Could they be a benefit to you?

Seniors Services provides preventative social programs that assist seniors and people with disabilities in maintaining their independence and enhancing their quality of life.

A housekeeping subsidy is available to assist seniors and adults with disabilities to live as independently as possible in their own safe, clean and comfortable homes.

To be eligible for the housekeeping subsidy, you must:

- be a senior (65+) or an adult with a disability or inability to complete household tasks,
- be a resident of Leduc County, Calmar, Thorsby, or Warburg, and
- have a total household income of less than \$60,000 a year (as a couple) or less than \$40,000 (as a single).

Housekeeping fees are determined based on family income level and eligibility to other subsidies. The services are provided through a partnership with *Serving Hands Senior Care Inc.*

Seniors Services also offers one-to-one support to assist you with:

- Information and referrals to other local resources
- Assistance with forms and applications
- Advocacy and coordination of services
- Goal setting and future planning direction

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Dear Editor:

As an engaged citizen, active volunteer, and being a previously elected Councillor and Mayor in the community, I wanted to share a few thoughts and views with you.

As you may have been noticing, the Town Council is currently engaged with consultants and the community on economic development strategies going forward. This is to support a focused approach that will hopefully generate business attraction, investment and community growth and encourage people to call Thorsby home. This process is being completed from a successful grant proposal that was organized by the past Council. "The Coal Transition Grant" was in the tune of around \$240,000.00 and was essentially a golden opportunity to do some amazing planning for the community. The grants were to help communities affected by the phase out of coal in their immediate areas to diversify their local economies and priorities. The plan would show the many strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats.

On October 13th, the next phase of the process was being presented to Council, so I took the opportunity to go to the meeting and hear about the findings. Some of the findings, I have to say, were not surprising to hear though and are obvious fixes. Key areas that I wanted to touch on to improve the community were overall cleanliness, community pride, pothole repair and improved streets, along with collaborating with neighboring communities. These shouldn't be a surprise as they have been mentioned many times this summer. The community needs to look better which ultimately impacts our ability to attract opportunities. Being in the Council seat isn't easy, and in fact can be very complex as things get older and more expensive to repair or replace.

After the great presentation was completed, we were given a chance to speak to the presentation. I was very disappointed to see the continued behaviour of some members of Council on how they spoke to the consultants and to myself, sitting in the gallery. Making statements such as "The past Council's mistakes". I need to ask what purpose is served by constantly insulting the efforts made in the past? I can assure you these were not mistakes but an agreed upon direction, backed by engineering consultants, public engagement, elected officials and numerous town administrators. Are you implying we were all wrong?

Also, for Councilor Ivor Foster to continuously ramble off into left field was both inappropriate and unprofessional. I was also disappointed in our Mayor's continued attack on the 39/20 Alliance. This was a group of small communities that gathered monthly to talk about local challenges and how they might work more effectively and efficiently together.

As a former founding member of the 39/20 Alliance, we built trust amongst our communities that never had existed before. We received grant funding to do joint projects and planning. We knew the structure wasn't perfect, but it was a great step forward. For over 10 years we nurtured this relationship and continued to build on its strengths, while hearing all points of view.

Last year Thorsby was asked to leave the 39/20 Alliance, with comments such as "they (Thorsby) were extremely difficult to deal with" and "it was their way or no way". All the work and relationship building has been lost, which now brings me to ask, who do we collaborate with? Mayor Raymond speaks highly of Leduc and Devon but conveniently leaves out the 39/20 Alliance communities of Breton, Warburg and Calmar. So one has to ask again, are all three Councils and their CAOs wrong in stating that they couldn't work with Thorsby any longer. Who's the real problem?

Swallow your pride, be respectful of others comments and work together. You are not the white horse that's going to come into town to save the day. You are on Council for a short period of time to build up the community, not attack it. You are there to build relationships, not destroy them. Our issues are complex; work with people, be humble, and treat everyone with respect. Having a healthy debate is a good thing and disrespecting the efforts of past Councils/staff has no place at the table. Speak proudly of your community, not doom and gloom. There's enough negativity in the world and residents want and need to hear about the positive as well.

Your focus isn't the past, but should be the bright future!

I encourage all residents to attend a Council meeting from time to time to see for yourself the challenges we face.

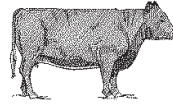

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Hello again from West of the Fifth Law! Today I'm going to take a break from our four-part introductory series and take a moment to write about a question that I often hear: "Should I incorporate?"

Put simply, a Corporation is an entity, registered with the government, that has many of the same rights and responsibilities that a person does. Corporations are owned by shareholders and controlled by directors and provide a means for them to do business without exposing themselves to personal liability.

When executed properly, having a Corporation can protect the owners from the risk lawsuits that arise out of business operations. This means that when a Corporation is being sued the owners' homes and personal assets are generally safe from being taken in the lawsuit.

Corporations also provide a benefit of reduced taxes, and when coupled with good accounting and bookkeeping can help reduce the overall taxes paid on money earned by the Corporation. Once the Corporation pays taxes on the money it can then be disbursed to shareholders through dividends at a lower rate of personal income tax.

The downside to incorporating is primarily the cost. There are fees involved, both from the Government and our fee for legal services provided. Corporations require special tax returns which often requires hiring a certified accountant every year. Finally, there is an annual requirement to provide a report to the government, and requirements to have a registered office where you keep your books. We offer these services for \$250 plus GST, per year.

The short answer to whether you should incorporate or not is actually another question: Are the benefits of decreased risk of personal liability and lower tax rates worth the initial and ongoing costs of a corporation?

If God Is Good Why Is There So Much Evil In The World?

When God created the heaven and earth he said that it was very good. Genesis 1:31 **'And God saw every thing that he had made, and, behold, it was very good'**. So what happened? Why is there so much evil in the world now? Fortunately for us we have someone to blame it on, and his name is ADAM. Adam and Eve were brought into an almost perfect world and they walked and talked with God, which is what God created them for. It was all good until they broke the ONE rule that God had given them. Genesis 2:16-17 **'And the Lord God commanded the man, saying, Of every tree of the garden thou mayest freely eat: But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die.'** What happened is that Adam and Eve chose to believe the devil's lies rather than the Word of God, and as a result they ate the fruit (Genesis chapter 3). When they ate that fruit they surely did die as God had said. They died in spirit, they took on the nature of sin and death, and in so doing brought death, sin and destruction into the world, and into their bodies. Romans 5:12 **'Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned.'** Man became sinful and could no longer walk and talk with a Holy God as he did before; man became more like the devil whom he obeyed. Jesus summed it up well in conversation with the religious leaders of the day in John 8:44 **'Ye are of your father the devil, and the lusts of your father ye will do. He was a murderer from the beginning, and abode not in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaketh a lie, he speaketh of his own: for he is a liar, and the father of it.'** By disobeying God, Adam caused the entire human race to switch from being Holy and righteous with God, to sinful and evil like the devil. The devil became the god of this world, and man became subject to him. The devil now had dominion over man and the earth. This is why bad things happen, and there is evil in the world. It is not what God wanted. It was caused by the disobedience of man. See Eph. 2:2.

The good news is that God found a way to save people from sin and death. Romans 6:23 **'For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.'** Romans 5:17 **'For if by one man's offence death reigned by one; much more they which receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness shall reign in life by one, Jesus Christ.'** John 3:14-17 **'And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up: That whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have eternal life. For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved.'** Jesus was able to save us because he lived a perfect and sinless life, and he gave his body to be whipped, and he gave his life on the cross, so that he could take the punishment that we deserved. He burned in hell on our behalf, so that we would not have to. WHEN HE WAS RAISED FROM THE DEAD THE PUNISHMENT FOR SIN HAD BEEN PAID IN FULL. 1 Peter 2:21-25 **'...Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow his steps: Who did no sin, neither was guile found in his mouth: Who, when he was reviled, reviled not again; when he suffered, he threatened not; but committed himself to him that judgeth righteously: Who his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: BY WHOSE STRIPES YE WERE HEALED. For ye were as sheep going astray; but are now returned unto the Shepherd and Bishop of your souls.'** Jesus gave his life in exchange for ours. He suffered death on our behalf. All we have to do to receive the benefit of his sacrifice is give up our own way of life, and live the rest of our life on earth for Him, making him our Lord. Romans 10:9 **'That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved. For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.'**

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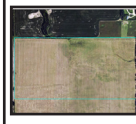
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
