get him through it. Again in verse 10 we see that Paul takes pleasure in persecutions which weaken him because then he gets strength from the power of Christ. As we can now see, when we read the Bible in context, the word of God becomes much more clear, and easy to understand. It is very obvious that this passage of scripture is not implying that Paul was sick, and it also fits in with the rest of the word of God that details the will of God for all to be healed and in good health.

Decorticator Coming to Drayton

After many years of continued advocacy I am proud to say we will officially be welcoming a decorticator facility to the Drayton Valley area as early as next month! One of the mandates given to our government by the people of this province was a need to increase resource and job diversification. Since first becoming a MLA in 2015, I have been working hard to create investment opportunities in our constituency. We have always known that the loam filled soil found in Alberta creates great farming opportunities but not many know that one of the crops grown most effectively in and around our constituency is the hemp plant. Hemp has an immense array of uses and can be processed and manufactured into a truly overwhelming amount of different products. Since the legalization of its cousin, cannabis, farmers and regulators have been taking a closer look at the hemp plant and its potential. As of 2017, Alberta was considered the second highest hemp producer in Canada, just behind Saskatchewan, with 325 Albertan producers having obtained their license to grow industrial hemp. A number that has only continued to grow as profits from this incredibly hardy crop are realized.

Unfortunately, while the plant grows exceedingly well in Alberta, it is incredibly tough to harvest. The average logging machine or farming equipment does not have the capacity to break down the sturdy outside of the hemp stalks which is why it calls for specific processing equipment. A decorticator machine is specially designed to cut through the incredibly tough woody exterior of the hemp plant and produce two main components, both with their own uses.

The biggest set back faced by the hemp industry in Alberta has been the lack of decorticator facilities, which is why recent investment in the Drayton Valley area is so exciting. The Bio-Composites Group (BCG) helped to establish the Bio-Mile several years ago, complete with headquarters and a production plant which manufactures wood fibre mats and other organic products. It is here at Bio-Comkposites Group that a new decorti-

cator system is being added. The opening of this new facility signals a whole new type of industry market for the community and will help create work and opportunities for local families. In the past, Bio-Composites Group received hemp fibres all the way from Europe, but with the installation of a decorticator, Drayton Valley will be the first facility in North America able to process and turn local hemp into usable material. The facility has received all the necessary equipment and management is anticipating production to begin taking place within the month! The community has received many benefits from the establishment of the facility, and this next stage will be no different.

The community of Drayton Valley gladly welcomes the new decorticator facility and we look forward to seeing how green technology can continue to contribute to our town and its future.
