



Fire Prevention Week: preventing cooking fires Cooking is the leading cause of home fires and home fire injuries in Canada, and these fires can be prevented.

This Fire Prevention Week – from Oct. 4 to 10 – Leduc County is partnering with the National Fire Protection Association to promote fire safety in the kitchen.

Cooking fires put you and your family at risk of injury or death. When you are cooking, stay focused and stay in the kitchen. These simple steps will help keep your home safe and minimize the risk of a fire. Keven Lefebvre, fire chief

Additional steps you should take include the following:

Always monitor food when it is cooking; never leave cooking food unattended.

Stay in the kitchen while you are cooking food. If you have to leave the room – even for a short time – turn off any cooking appliances.

Use a timer to remind you that you're cooking. Keep an oven mitt and pan lid nearby when cooking. If a small grease fire starts, slide the lid over the pan to smother the flame. Turn off the burner, and leave the pan covered until it is completely cool.

Have a "kid-free zone" of at least one metre around the stove and areas where hot food or drinks are prepared or carried.

Be alert when cooking; reconsider using cooking appliances if you are tired, have taken medicine or drugs, or have consumed alcohol that makes you drowsy.

The National Fire Protection Association has proclaimed Fire Prevention Week annually since 1925. During Fire Prevention Week, public awareness activities are hosted in communities around North America to educate on the importance of being prepared for fire emergencies.



Subsidized counselling service

Short-term preventative counselling supports people who are struggling with common, everyday issues. Leduc County Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) offers subsidy to residents of rural Leduc County, Calmar, Thorsby and Warburg to ensure everyone can afford the cost of counselling.

Counselling fees are determined on a sliding scale based on family income and family size. In order to be eligible for subsidy, your family income must be less than \$75,000 per year. Services are provided by local counsellors and are available in person, over the phone or virtually.

SENIORS SERVICES *Could they be a benefit to you?*

Seniors Services provides preventative social programs that assist seniors and people with disabilities in maintaining their independence and enhancing their quality of life.

A housekeeping subsidy is available to assist seniors and adults with disabilities to live as independently as possible in their own safe, clean and comfortable homes.

To be eligible for the housekeeping subsidy, you must:

- be a senior (65+) or an adult with a disability or inability to complete household tasks,
- be a resident of Leduc County, Calmar, Thorsby, or Warburg, and
- have a total household income of less than \$60,000 a year (as a couple) or less than \$40,000 (as a single).

Housekeeping fees are determined based on family income level and eligibility to other subsidies. The services are provided through a partnership with Serving Hands Senior Care Inc.

Seniors Services also offers one-to-one support to assist you with:

- Information and referrals to other local resources
- Assistance with forms and applications
- Advocacy and coordination of services
- Goal setting and future planning direction




The first meeting for the 2020-21 Project year will be held on October 2nd at 7pm at Sunnybrook Community Hall, COVID-19 Regulations will apply.

What is God's Will Concerning Healing Part 2

One page is not nearly enough room to communicate all that the Bible has to say about God's will concerning healing. This week I would like to share more proof from scripture that God wants us all to be free from sickness and disease, and to live in good health.

Like I said in part one, we can know God's will by looking at what Jesus did while here on earth. Hebrews 1:1-3 "God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets, hath in these last days spoken unto us by his Son, whom he hath appointed heir of all things, by whom also he made the worlds; Who being the brightness of his glory, and the EXPRESS IMAGE of his person, and upholding all things by the word of his power, when he had by himself purged our sins, sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on high;" EXPRESS IMAGE MEANS AN EXACT COPY OR REPRESENTATION. We are told in Hebrews 1:1-3 that Jesus is an exact copy or representation of the person of God. Jesus said in John 5:30 "I can of mine own self do nothing: as I hear, I judge: and my judgment is just; because I SEEK NOT MINE OWN WILL, BUT THE WILL OF THE **FATHER WHICH HATH SENT ME.**" See also John 5:19-30. So it is pretty clear he was doing the will of God while he was here on earth, he was doing the will of God when he healed the multitudes in Matthew 4:23,24, Matthew 8:16-17, and Matthew 12:14-22. Jesus was doing the will of God when he taught and commanded his disciples to go preach and heal the sick. Jesus sent out the twelve and said: Matthew 10:7-8 "And as ye go, preach, saying The Kingdom of heaven is at hand. Heal the sick, cleanse the lepers, raise the dead, cast out devils; freely ye have received, freely give." Later he sent out the seventy: Luke 10:1-20. Luke 10:1 "After these things the Lord appointed other seventy also, And sent them two and two before his face into every city and place, whither he himself would come." Luke 10:9 "And heal the sick that are therein, and say unto them, The kingdom of God is come nigh unto you." Luke 10:17-19 "And the seventy returned again with joy, saying, Lord, even the devils are subject unto us through thy name. And he said unto them, I beheld Satan as lightning fall from heaven. Behold, I give unto you power to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy: and nothing shall by any means hurt you." After Jesus was risen from the dead he instructed the disciples in Matthew 28:18-20 "All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: TEACHING THEM TO OBSERVE ALL THINGS WHATSOEVER I HAVE COMMANDED YOU: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen." As we can see Jesus demonstrated healing, he taught his disciples healing and he commanded them to teach others also. That is exactly what the disciples did as recorded in Acts 5:16 "There came also a multitude out of the cities round about unto Jerusalem, bringing sick folks, and them which were vexed with unclean spirits: AND THEY WERE HEALED EVERY ONE."

God's will back then was for all people to be healed and in good health and it still is today. Malachi 3:6 **"For I am the Lord, I change not;"** Hebrews 13:8 **"Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever."** Romans 2:11 **"For there is no respect of persons with God."**

Our Pockets are Empty

Sir Winston S. Churchill said: "We contend that for a nation to try to tax itself into prosperity is like a man standing in a bucket and trying to lift himself up by the handle." This is a powerful statement and is exactly what the federal Liberal government is doing – taking, taking and taking from those that can no longer give what they do not have. Justin Trudeau is making things more expensive by increasing/adding taxes.

Trudeau, like Oliver Twist from Charles Dickens novel is saying "... I want some more." Pierre Poilievre our Shadow Minister for Finance stated in the House on September 24th "The only way to tackle this massive beast debt that our current government is creating is by returning our workers to their jobs. Right now, we have a million missing jobs relative to the number of people who were working in February before COVID began. We now have the highest unemployment rate in the G7. Our unemployment rate, at over 10%, is three percentage points higher than the OECD average. We need a plan to unleash the free market system to hire people back and let our mines, plants and factories come roaring back to life. Why do we not let our steelworkers and trade workers build pipelines that will create jobs in the energy sector in the west and in the refining sector in the east?

"Every time the Liberals run out of money; they make cuts to the health sector. They did it in the 1990s. In 1996, the Government of Canada had no more money. What did the Liberals do? They increased workers' taxes and cut investments in health. That is what the Liberals do every time. We can guess that they will do the exact same thing when there is no more money in the budget because of their irresponsible spending."

We Conservatives believe we need to cut taxes, ensure regulations are at a reasonable level and give people the freedom to judge on their own, to provide for their families, to give to charity, to protect the most vulnerable and basically give them the ability to do what is best in their situation. A one-size-fits-all situation does not work.

As noted by our Conservative Leader, the Honourable Erin O'Toole: "...Liberals have become complacent about the country's debt and appear ready to "bankrupt" Canada with their new spending plans." O'Toole says his own view is that the government should spend what's necessary to support Canadians through the pandemic, but in a targeted way that avoids excessive expenditures and aims to return the books to balance gradually over the next decade. I agree.


