# Lest We Forget John Richard Funnell M106750

As Remembrance Day draws near let's take a moment to remember the brave men and women who have served Canada during times of conflict. This year marks the 75th anniversary since the end of the Second World War. The community of Breton, like so many other communities across Canada, seen their son's and daughter's enlist for service in the Canadian Armed Forces. For many it was the first time that they had travelled very far from their community and family. While numerous men and women from the Breton community served during the Second World War most returned safely, and in that respect the community was lucky. However, one young man from Breton, John Funnell did not return.

John Funnell was born January 23, 1923, the only son of Richard and Louisa Funnell. His father Richard, was one of the first to take a homestead in the area that would later be called Funnell. John grew upon his father's homestead and attended the Funnell School during the 1930's.

On February 13, 1943, less than a month after his 20th birthday, John travelled to Edmonton to enlist in the Canadian Army. After basic training in Canada John was stationed in England. Early in 1944 he was transferred to the Cape Breton Highlanders Regiment RCIC and deployed with his regiment to Italy. The Cape Breton Highlanders were in action on October 1, 1944 when John was killed at age 21. John was laid to rest in the Cesena British Empire Cemetery in Cesena, Italy. The inscription on his tombstone reads, "No One Knows How Much I Miss Him Only Aching Hearts Can Tell - Mother". Those words speak volumes as to how his mother must have felt when she received word of his death. His mother Louisa was not only left a widow, but now had lost her

only son. John paid the ultimate sacrifice for his country. Lest We Forget.

Remembrance Day Services will be much different this year due to Covid -19 but do take time to pause, and give thanks to those who served their country.



### Dear Editor

At a recent County council meeting, a number of appointments were made to various boards. According to the minutes of the meeting, a motion (0767/20-10-20) was made ". . . that members at large MUST be appointed from all areas. . .."

Even with a casual view of the placements, it is obvious to this writer that this motion was not adhered to. Readers are encouraged to read the appointment list and come to their own conclusions regarding the above. There is always the question whether appointments of members-at-large are "reward" based rather than ability-based. What is the process of fitting applicants' abilities to board requirements? Does the same not apply to Councillor appointments?

If one considers the background of Councillors, it doesn't appear that the right people were placed on the Ag Service Board. The Ag Service Board Act mandates that members must have expertise in the field. Ag Service Act 3.3 states that "The membership of a board MUST include persons who are familiar with agricultural concerns and issues and who are qualified to develop policies consistent with the Act."

Is it not the responsibility of the Reeve to make sure that motions are adhered to? Does he not receive a bonus on his per diems to ensure that proper procedures are followed? Last year, we paid the Reeve over \$100,000. Perhaps it is time for another corporate review.

It does appear, however, that the number of boards has been reduced from its ridiculous high of around 28 (not too many years ago).

The motion mentioned above also states to "... and direct administration to draft policy to provide direction to Council and member-at-large appointments." I am wondering why administration is to draft policy. Do we not pay councillors to develop appropriate policy?

The above issues are not new as this writer has submitted letters about the above on many occasions.

**Counselling Subsidies** – Starting in September. Breton and Area FCSS is pleased to offer Counselling Subsidies.

A subsidy is available for individuals, couples and/or families who are struggling with common, everyday issues to access short-term preventative counselling services. The goal is to:

o Improve relationships with better communication and conflict resolution skills;

o Improve mood with anger management and emotional support;

o Enhance personal growth with creativity, spirituality, self-esteem, self-awareness, goal setting;

o Improve parenting skills by focusing on attachment;

o Reduce stress with life balance; and/or

o Learn new skills and behaviors

The cost of counselling can be a barrier for many individuals and families. This subsidy is available to those who do not have access to coverage through health benefits or employee benefits, such as an Employee Assistance Plan (EAP), and whose family income is less than \$75,000 per year. Fees are determined according to a sliding scale based on income and family size. Fees range from \$15 per session to \$50 per session. Counselling services are provided through a partnership with Karunia Counselling from Leduc. We know that in this current environment many may have additional stress and anxiety. We also know that transportation may be an added barrier. 


