She was born December 11, 1922 to Earl and Helen Barnes in the Clive area. She married Norris Lansdell on December 27, 1945 who preceded her in death in 2003. Winnifred loved growing up on the farm at Clive. She helped her Dad in the fields and milked cows. She finished Grade 11 in Tees, then spent time in Red Deer and in Lethbridge working in the hospitals there. After she married Norris they farmed and worked in Central Alberta.

Winnifred and Norris took up residence in Breton in 1955. She was known in the community for her delicious homemade bread and buns which she offered for sale from her living room window on main street in the 1950's. She was a ward aide at the Breton Hospital in its first years starting in 1963. For a long time she held down three jobs, cleaning the Breton Elementary School, the Treasury Branch and the Post Office. She was always a hard worker and enjoyed her work so much... a freshly washed and polished hallway in the school gave her much joy as did interacting with the students as they came and went. She never complained about getting up in the cold of winter and shovelling the walks at the school before the rest of the town woke up.

Winnie was a cornerstone of the Breton United Church Women and took pleasure in hosting meetings at her home which always included a beautiful spread of tea and sweets. In 1986 she retired and enjoyed various camping trips which took her as far north as Alaska and into BC and Saskatchewan. These camping trips often included grandchildren. Her greatest joy was her family, especially when they were all gathered around the table, enjoying her great meals and her delicious desserts. Love and laughter was always plentiful. Even in her last days when she was physically unable to go visiting, her first question was always "How are the kids?" She took comfort in hearing everyone was doing well.

Winnifred leaves to celebrate her life and carry on her legacy: daughter Patricia Denholm (David) of Stettler; son Larry Lansdell (Fiona) of Leduc; daughter Michele Bevan (Randy) of Breton; 8 grandchildren; 22 greatgrandchildren and 2 great great grandsons. She was the second eldest of 11 children.

She is predeceased by her parents, 4 brothers and 2 sisters. She leaves 3 sisters, 1 brother and numerous nieces and nephews to enjoy memories of good times together.

UPDATED SNOWPLOW SERVICES FOR RESIDENTS

As per policy PG-04: Snow Clearing Private Driveways, Leduc County will provide snow clearing services on private driveways, as requested by county residents, up to three times per season free of charge. All additional snow clearing services will be invoiced at the end of the season as per Leduc County's fees and charges bylaw.

At the Oct. 13 council meeting, council approved updates to the policy, which include the following changes:

- Leduc County staff will no longer open or close gates to gain access to residents' driveways.
 - Gates must be left open if you would like to access private driveway snow clearing services.
- Summer grading will no longer be offered.

New private driveway snowplow agreement

With these updates in place, residents will need to sign a new private driveway snowplow agreement. Once you have submitted a new agreement, you may request snowplow services. Agreements are available online at **www.leduc-county.com/winter-operations**.

How to request snowplow services

After you have filled out a private driveway snowplow agreement, you can request snowplow services by email, phone or through an online application form, as follows:

- Email your request to **snow@leduc-county.com**
- Call 780-955-7226 and follow the prompts
 - Note: if you call to request snowplow services, your call will not be returned.
- Fill out an online snowplow services request form at www.leduc-county.com/winter-operations

Remember to include your first and last name, municipal address and phone number in all of your requests.

Please note: after you submit a request for snowplow services, you will be placed on a list for driveway clearing.

When are driveways cleared?

As per policy PG-03: Snow Clearing County Roads, snowplowing for private driveways will take place after Leduc County roads are deemed to be in an acceptable condition.


WPL has games and puzzles patrons can use here at the library, or are welcome to take home.

Thorsby/Breton RCMP Respond To Double Fatality

Brazeau County, Alta. – On Nov. 5 at 4:04 p.m., Thorsby/Breton RCMP attended a serious motor vehicle collision which resulted in the deaths of two males. The collision occurred on Highway 39 at the intersection of Range Road 52.

Information obtained on scene indicates that

a pick up with a flat deck trailer was traveling southbound on Range Road 52 and collided with a semi truck pulling an empty tanker trailer which was traveling westbound on Highway 39.

The 57-year-old driver of the pick up truck, from Wetaskiwin County, and 52-year-old passenger from Leduc were both declared dead at the collision scene. The driver of the semi truck did not suffer any injuries.

The RCMP collision analyst attended to conduct a scene examination. Traffic was diverted until shortly after midnight when the highways were cleared for travel.

The collision remains under investigation by the RCMP. No further updates for the media are anticipated.

The Importance of Alberta's Energy Sector

As Albertans, we truly understand how important the energy sector is to the economic success of our province and here in the riding of Drayton Valley-Devon, our local economy literally depends on oil and gas investments and business. Our hard work as a province also plays a significant role in the overall GDP of Canada. Energy is the largest sub sector of our country's economy, accounting for \$221 billion, or 10.6% of nominal GDP in 2018. Our local industries are crucial to Canada, which makes the continuous political backhanding from Ottawa all the more frustrating.

These last few years have been difficult and our local economy has been hard hit for a variety of reasons, however time and time again we have seen a complete lack of response from our leaders in the federal government. Far from sympathy, we've in fact been handed down countless legislation that not only imposes, but inhibits Canada's resource industry. Bill C-69, a total ban on tanker ship access along B.C.'s coast, directly prevents Alberta from ever successfully exporting oil west through the Pacific Ocean. Our oil and gas works have seen layoffs by the thousands but when an Ontario manufacturer went under, federal bailouts were immediately onhand. While Alberta businesses create thousands of jobs and contribute billions to Ontario's GDP and markets, continued gestures like this from our Liberal counterparts have ensured that our local businesses will see fewer investment opportunities and less work for local citizens.

The good news is, despite these impediments, Albertans, and our oil and gas sector continue to make huge strides in technology and scientific advancement. Since 2000, Oil Sands emissions have decreased by 28%. We are also at the absolute forefront of methane emissions reduction. An Alberta startup recently started earning international attention by helping limit methane production through a small air compressor that runs off a hybrid natural gas/solar generator. Methane, a gas 25 times more powerful than carbon dioxide, is part of the natural gas extraction process and accounted for 13% of Canada's total GHG emissions with 43% of that coming from oil and gas sectors. There is no question that Canadian resource extraction maintains the most ethically produced and environmentally sourced practices in the world. Recently approved projects like LNG are already having a positive impact on local economies and oil sands producers have spent \$13 billion in collaboration with Indigenous-owned businesses since 2012, including a record \$2.1 billion in 2018. These types of large scale investments distribute money across various industries and communities and are helping families across Alberta get back on their feet.

While 2020 has been difficult, and Alberta hasn't always received the support it deserves, our province continues to develop, grow and succeed, in no small part to the incredible individuals who call our province home.


