RAYMOND ARTHUR FRIEND THS '48

Interviewer and guest writer Robert M. Walker assisted by Trebor W. Reklaw, former sportswriter for the Whitecourt Star and now with the firm Reklaw, Black, & Tarry.

Raymond was born in Edmonton on Dec.13, 1930 to Ralph and Jean Friend. He was the second child of four and the only son. At the time, Ralph and Jean lived in Breton where Ralph owned a partnership in a garage. They had a diesel light plant and supplied power to the Village of Breton.

When the Great Depression hit in the early '30's the village was unable to continue paying for the power so Ralph sold his share of the garage and bought a sawmill in the spring of 1933. This project was shortlived as a bush fire went through, burning the mill and camp to the ground. The family packed up their belongings and moved to Genesee where Ralph's sister and two of his brothers lived. Ralph bought a farm and it was here that Raymond grew up. During this time he attended the Genesee School and completed grade nine. As there were no school buses operating at this time he moved to Thorsby for grade ten, boarding with the Fink family. However, busing became the status quo throughout Alberta shortly after and Ray finished his education riding with Ed Alton who was the first route driver from Genesee to Thorsby.

Leduc#1 had blown in a little earlier and Ray graduated from THS into the oil patch where he worked from 1948 to 1951. In the latter year he moved back to the farm to help prepare for an auction. His parents were moving as they had purchased a store in Sangudo. Ray also moved and found employment with an electrician wiring houses. He learned the electrician's trade quickly as rural electrification was just coming in at the time. In the spring of 1952 he purchased a truck and began a brief career hauling cream to the Sangudo Creamery. In 1954 he married Frances Lewis and branched out further by buying a school bus which he operated in the W. Cosmo area, delivering kids to school in Sangudo.

In 1955 Ray and Fran decided to move to B.C. where they purchased a service station, restaurant and motel in partnership with his parents. They had their first child, Danny, in 1961 and decided to come back to Alberta in 1962. In January of that year Ray lost his youngest sister, Noreen, to a rare blood disease.

Ray found employment with Allan Gibson at Gibson's Auto Service in Sangudo where he remained for eight years, obtaining his Journeyman Automotive License. In June of 1965 Ray and Fran had their second child, Tammy, and their third child, Wanda-Rae, was born in July of 1967. In 1970 Ray purchased an abandoned garage in Sangudo and did the necessary renovations. He remained the owner/operator of Ray's Auto Repair for forty-five years. Son Danny eventually took over the garage but Ray, now semi-retired, still went in everyday to work on small engines (an enjoyable hobby) and visit with the customers who had patronized the business for many, many years. At the age of eighty-seven he fell and broke his hip so his appearances at the shop became less frequent and he became more of a homebody. He had lost Frances to cancer in 2003 but stayed in the house until 2020.

By now you now that Ray Friend was not one to be inactive for long. Across his career he had many accomplishments not the least of which was being elected Councillor (1971-1977) and then to the position of Mayor of Sangudo (1977-2001) a run of 24 years. As well, Ray and Fran purchased a building and moved it to a lot within the village in 1967 opening the first apartment building. The two remained landlords for many years, finally deciding to change their direction and take in foster children. The apartment was then renovated into a four bedroom house.

In 2020 Ray sold the house and moved to the Pleasant View Lodge where he enjoys life today. In September of this year he attended a school reunion in Thorsby where he was able to renew old acquaintances. So raise your glass to Ray Friend, a most worthy representative of the old days at THS.

Canada Emergency Business Account Now Open to Businesses Using Personal Bank Accounts

OTTAWA: Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead, is pleased to inform constituents that the Canada Emergency Business Account (CEBA) will be available to businesses that have been operating out of a non-business banking account. This change will greatly help farmers and smaller businesses that were not previously eligible.

To be eligible, businesses must:

- have been operating as a business as of March 1, 2020
- must successfully open a business account at a Canadian financial institution that is participating in CEBA, and
- meet the other existing CEBA eligibility criteria.

The deadline to apply for CEBA is December 31, 2020.

NON-TRICKY TIPS FOR A SPOOKY SAFE HALLOWEEN

DON'T trick-or-treat, hand out treats, or go to a party if you are feeling ill (even if symptoms are mild) or in isolation/quarantine.



Trick-or-treating

- Choose costumes that allow your child to wear a nonmedical mask. They can wear a mask underneath a Halloween mask as long as they can see and breathe comfortably. Make sure it's comfortable so your child won't need to adjust it.
- Go only with family or cohort members and keep a healthy distance from others.
- Stay in your community to limit the number of people you come into contact with.
- Carry hand sanitizer and use it after touching touch-points like doorbells or railings.
- If you can, knock instead of pushing doorbells, or keep 2 metres from the door or porch and call "trick or treat". Make sure the person calling is wearing a mask.
- Wait until you're home and have washed your hands before handling candy.

Handing out candy

- Print posters from Alberta.ca to hang in your window or place on your door to let trick-or-treaters know if you're handing out treats this year or not.
- Wear a mask and use tongs or a grabber.
- Keep a healthy distance from trick-or-treaters. If possible, hand out candy from the driveway, open garage, or lawn instead of your front door.
- Ask trick-or-treaters to knock instead of ringing the doorbell.
- If you are indoors (school, apartment building, or mall) use a table or desk to keep a safe distance from trick-or-treaters (e.g. school classroom, apartment building, mall)

- · Avoid handling treats
 - Use prepackaged candy (no homemade treats)
 - Hand treats out directly from the package they came in
 - Don't leave self-serve bowls of bulk candy
 - Make candy bundles/bags and space them out on a table or blanket for trick-or-treaters to take
- Get creative! Build a candy slide down your front steps or railing! Build a (safe) candy catapult! There are many fun ways to hand out treats while maintaining physical distance.

Attending a party (adults and kids)

- Spend time with people you know. The smaller the group the better.
- If possible, host your party outside. It's easier to keep a healthy distance between guests and there's better air circulation. (See guidance for "Outdoor Events")
- If the party is indoors, keep it small and maintain 2 metres away from people in other families and cohorts. (See guidance for "Indoor Events")
- Don't share drinks, snacks, cigarettes, vapes or cannabis

 and no bobbing for apples!
- Choose games and activities that don't involve sharing items, and allow for distancing.
 - Set up art and craft stations so that each guest has their own materials (no sharing).
 - Instead of face painting, hand out temporary tattoos or stickers that guests can put on themselves.
 - Make sure any shared items are sanitized between
 - Wash or sanitize your hands often. Have hand sanitizer easily accessible.


