

Fall chores: keeping it safe

With the long, hot days of summer behind us, many people are turning their thoughts to fall chores like raking leaves and cleaning out gutters. This is a great time to get out and enjoy the cooler weather, but it's important to take precautions to avoid the aches and sprains that can often go along with these tasks.

Alberta's chiropractors offer the following health and safety tips to avoid injury this fall:

Warm up and cool down. It may not seem like a workout, but one hour of raking can burn nearly 300 calories! Warm up for at least 10 minutes by walking and stretching to prevent straining your shoulders, neck and back. When you're done your work, gentle stretching exercises will help relieve tension in your muscles.

Choose the right tools. Use tools that are the right size for your height and stature. Look for ergonomic handles for comfort, ease of use and to prevent back strain.

Wear the right clothing. Lightweight clothing will keep you warm without trapping sweat. Shoes should be sturdy to help prevent injuries to your feet and have slip-resistant soles to minimize the risk of falling. Gloves provide traction and help prevent blisters on your hands.

Practice proper position. Stand upright and vary your movements often to avoid overus-

ing muscle groups. Bend at the knees and not the waist when picking things up. Avoid tossing leaves over your shoulder or to the side, which can strain your back.

Practice ladder safety. Ensure your ladder is in good repair with no loose screws, hinges or rungs. Position it on a firm, level surface and angle the ladder approximately 75 degrees from the ground. Always face the ladder when climbing and descending, and never sit or stand on the top of the ladder.

Take frequent breaks. Rest every 10 to 15 minutes—repetitive tasks can strain your muscles and joints. Drink plenty of water and stretch to relieve any tension in your back, shoulders and neck.

SENIORS SERVICES

Could they be a benefit to you?

Seniors Services provides preventative social programs that assist seniors and people with disabilities in maintaining their independence and enhancing their quality of life.

A housekeeping subsidy is available to assist seniors and adults with disabilities to live as independently as possible in their own safe, clean and comfortable homes.

To be eligible for the housekeeping subsidy, you must:

- be a senior (65+) or an adult with a disability or inability to complete household tasks,
- be a resident of Leduc County, Calmar, Thorsby, or Warburg, and
- have a total household income of less than \$60,000 a year (as a couple) or less than \$40,000 (as a single).

Housekeeping fees are determined based on family income level and eligibility to other subsidies. The services are provided through a partnership with Serving Hands Senior Care Inc.

Seniors Services also offers one-to-one support to assist you with:

- Information and referrals to other local resources
- Assistance with forms and applications
- Advocacy and coordination of services
- Goal setting and future planning direction

Hello again from West of the Fifth Law! Today I'm going to take a break from our four-part introductory series and take a moment to write about a question that I often hear: "Should I incorporate?"

Put simply, a Corporation is an entity, registered with the government, that has many of the same rights and responsibilities that a person does. Corporations are owned by shareholders and controlled by directors and provide a means for them to do business without exposing themselves to personal liability.

When executed properly, having a Corporation can protect the owners from the risk lawsuits that arise out of business operations. This means that when a Corporation is being sued the owners' homes and personal assets are generally safe from being taken in the lawsuit.

Corporations also provide a benefit of reduced taxes, and when coupled with good accounting and bookkeeping can help reduce the overall taxes paid on money earned by the Corporation. Once the Corporation pays taxes on the money it can then be disbursed to shareholders through dividends at a lower rate of personal income tax.

The downside to incorporating is primarily the cost. There are fees involved, both from the Government and our fee for legal services provided. Corporations require special tax returns which often requires hiring a certified accountant every year. Finally, there is an annual requirement to provide a report to the government, and requirements to have a registered office where you keep your books. We offer these services for \$250 plus GST, per year.

The short answer to whether you should incorporate or not is actually another question: Are the benefits of decreased risk of personal liability and lower tax rates worth the initial and ongoing costs of a corporation?

MLA REPOR

Albertans know that 2020 has been a uniquely challenging year for families and job creators and that now, perhaps more than ever before, we must boldly pursue new ways to diversify our economy. I am excited to share with you that Alberta's government is introducing legislation this fall to attract new investment in Geothermal energy as part of Alberta's Recovery Plan.

Using emerging made-in-Alberta technology and our decades of drilling experience in oil and gas, we are setting our province up to harness earth's natural energy and diversify our innovative energy sector. A strong Albertan geothermal sector has the potential to create jobs and economic opportunity for Indigenous and rural remote communities, while contributing to the global effort to lower greenhouse gas emissions.

Our government is also launching a new plan for diversifying and growing Alberta's natural gas industry that will position the province as a post-pandemic powerhouse for responsible energy development. The Natural Gas Vision and Strategy is a key part of Alberta's Recovery Plan and shares the actions Alberta's government will take to grow the sector and seize emerging opportunities for clean hydrogen, petrochemical manufacturing, liquefied natural gas (LNG) and plastics recycling. NON-TRICKY TIPS FOR A SPOOKY SAFE HALLOWEEN

DON'T trick-or-treat, hand out treats, or go to a party if you are feeling ill (even if symptoms are mild) or in isolation/quarantine.



Trick-or-treating

- Choose costumes that allow your child to wear a nonmedical mask. They can wear a mask underneath a Halloween mask as long as they can see and breathe comfortably. Make sure it's comfortable so your child won't need to adjust it.
- Go only with family or cohort members and keep a healthy distance from others.
- Stay in your community to limit the number of people you come into contact with.
- Carry hand sanitizer and use it after touching touch-points like doorbells or railings.
- If you can, knock instead of pushing doorbells, or keep 2 metres from the door or porch and call "trick or treat". Make sure the person calling is wearing a mask.
- Wait until you're home and have washed your hands before handling candy.

Handing out candy

- Print posters from Alberta.ca to hang in your window or place on your door to let trick-or-treaters know if you're handing out treats this year or not.
- · Wear a mask and use tongs or a grabber.
- Keep a healthy distance from trick-or-treaters. If possible, hand out candy from the driveway, open garage, or lawn instead of your front door.
- Ask trick-or-treaters to knock instead of ringing the doorbell.
- If you are indoors (school, apartment building, or mall) use a table or desk to keep a safe distance from trick-or-treaters (e.g. school classroom, apartment building, mall)

- · Avoid handling treats
 - Use prepackaged candy (no homemade treats)
 - Hand treats out directly from the package they came in
 - Don't leave self-serve bowls of bulk candy
 - Make candy bundles/bags and space them out on a table or blanket for trick-or-treaters to take
- Get creative! Build a candy slide down your front steps or railing! Build a (safe) candy catapult! There are many fun ways to hand out treats while maintaining physical distance.

Attending a party (adults and kids)

- Spend time with people you know. The smaller the group the better.
- If possible, host your party outside. It's easier to keep a
 healthy distance between guests and there's better air
 circulation. (See guidance for "Outdoor Events")
- If the party is indoors, keep it small and maintain 2 metres away from people in other families and cohorts. (See guidance for "Indoor Events")
- Don't share drinks, snacks, cigarettes, vapes or cannabis

 and no bobbing for apples!
- Choose games and activities that don't involve sharing items, and allow for distancing.
 - Set up art and craft stations so that each guest has their own materials (no sharing).
 - Instead of face painting, hand out temporary tattoos or stickers that guests can put on themselves.
 - Make sure any shared items are sanitized between uses.
 - Wash or sanitize your hands often. Have hand sanitizer easily accessible.






