COVID-19 Update

From the Village of Breton

As of November 12th, the provincial government has determined that the Brazeau County region will move to Enhanced Status in regards to the COVID-19 pandemic, with the following restrictions. As the Village of Breton lies within Brazeau County, we are to follow these same guidelines.

Mandatory measures

- Restaurants, bars, lounges and pubs must stop liquor sales by 10pm and close by 11pm
 applies to Class A, B or C licences (Nov 13-27).
- 15-person limit on social and family gatherings indoors and outdoors where people are mixing and mingling.
- 50-person limit on indoor and outdoor wedding ceremonies and funeral services.

Voluntary measures

- No social gatherings inside your home or outside of your community. Instead, socialize outdoors or in structured settings, like restaurants or other business that are subject to legal limits and take steps to prevent transmission.
- Limit of 3 cohorts: your core household, your school, and one other sport or social cohort. Young children who attend child care can be part of 4 cohorts.
- Wear a mask in all indoor work settings, except when alone in a workspace or an appro-

priate barrier is in place.

Employers in office settings should implement measures to reduce the number of employees in the workplace at one time.

• Faith-based gatherings limited to 1/3 capacity at one time.

Municipalities are encouraging their residents to download the secure ABTraceTogether app. ABTraceTogether is a contact tracing tool connected to Alberta's contact tracing system. If you test positive, contact tracers will directly notify people at risk, ensure they isolate, and support them in their recovery. AbTraceTogether is an exposure notification tool. It relies on infected users to send out an alert to people they've exposed without directly involving contact tracers. The technology in ABTraceTogether has been used successfully in Australia, Singapore and other jurisdictions.

Laura learned her trade while working in the butcher department in the Drayton Valley IGA and in 1992 she set up a cooler to be able to cut meat year-round. She had been helping hunters and local farmers process and sustain this farm fresh lifestyle for almost as many years as the farm had been running.

As the farm and family grew, Laura became a more active community member and volunteer, allowing her to be a greater part of Alder Flats and its people. She was able to assist and organize many different functions while holding the position of President in the Alder Flats Agricultural Society. However, this never stopped her from rolling up her sleeves and helping cook when she was needed at other community events.

One of Laura's great passions was curling, she enjoyed being a part, on and off of the ice, and helped plan as many bonspiels as she could. In 2016 she was able to get to win the Alder Flats Women's Bonspiel along with her daughter Amanda, daughter in law Layne and Sheila Thebeau. Village of Breton Bylaw 20-06 Sidewalk Maintenance Bylaw

The Village of Breton Sidewalk Maintenance Bylaw was updated at the November 12th, 2020 Council Meeting. The Bylaw in its entirety is on the village webpage at www.breton.ca. Portions of the bylaw read as.

Section 2 Definitions

a) "Sidewalk" - means that part of a highway especially adapted to the use of, or ordinarily used by pedestrians, and includes that part of a highway between the curb line (or the edge of the roadway, where there is no curb line) and the adjacent property line, whether or not paved or improved;

Section 3 Sidewalk Maintenance

- a) All Persons owning or occupying property within the Village shall remove and clear away all snow, ice, dirt or any other obstruction from the Sidewalks situated on land adjacent to the property owned or occupied by them within **forty-eight (48) hours** after every occurrence. The aforementioned forty-eight (48) hours shall mean all days except Sunday.
- b) No Person shall place, or permit to be placed, snow, ice or any other obstruction, onto any Roadway or Sidewalk.

Section 4 Violations and Penalties

- a) That failure to comply with any section of this Bylaw shall constitute an offence, the penalty for which shall be a fine of \$100.00 payable to the Village of Breton.
- b) That in the event of any person failing to comply with Section 3, the Village may take whatever action or measure necessary to remedy the contravention of this bylaw in accordance with sections 545 and 549 of the Municipal Government Act.
- c) The expenses and costs of any action or measure taken by the Village is an amount owing to the Village of Breton by the person who contravened Section 3 of this bylaw and in accordance with Sections 545 and 549 of the *Municipal Government Act*, the Village will have costs charged to the owner of the property.
- d) An Enforcement Officer is hereby authorized and empowered to issue a Violation Tag to any person, who the Enforcement Officer has reasonable and probable grounds to believe has contravened any provision of this bylaw.



The Bible Truth Page #12

Jesus' Hometown

In The Bible Truth Page #9, I proved out of the Word of God that Jesus healed all that had need of healing (Luke 9:11). Some people might ask; "Why couldn't Jesus heal everyone in His hometown?" Well let's address this question and see what the Bible actually says. Matthew 13:54-58 'And when he was come into his own country, he taught them in their synagogue, insomuch that they were astonished, and said, "Whence hath this man this wisdom, and these mighty works? Is not this the carpenter's son? is not his mother called Mary? and his brethren, James, and Joses, and Simon, and Judas? And his sisters, are they not all with us? Whence then hath this man all these things?" And they were offended in him. But Jesus said unto them, "A prophet is not without honour, save in his own country, and in his own house." And he did not many mighty works there because of their unbelief.' The people were offended in Jesus, and they did not believe Him. If they didn't believe Him, why would they come to Him for healing? If we are going to make an assumption regarding this verse, it is more reasonable to assume that the sick did not come to Him for healing, than to assume that He could not heal the people that did come to Him. Since they did not come, they did not get healed. Their unbelief did not stop the power of God; it simply kept them from bringing the sick to Jesus. Here is another account of the same situation: Mark 6:1-5 'And he went out from thence, and came into his own country; and his disciples follow him. And when the sabbath day was come, he began to teach in the synagogue: and many hearing him were astonished, saying, "From whence hath this man these things? and what wisdom is this which is given unto him, that even such mighty works are wrought by his hands? Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary, the brother of James, and Joses and of Juda, and Simon? and are not his sisters here with us?" And they were offended at him. But Jesus said unto them, "A prophet is not without honour, but in his own country, and among his own kin, and in his own house." And he could there do no mighty work, save that he laid his hands upon a few sick folk, and healed them.' A few sick folk did come to Him, and He healed them. "Them" refers to all that came to Him for healing. So, in His hometown, in the presence of unbelief, He healed all that came to him. HE HEALED ALL THAT WERE OPPRESSED OF THE DEVIL. Acts 10:38

Canada Revenue Agency Opens Applications for the Canada Emergency Rent Subsidy

OTTAWA: Gerald Soroka, Member of Parliament for Yellowhead is pleased to advise that qualifying organizations can apply directly for the new Canada Emergency Rent Subsidy (CERS) through the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) without the need to claim the assistance through their landlords. Applicants can claim the subsidy retroactively for the period that began on September 27 and ended on October 24, 2020. Applications for the second CERS period (October 25 to November 21, 2020) will open on November 30.

Organizations can include rent and other eligible amounts already paid in respect of a claim period as well as amounts that are payable for the claim period when submitting their CERS applications. Amounts that are not paid at the time of the application will have to be paid no later than 60 days after payment of the subsidy.

CRA will collect applications over the coming days and, on November 30, process applications received to date. Qualifying organizations whose claims successfully clear the CRA's automated verification system and that are registered for direct deposit should expect to begin receiving payments starting on December 4.

At the end of the Battle of Britain, British vice-marshal Alexander Adams was driving to a meeting at his headquarters when he came upon a sign: ROAD CLOSED -- UNEXPLODED BOMB. Adams called over the policeman on duty, hoping he might be able to suggest an alternate route.

"Sorry, you can't go through," said the policeman as he approached the car. "The bomb is likely to go off at any minute now." Then he caught sight of Adams's uniform. "I'm very sorry, sir," he said, "I didn't know you were a wing commander. It is quite all right for you to go through."

With "advisors" like that, who needs enemies! Although that policeman -- who was trained to respect rank -- momentarily allowed his deference to a vice-marshal to overcome his good sense, Adams had better sense than to follow his advice.

If you are looking for guidance and advice, for direction in this uncertain world, who are you looking too? We have to be very careful who or what we allow to guide us. Would it not be best to consider the word of the very one who created this world and each one of us? 
