If you make a written submission, the information you provide may be made public, subject to the provisions of the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*.



Seventy Years of the Class of 1950

On Saturday, September 5th, I had the privilege of attending the Thorsby High School's graduating class of 1950 gathered to celebrate their 70th high school reunion. In addition to this milestone celebration, they were celebrating another milestone; the 100th birthday of their teacher, Mr. William Moysa.

As I walked into the hall, the entire place buzzed with excitement. Friends from bygone years were catching up; filling the entire room with anticipation and joy as they caught up on each other's lives and reminisced of younger days.

The festivities began with an opening word from Mrs. Phyllis Madiuk-which included the introduction of the day's honourable guests; Drayton Valley-Devon MLA, Mr. Mark Smith and his wife Lisa, the Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, Mr. Gerald Soroka and his wife Susan and the Mayor of Thorsby, Mr. Rod Raymond and his wife Sandy. After introductions were made, Mr. Mark Smith said a pre-lunch prayer.

While I assumed lunch would be something simple-such as soup and sandwiches, the ladies cooked up an absolute feast of coleslaw, cucumber salad, baked chicken, pork roast, potatoes and gravy, stuffing and dinner rolls to boot! Needless to say, I hardly needed to eat the rest of the day! After lunch was consumed, the official ceremony began with the singing of Oh Canada. After which, a toast was made to Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II.

Following the toast to Her Majesty, Mr. Mark Smith and Mr. Gerald Soroka proceeded to present Mr. Moysa with certificates commemorating his 100th birthday as well as a certificate commemorating the reunion itself from Mr. Soroka. Mrs. Eileen Warnock then gave an in memoriam in honour of those from the class

who have passed on, followed by a moment of silence. Mrs. Phyllis Madiuk then gave special recognition to a few of their former classmates.

Ending the day, was the much-anticipated remarks from their teacher, Mr. Moysa. Mr. Moysa started with telling of his working as a carpenter right after he graduated with his Master's degree and how he came to teach, first in a 1 room school in the Strawberry District, and soon thereafter, in the Thorsby High School.

He spoke of his years of teaching Science and Mathematics and going on to become principal in Calmar and eventually going to teach in the City of Edmonton.

In his remarks he told the class "we made sure you got the very best education we could give you. You are the people we thought you'd become and I am honoured that you'd celebrate my 100th birthday." As Mr. Moysa's remarks came to a close, the mic was then open to anyone who wanted to ask questions or make remarks. One of the former students asked "How did you get here?" To which Mr. Moysa, with a glimmer in his eye, stated "I drove myself [and] I plan to live as independently as I can for the rest of my life."

After closing remarks were made, cake was passed out and, while the ceremony came to a close, no one seemed at all in a hurry to leave. In the end, there was one remark spoken to me by Mrs. Susan Soroka which stood out the most, "It's so nice to be somewhere that is happy."

And, indeed, in the midst of the times which we are living, we must each grab onto and cherish each and every single moment of happiness that comes our way. Cherish your loved ones; family and friends alike for who knows what the next day holds. And remember where you've come from, for it is what shapes you into the person you become and launches you into the future ahead.

Thorsby RCMP Seek Assistance in Stolen Hot Tub Incident

The project

Capital Power is seeking regulatory approval to repower Genesee Units 1 and 2 to natural gas as a longer-term option for baseload power generation. The repowered assets will use some existing equipment combined with new best-in-class natural gas combined cycle (NGCC) technology. The repowering projects will be located entirely within the boundaries of the existing Genesee Generating Station.

Regulatory process and timeline

Stakeholder input is an important part of the process and we are seeking your feedback into this project through this Q&A session. There are details to the right with other ways you can provide input.

As part of the approval process for power plant projects in Alberta, Capital Power must submit two separate regulatory applications for project review to the Alberta Utilities Commission and Alberta Environment and Parks. 

Re-opening of Community United Church

For nearly six months our church building and congregation have been without the comfort of each other. We've grieved a bit, for the gatherings we've missed, the goodbye to Rev. Bert that looked nothing like we had so hoped for, the absence of those jovial greetings as we step through the church doors.

Government permission to worship in buildings does not mean everything is stable – it means we have permission to take our own risks. Our Re-opening Committee has spent many thoughtful hours of research, walking through each step of arrival, worship and departure to prepare a safe environment to allow our congregation to return to the sanctuary for worship. The guidelines for Community United Church align with recommendations from Alberta Health Services, Government of Alberta and United Church of Canada.

Re-entry at Community United Church will be slightly familiar and greatly different. Knowing that familiarity comforts us, and that this experience may upset or traumatize us, the committee is hopeful that this information will help each of you become familiar with our new routine.

Safety protocols at C.U.C. during pandemic DO NOT enter if you are experiencing any symptoms such as fever, cough, runny nose, sore throat, shortness of breath or if you have been in contact with someone with COVID-19. Respect the 2m. physical distancing guidelines. Use hand sanitizer upon entering the building. Wear a mask if you have one.

What to expect: ARRIVAL

If arriving at the same time as others, please take turns entering the church using the physical distancing lines on the cement pad outside and on the floor just inside the church door. Shaking hands and hugging should be avoided.

Upon entering the church a greeter will ask you to use the hand sanitizer, offer you a mask if you do not have one, and collect your name and phone number. This information is only used for contact tracing by Alberta Health Services should someone test positive for COVID-19.

As you enter the sanctuary please collect your individual communion cup from the table as you pass through to your seat in a pew. The offering plates for monetary gifts will be available here as well and you

may make your contribution as you arrive or depart.

Seating in the pews will be marked and should be filled from front to back to avoid overlapping of people who are not from the same household. Members of the same household may sit together at a marked spot.

What to expect: WORSHIP

The worship leader will lead the whole service on their own. Participation from the congregation as readers cannot be accommodated because of our space restrictions.

Because of higher risk, activities like singing and passing of the peace will be avoided at this time. The organist will be playing the tunes, albeit perhaps shortened versions – feel free to clap, tap or snap along!

Individual communion cups are available as you arrive, just inside the sanctuary door. Please pick one up as you enter. A plate will be available here as well, to collect any monetary gifts given – you may do so as you arrive or depart.

After worship service September 20th, a church board meeting will ensue after a short break. If you are getting up from your seat, please remember to try to keep the 2m. physical distancing between yourself and others not from your family group. Food and drink will not be offered, please bring your own bag lunch and beverage.

What to expect: DEPARTURE

At the conclusion of worship (for September 20th as the meeting ends), the pews will empty from back to front. As you leave, please remember to space yourselves for physical distancing and immediately exit the building.

At this time the re-opening committee will be dedicated to the cleaning regime after everyone has departed. As we develop a routine and habits, we will ask for other volunteers who feel they can offer a turn in the scheduling.

Arrive with grace, Engage with grace, Receive with grace, Respond with grace and Leave with grace.






