Hello again from West of the Fifth Law! Today I'm going to take a break from our four-part introductory series and take a moment to write about a question that I often hear: "Should I incorporate?"

Put simply, a Corporation is an entity, registered with the government, that has many of the same rights and responsibilities that a person does. Corporations are owned by shareholders and controlled by directors and provide a means for them to do business without exposing themselves to personal liability.

When executed properly, having a Corporation can protect the owners from the risk lawsuits that arise out of business operations. This means that when a Corporation is being sued the owners' homes and personal assets are generally safe from being taken in the lawsuit.

Corporations also provide a benefit of reduced taxes, and when coupled with good accounting and bookkeeping can help reduce the overall taxes paid on money earned by the Corporation. Once the Corporation pays taxes on the money it can then be disbursed to shareholders through dividends at a lower rate of personal income tax.

The downside to incorporating is primarily the cost. There are fees involved, both from the Government and our fee for legal services provided. Corporations require special tax returns which often requires hiring a certified accountant every year. Finally, there is an annual requirement to provide a report to the government, and requirements to have a registered office where you keep your books. We offer these services for \$250 plus GST, per year.

The short answer to whether you should incorporate or not is actually another question: Are the benefits of decreased risk of personal liability and lower tax rates worth the initial and ongoing costs of a corporation?

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Dear Editor:

After attending a County/Town meeting on Thursday, October 8, I feel compelled to inform the public of some observations. The broad categories of the good, the bad, and the ugly will be used over the course of two or three letters. Keep in mind the writer is a county resident.

THE GOOD: Kudos to County Councillors who turned down an expensive library proposal and used the words "look after County interests" and "efficiencies" several times. Some Town councillors seemingly used the idea of "efficiencies" as associated with amalgamation rather than economics.

More Kudos to County Councillors who were insistent on getting accountability for sums paid to the Town for the Omniplex and recreation. They had done some homework and discovered that the County pays three times for this facility as is paid in other jurisdictions. It's been at least 20 years since such an accountability was requested but never received.

Some years ago, several agreements were signed between the County and Town. I have read several, and it seemed to me that certain things were strangely absent from them all. First, there was no data provided to justify the money transfer. Second, there was no oversight of the use of the funds. Third, there was no "out" clause (sometimes called an escape clause). In other words, it was a one-way flow with no "due diligence" on the part of the County in awarding funds. (It has been noted that about one-half of Drayton Valley workers use County roads to get to work. No help to the County from Drayton Valley for this.) Needless to say, it's time to end the one-way flow. A recent reduction in the recreation grant is a step in the right direction.

It should be noted that both the Town of Drayton Valley and Brazeau County are incorporated under the laws of Alberta. As such, they undertake certain responsibilities and exercise certain powers. At NO time is the County obligated to contribute to the Town. The fact that the County has donated millions to Drayton Valley is a gift out of the goodness of their hearts.

Covenant Corner

from Pastor Jeff Gooderham

Thankfulness seems to be a lost art today. Warren Wiersby, illustrated this problem in his commentary on Colossians. He told about a ministerial student in Evanston, Illinois, who was part of a life-saving squad. In 1860, a ship went aground on the shore of Lake Michigan near Evanston, and Edward Spencer waded again and again into the frigid waters to rescue 17 passengers. In the process, his health was permanently damaged. Some years later at his funeral, it was noted that not one of the people he rescued ever thanked him.

There is a very similar story told in Luke chapter 17, ten men who were inflicted with the terrible disease leprosy, saw Jesus and cried out to Him to have mercy on them and heal them. He did, telling them to go and show themselves to the priest and as they went they were healed. Only one man, realizing that he was healed returned to give thanks to the one who showed him such mercy.

How often do we stop and just say thank you to the One who has given us life and offered to us the gift of eternal life? The apostle Paul reminds us in 1st Thessalonians 5:18; That we are "to give thanks in all circumstances for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus." A thankful heart is a joyful heart!



Counselling Subsidies – Breton and Area FCSS is pleased to offer Counselling Subsidies. Appointments can be in person (Leduc Office), Virtual or by Phone.

A subsidy is available for individuals, couples and/or families who are struggling with common, everyday issues to access short-term preventative counselling services. The goal is to:

- o Improve relationships with better communication and conflict resolution skills;
- o Improve mood with anger management and emotional support;
- o Enhance personal growth with creativity, spirituality, self-esteem, self-awareness, goal setting;
- o Improve parenting skills by focusing on attachment:
 - Reduce stress with life balance; and/or

Learn new skills and behaviors

The cost of counselling can be a barrier for many individuals and families. This subsidy is available to those who do not have access to coverage through health benefits or employee benefits, such as an Employee Assistance Plan (EAP), and whose family income is less than \$75,000 per year. Fees are determined according to a sliding scale based on income and family size. Fees range from \$15 per session to \$50 per session. The maximum number of sessions available is seven for individuals and nine for couples or families. Counselling services are provided through a partnership with Karunia Counselling from Leduc. We know that in this current environment many may have additional stress and anxiety. We also know that transportation may be an added barrier. These sessions can be arranged to be in person in the Karunia offices in Leduc, over the phone in your own safe environment or virtually on your computer. To apply for the subsidy services, application forms are available through the Breton FCSS Office at 4916 50th Avenue or by contacting them at fcss@breton.ca or calling 780-696-3636. ALL APPLICATIONS ARE STRICTLY CON-FIDENTIAL. Breton and Area FCSS will be doing the intake of the applications. Counselling services are provided by Karunia Counselling by Registered Psychologists, Registered Provisional Psychologists, Canadian Certified Counsellors and Masters or PhD level student interns under the supervision of a qualified psychologist. All applications will be kept in strict confidence. This program is being made available through funding from the Government of Canada's Emergency Support Fund, the Drayton Valley Community Foundation and Breton and Area FCSS.

Programs and Services through **Breton and Area FCSS**

Home Support Services – light house keeping service for older adults and individuals that have a medical condition. Fees for service are based on household income and are on a sliding scale. Available to residents in the Village of Breton and Brazeau County in the communities of Buck Creek, Berrymoor, Lindale, Carnwood and Alsike. Travel fee may apply in Brazeau County.

Meals on Wheels - available to residents in the Village of Breton and within a 10 km radius of the Village of Breton within Brazeau County. Available Tuesdays and Thursdays for a lunchtime delivery by Volunteers. Meals are prepared at the Breton Healthcare Centre. Assistance and Information on Income Tax for Low income individuals and Families, GST, OAS, CPP and additional government benefit programs.



If God Is Good Why Is There So Much Evil In The World?

When God created the heaven and earth he said that it was very good. Genesis 1:31 'And God saw every thing that he had made, and, behold, it was very good'. So what happened? Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow his steps: Who did no sin, neither was guile found in his mouth: Who, when he was reviled, reviled not again; when he suffered, he threatened not; but committed himself to him that judgeth righteously: Who his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: BY WHOSE STRIPES YE WERE HEALED. For ye were as sheep going astray; but are now returned unto the Shepherd and Bishop of your souls.' Jesus gave his life in exchange for ours. He suffered death on our behalf. All we have to do to receive the benefit of his sacrifice is give up our own way of life, and live the rest of our life on earth for Him, making him our Lord. Romans 10:9 'That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved. For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession in made unto salvation.

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



