How does this all work?

The Warburg Legion invites all schools in our local area which include Breton Elementary, Breton High School, The Warburg School, The Warburg Colony School and those who are home schooling to compete in the Poster and Literacy Contest during our Poppy Campaign.

Our contest covers Primary, Junior, Intermediate and Senior categories to enter entries in Color Poster, Black and White Poster, and Literacy that includes Poetry and Essays. Once we have received entries from all our participants, Posters and Literacy entries are judged for a first, second and third place from each school. They all receive a monetary prize. Our first-place entries, in all categories, are then sent into District Level and Provincial Level. At the Provincial level they submit their winners to Ottawa for judging at National level. 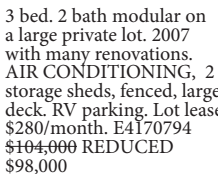

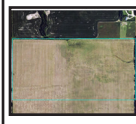

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Dear Editor:

The following is the third installment of "the good, the bad, and the ugly."

THE UGLY: There were two incidents during the meeting of October 8 between the County and the Town that caught my attention. One was a "personal" attack on the Reeve as he was explaining the County situation, and the other was a Town member walking out in apparent disgust when a County councillor was presenting a County proposal. Strange behaviour when one of their objectives appeared to be to get more money from the County.

The Town seems to forget that the County donated 10 quarter sections to the Town about 12 years ago. An additional 27 quarters were added recently. These quarters contained businesses that pay tens of thousands of tax dollars to the Town.

When is it enough? The County has 1100 kilometres of roads to maintain, and some are in poor shape. We still do not have a year-round toxic collection, but we have \$5 million for a pool (luxury). The town has how many properties under foreclosure, many empty retail spaces, and a rental vacancy rate, but they have \$5 million for a pool. No proposals have been provided for how funding for operations and maintenance will be provided. To my understanding, there has been no evidence brought forward as to its viability. The County should not get involved in this extravaganza.

I believe it was stated that the Town needs \$600,000 to meet its current obligations. The solution is simple—cancel its pool plans and use that money to pay debt. The pool is totally a luxury item that is almost guaranteed to run a deficit. Who will pay for the deficit? It is obvious to this writer that operational obligations outweigh a luxury pool.

With regard to the recent donation of \$5 million by the County for a pool project, it should be noted that NOT a single public meeting was held by the County to determine resident interest in this project. This project was dropped about 10 years ago due to inadequate public interest, and times were better then.

This writer (among others) has stated many times that expenditures of this magnitude (especially for luxury items) should go to plebiscite and public meetings.

Other counties are known to hold 3 or 4 public meetings a year in advance of such decisions. They do this for essential items as well.

Given the number of times that citizens have requested public meetings on controversial items, perhaps it is time to make sure that those who voted in favour of this project not be re-elected.

The process taken to push the pool project is unconscionable.

The County should distance itself from this pool proposal.

Brazeau County Responds to Linear Assessment Decision

BRAZEAU COUNTY, October 26, 2020 — Brazeau County Council appreciates the recent decision by the Alberta government to find middle ground in its decision regarding changes to linear assessment and the taxes paid to municipalities.

The decision to decrease the assessment of lower-producing wells, offer a three-year tax holiday for new oil and gas infrastructure, and eliminate the well drilling equipment tax will reduce Brazeau County revenues by \$733,630 per year (3% of total property tax revenue). This is a significant impact, but Council applauds Municipal Affairs Minister Tracy Allard for rejecting the original four scenarios considered by the government that would have resulted in severe outcomes for many municipalities, including Brazeau County.

Council is also gratified to see that Minister Allard has listened to municipalities, and supports Brazeau County's localized approach. Reeve Bart Guyon met earlier this fall with representatives of the oil and gas, service sectors, as well as Minister Allard to come up with ways to work together to maintain the viability of both industry and the municipality.

"We're proud that Minister Allard is encouraging other municipalities to follow in our footsteps by focusing on core services and reducing taxes and red tape," says Reeve Bart Guyon. "Brazeau County believes that by leaving money in the pockets of our citizens, they can make their own choices on how to spend that savings, whether on recreation or roads, or anything else in between. If we all share in the pain, we may all be able to share in the gain after these current crises."

Guyon adds: "We're proud to have such engaged and passionate residents, who added their voices to many others in rural Alberta rejecting the original four disastrous proposals. Your voices were heard loud and clear, and I believe it helped steer the government toward this milder, more targeted approach to balance the needs of rural municipalities and our oil and gas industry."

Brazeau County will continue to cut red tape, encourage economic growth and diversification, and support its residents as it considers the 2021 budget and beyond. Public budget meetings will be held November 20, 24, 25, and 26 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. We look forward to working constructively with the Government of Alberta on other issues impacting Brazeau residents in the future.

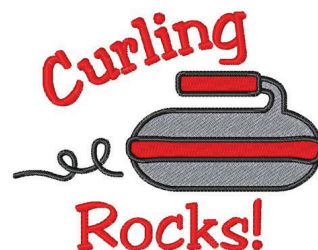

- o Improve mood with anger management and emotional support;

The cost of counselling can be a barrier for many

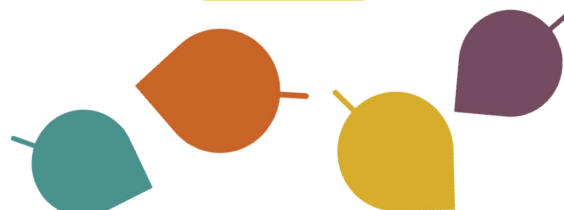

Several years ago there was a girl in an orphanage. She was very unattractive, awkward, gangly and clumsy, causing her to be disliked and shunned by the other children and even by her teachers. The head of the institution looked for a reason to send her off to some other place.

The Bible Truth Page #9

Jesus Healed Them ALL

As we have stated in the previous Bible Truth pages, it is God's will for all to be healed, and beyond that, to live in divine health. We also know that Jesus perfectly exemplified God's will, nature, and character when He walked this earth. John 14:9-11 **'Jesus saith unto him, Have I been so long time with you, and yet hast thou not known me, Philip? He that hath seen me hath seen the Father; and how sayest thou then, Shew us the Father? Believest thou not that I am in the Father, and the Father in me? The words that I speak unto you I speak not of myself: but the Father that dwelleth in me, he doeth the works. Believe me that I am in the Father, and the Father in me: or else believe me for the very works' sake.'** Hebrews 1:1-3 **'God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets, Hath in these last days spoken unto us by his Son, whom he hath appointed heir of all things, by whom also he made the worlds; Who being the brightness of his glory, and the express image of his person, and upholding all things by the word of his power, when he had by himself purged our sins, sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on high.'** By reading the gospels, we know that Jesus healed them all. Matthew 4:23-24 **'And Jesus went about all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, and preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing all manner of sickness and all manner of disease among the people. And his fame went throughout ALL Syria: and they brought unto him ALL sick people that were taken with divers diseases and torments, and those which were possessed with devils, and those which were lunatick, and those that had the palsy: and he healed them.'** Now notice; throughout the entire country of Syria, they brought all the sick people to Jesus, and He healed them. "Them" in this verse refers to ALL the sick that were brought to Him. Matthew 14:35-36 **'And when the men of that place had knowledge of him, they sent out into all that country round about, and brought unto him all that were diseased; And besought him that they might only touch the hem of his garment: and as many as touched were made perfectly whole.'** Again, throughout all the surrounding country, all the sick were brought to Jesus, and he healed them all. Luke 4:40 **'Now when the sun was setting, all they that had any sick with divers diseases brought them unto him; and he laid his hands on every one of them, and healed them.'** Once again, he healed them all. Jesus' life can be summarized with these words spoken by the apostle Peter in Acts 10:38 **'How God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Ghost and with power: who went about doing good, and healing all that were oppressed of the devil; for God was with him.'** So, Jesus went about doing good, (not making people sick) and He went about healing. Who did He heal? He healed all that were oppressed. Who was the oppressor? Was it God? Certainly not! It says the devil was the oppressor. Since Jesus healed them all then, He will heal them all today. Hebrews 13:8 **'Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever.'**

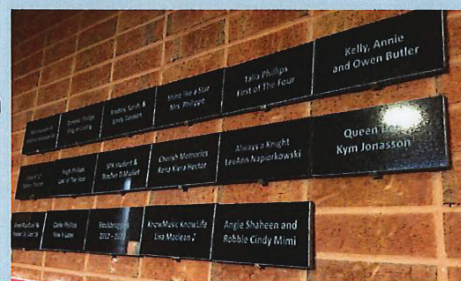

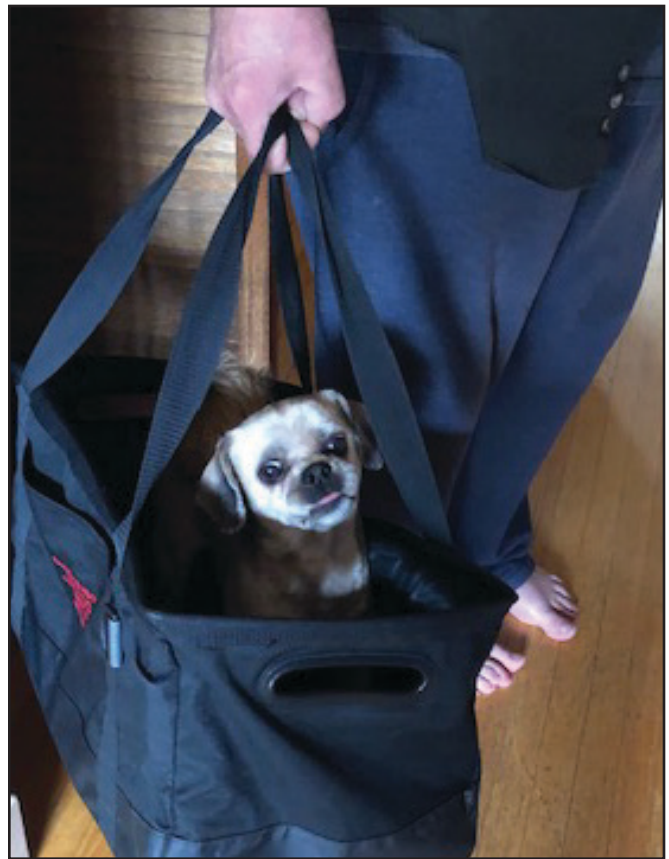

COVID-19 INFORMATION

NON-TRICKY TIPS FOR A SPOOKY SAFE HALLOWEEN

DON'T trick-or-treat, hand out treats, or go to a party if you are feeling ill (even if symptoms are mild) or in isolation/quarantine.



Trick-or-treating

- Choose costumes that allow your child to wear a non-medical mask. They can wear a mask underneath a Halloween mask as long as they can see and breathe comfortably. Make sure it's comfortable so your child won't need to adjust it.
- Go only with family or cohort members and keep a healthy distance from others.
- Stay in your community to limit the number of people you come into contact with.
- Carry hand sanitizer and use it after touching touch-points like doorbells or railings.
- If you can, knock instead of pushing doorbells, or keep 2 metres from the door or porch and call "trick or treat". Make sure the person calling is wearing a mask.
- Wait until you're home and have washed your hands before handling candy.

Handing out candy

- Print posters from [Alberta.ca](https://alberta.ca/covid19) to hang in your window or place on your door to let trick-or-treaters know if you're handing out treats this year or not.
- Wear a mask and use tongs or a grabber.
- Keep a healthy distance from trick-or-treaters. If possible, hand out candy from the driveway, open garage, or lawn instead of your front door.
- Ask trick-or-treaters to knock instead of ringing the doorbell.
- If you are indoors (school, apartment building, or mall) use a table or desk to keep a safe distance from trick-or-treaters (e.g. school classroom, apartment building, mall)

- Avoid handling treats
 - Use prepackaged candy (no homemade treats)
 - Hand treats out directly from the package they came in
 - Don't leave self-serve bowls of bulk candy
 - Make candy bundles/bags and space them out on a table or blanket for trick-or-treaters to take
- Get creative! Build a candy slide down your front steps or railing! Build a (safe) candy catapult! There are many fun ways to hand out treats while maintaining physical distance.

Attending a party (adults and kids)

- Spend time with people you know. The smaller the group the better.
- If possible, host your party outside. It's easier to keep a healthy distance between guests and there's better air circulation. (See guidance for ["Outdoor Events"](#))
- If the party is indoors, keep it small and maintain 2 metres away from people in other families and cohorts. (See guidance for ["Indoor Events"](#))
- Don't share drinks, snacks, cigarettes, vapes or cannabis – and no bobbing for apples!
- Choose games and activities that don't involve sharing items, and allow for distancing.
 - Set up art and craft stations so that each guest has their own materials (no sharing).
 - Instead of face painting, hand out temporary tattoos or stickers that guests can put on themselves.
 - Make sure any shared items are sanitized between uses.
 - Wash or sanitize your hands often. Have hand sanitizer easily accessible.
